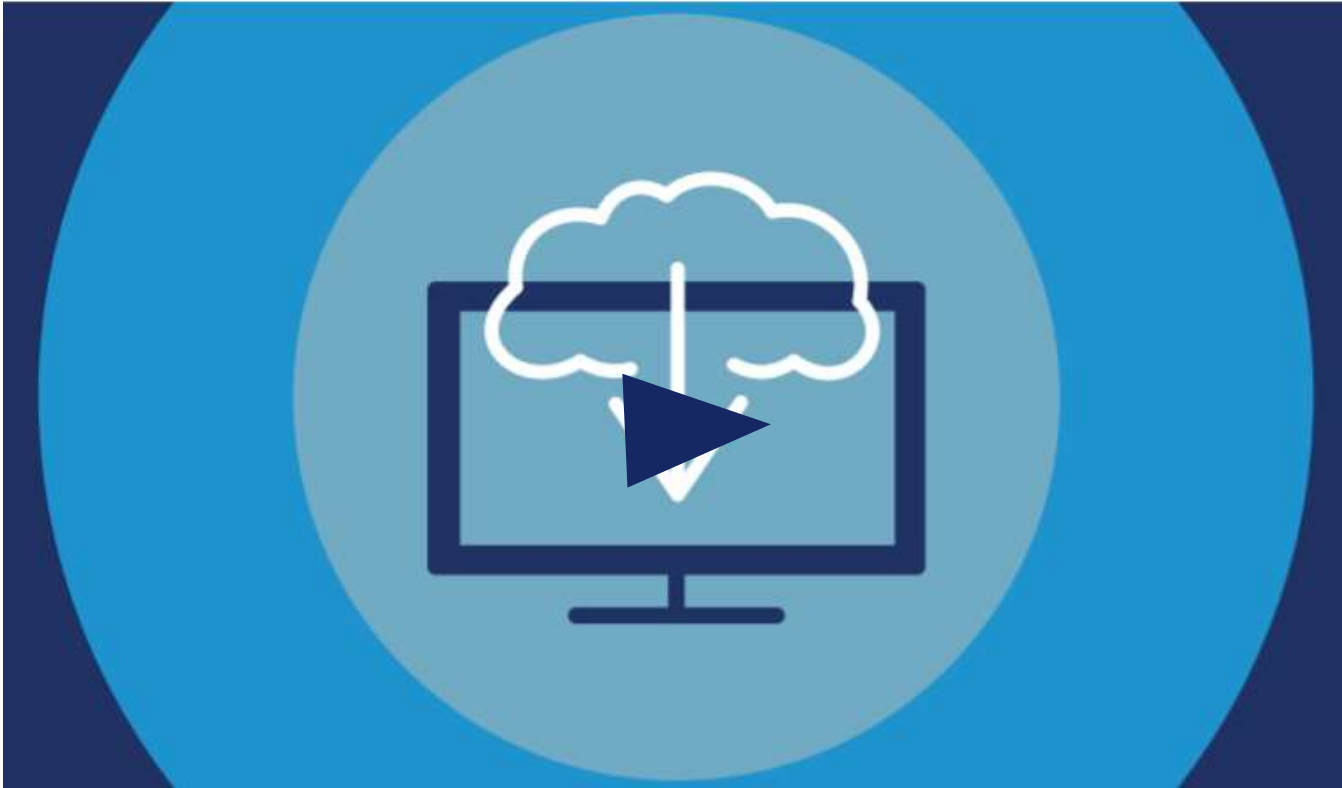

## Dar es Salaam - First Bus Rapid Transit System in Eastern Africa

Sectors and Themes: Transport, Urban

## Prioritising mitigation and adaptation options as part of the development of a National Climate Change Action Plan

### Case Summary:


Throughout 2011-12 the government of Kenya undertook a prioritisation process to identify actions to deliver its National Climate Change Response Strategy published in 2010. The process resulted in the Kenyan National Climate Change Action Plan (NCCAP) and included specific mitigation and adaptation challenges to be incorporated into the climate related policies, plans and strategies of national institutions in Kenya.

The prioritisation process within the NCCAP was aligned to national development strategies combining a long-term vision with medium-term policy goals and mechanisms. It demonstrates an effective process for incorporating assessments of climate vulnerability and mitigation potential into national development objectives in an inclusive multi-stakeholder decision-making process.

Crucial to the success of the process was the strong commitment and leadership from the Ministry of Environment and Mineral Resources (MEMR), comprehensive stakeholder participation, the involvement of key ministries, together with a local validation process and a transparent approach to analysis.

