Government endorsement of project proposals helped ensure gender responsiveness.

Engagement with civil society

Strong collaboration with civil society organizations to collect gender and climate data, use of enhanced coordination platforms to facilitate communication across a large territory.

Engagement with partners with an United Nations Development Programme and CARE International strengthened support.

Strong collaboration with intermediary organizations to collect gender and climate data, use of WhatsApp coordination platforms to facilitate communication across a large territory.

Used participatory processes involving civil society, academia, and development partners.

Mobilized resources through partnerships, including NDC Partnership and Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ). Established a sector working group on Gender, Climate Change and Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR). Engaged civil society organizations in consultations and submissions.

Collaboration with national statistical offices

Collected data on gender-based violence (GBV) linked to climate impacts.

• Strong collaboration with civil society organizations to collect gender and climate data.

National data institutions incorporated gender-responsive data collection.

Kenya
• Developed a National Gender and Climate Change Action Plan.

• Collaboration through technical committees to discuss climate change and gender mainstreaming.
• Developed a strategy for women's participation in climate action.
• Established a National Gender Action Plan (GNAP) through multi-stakeholder collaboration.

Uganda
• Developed and launched a Gender and Equity Strategy.
• Established gender and climate committees within relevant ministries.
• Strengthened coordination between gender and environment institutions.

Central African Republic
• Combined roles as gender and adaptation focal point to ensure integration of local community voices.
• Engaged initiatives such as LCCIPP to strengthen climate adaptation efforts.

Namibia
• Integrated gender considerations across the three Rio Conventions.
• Serves as focal point for the three conventions, enabling stronger coordination.
• Uses reporting processes and presentations to advance the gender agenda.

Zimbabwe
• Developed a National Gender Action Plan through collaboration between environment, women affairs ministries, and gender institutions.
• Established a gender and climate taskforce to strengthen gender integration in climate processes.

Create regular spaces for peer learning and adoption of successful approaches across countries.

Encourage consistent participation of NGCCFPs in international meetings and ensure countries nominate designated focal points.

Develop joint proposals and explore opportunities for collective funding and technical support.

Encourage participation in surveys and knowledge sharing initiatives.

Strengthen cooperation among African countries to develop common positions and share experiences.

Strengthen collaboration between governments, civil society, and development partners.

Revitalize regional coordination platforms, including Eastern, Southern, and Western Africa networks.

Possible way forward

Promote experience-sharing mechanisms and documentation of best practices.

Strengthen regional coordination through platforms such as the Africa Group WhatsApp network for NGCCFPs. Improve collaboration among countries despite differences in capacity and resources.

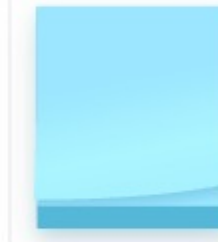