## Strategies Mainstreaming of Ecosystem-Based Adaptation (EBA) In Vietnam

### Case Summary:

The project "Strategic mainstreaming of ecosystem-based adaptation (EbA) in Vietnam" provides the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment with technical support to systematically integrate innovative ecosystem-based solutions into national and local adaptation planning. To that end it offers capacity training to stakeholders at both the national and provincial level. Moreover, it provides technical support to facilitate the implementation of EbA measures on the ground.

Ecosystem-based adaptation (EbA) is a concept that uses functioning ecosystems to mitigate and adapt to the negative impacts of climate change. The EbA approach has the potential to deliver a vast array of benefits to countries like Vietnam. Vietnam is not only extremely vulnerable to the adverse effects of climate change but also a hotspot for biodiversity. Strengthening the capacity of stakeholders at the national and provincial level to mainstream EbA into national climate adaptation frameworks and other development plans is a key prerequisite for the successful implementation of such an approach.

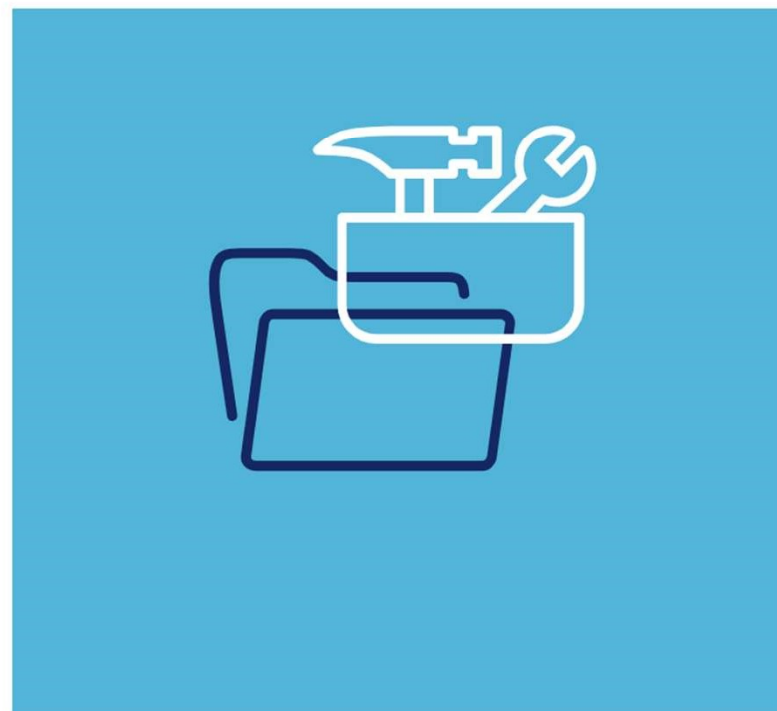

## Green Climate Fund (GCF)

The Green Climate Fund (GCF) was set up in 2010 and aims to promote the paradigm shift towards low-emission and climate-resilient development pathways by providing support to developing countries to limit or reduce their greenhouse gas emissions and to adapt to the impacts of climate change, taking into account the needs of those developing countries particularly vulnerable to the adverse effects of climate change. The Green Climate Fund (GCF) is an operating entity of the Financial Mechanism of the UNFCCC and the Paris Agreement.

Within the GCF, funding is also available for project preparation activities and climate finance "readiness" (please see a separate entry on GCF readiness support). For project preparation support, the Project Preparation Facility (PPF) supports Accredited Entities (AEs) in project and programme preparation. It is especially targeted to support direct access entities, and micro-to-small size category projects.

A total of USD 40 million has been made available for the initial phase of the PPF, with each request subject to a cap of USD 1.5 million. Support will be commensurate to the funding proposal being developed, and to the activities in the PPF application. If approved, support is granted in the form of grants and repayable grants, while equity may be considered for private sector projects. Funding proposals developed with the PPF should be submitted to the GCF Board within two years of the approval of a PPF request.

## Steps to access

To receive money directly from the Green Climate Fund (GCF), entities need to be accredited as an "Accredited Entity." See sections "Other eligibility criteria" and "Type of recipient" for more details. Note that entities that prefer to not apply for accreditation have the option of partnering with an institution that is already accredited.

One distinct feature of the GCF is the accreditation of national entities or entities operating regionally in developing countries as Direct Access entities. National and Regional Accredited Entities fall under the Green Climate Fund's Direct Access modality, which enables entities to directly access financing and manage all aspects of climate change mitigation and adaptation projects, from design through implementation, to monitoring and evaluation. *Direct Access* allows developing countries to strengthen capacity to adapt to climate change and build on local expertise.

## STEPS

### 1 Decide Method of Access


#### ○ Decide whether to become an accredited entity or partner with an accredited entity

Actions: If applying for accreditation, entity seeking accreditation compares institutional capacity against GCF accreditation requirement to assess whether it is well positioned to apply for accreditation. While conducting the assessment, entities must keep in mind the type of projects they seek to implement with GCF funding (e.g. size, associated environmental and social risks, etc.). Accreditation will be earmarked to the type of projects the entity will be implementing. The alternative to obtaining accreditation is to partner with an Accredited Entity of its choice.

Accreditation requirements include: fiduciary standards, environmental and social safeguards, and gender policy.

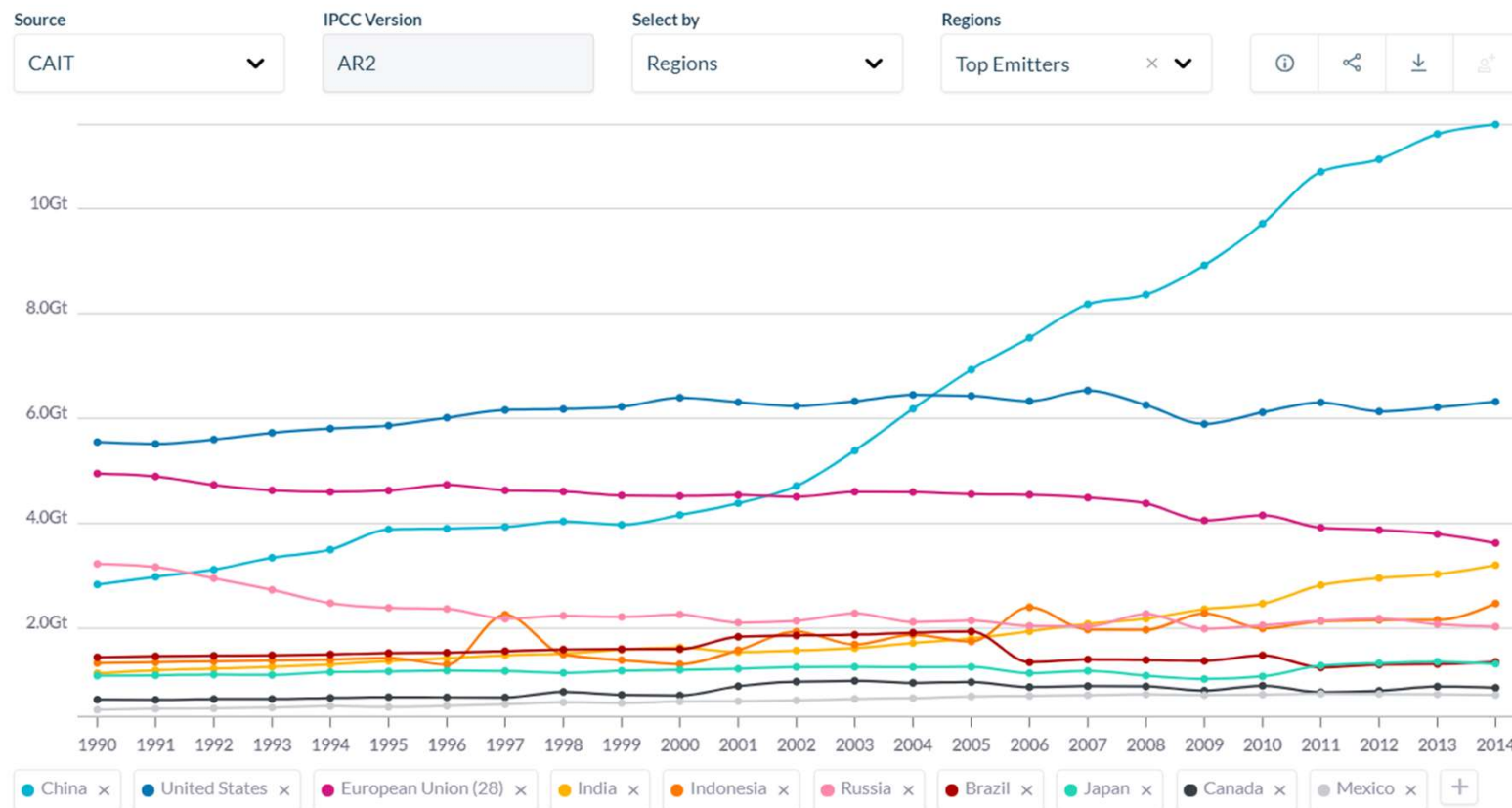

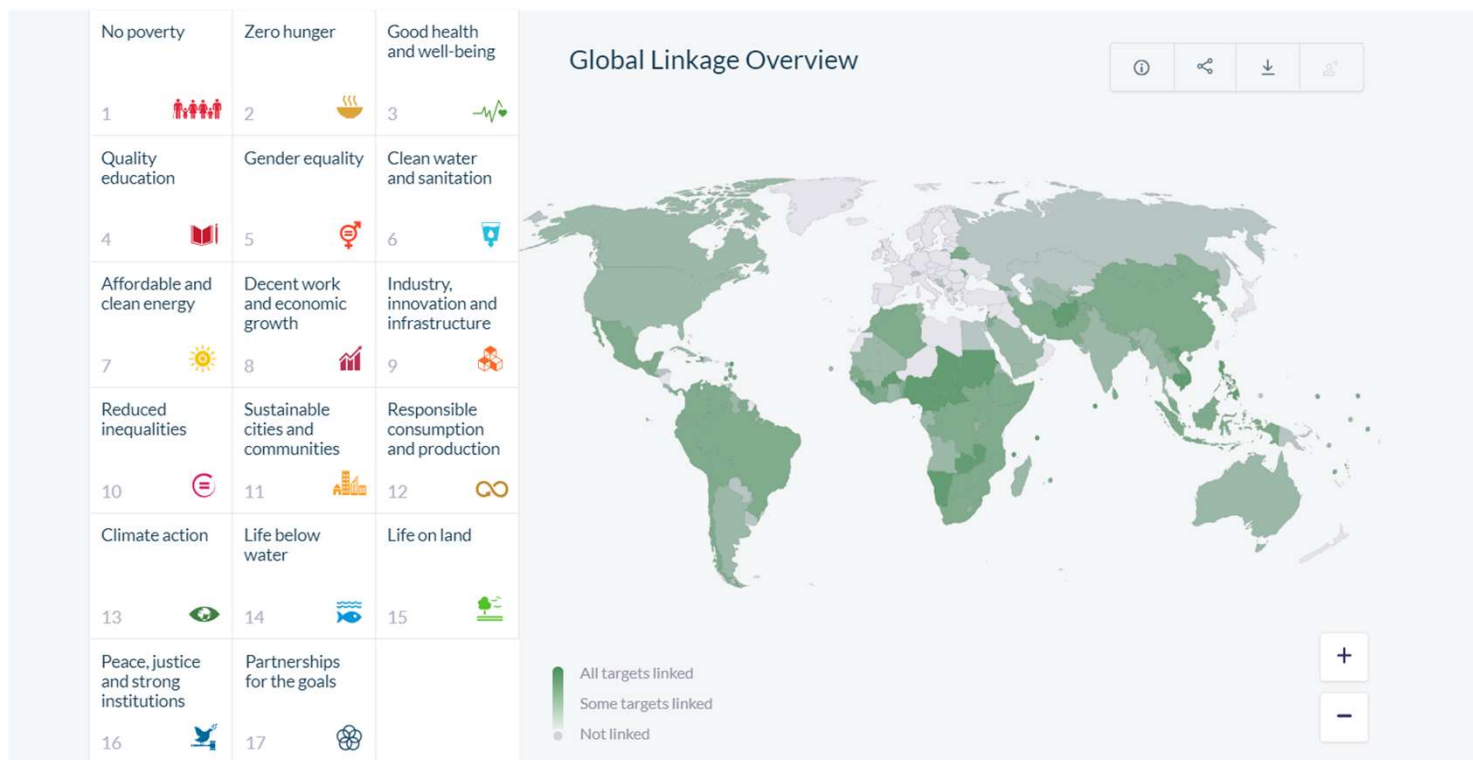

### 1. Introduction

Kenya, like other countries in the region, is bearing the brunt of climate change impacts and the associated socio-economic losses. The situation is exacerbated by the high dependence on climate sensitive natural resources. In response to the challenges posed by Climate Change, Kenya has developed a National Climate Change Response Strategy (NCCRS 2010).
