Established in 2016

eLWPG (7/CP.29):

Encourages Parties to appoint and provide support for a national gender and climate change focal point for climate negotiations, implementation and monitoring.

Today: 159 appointed NGCCFPs, representing

125 countries

- **Online NGCCFP meeting: reflection and preparation for the in-session NGCCFPS workshop at SB 64 held on 30 April**



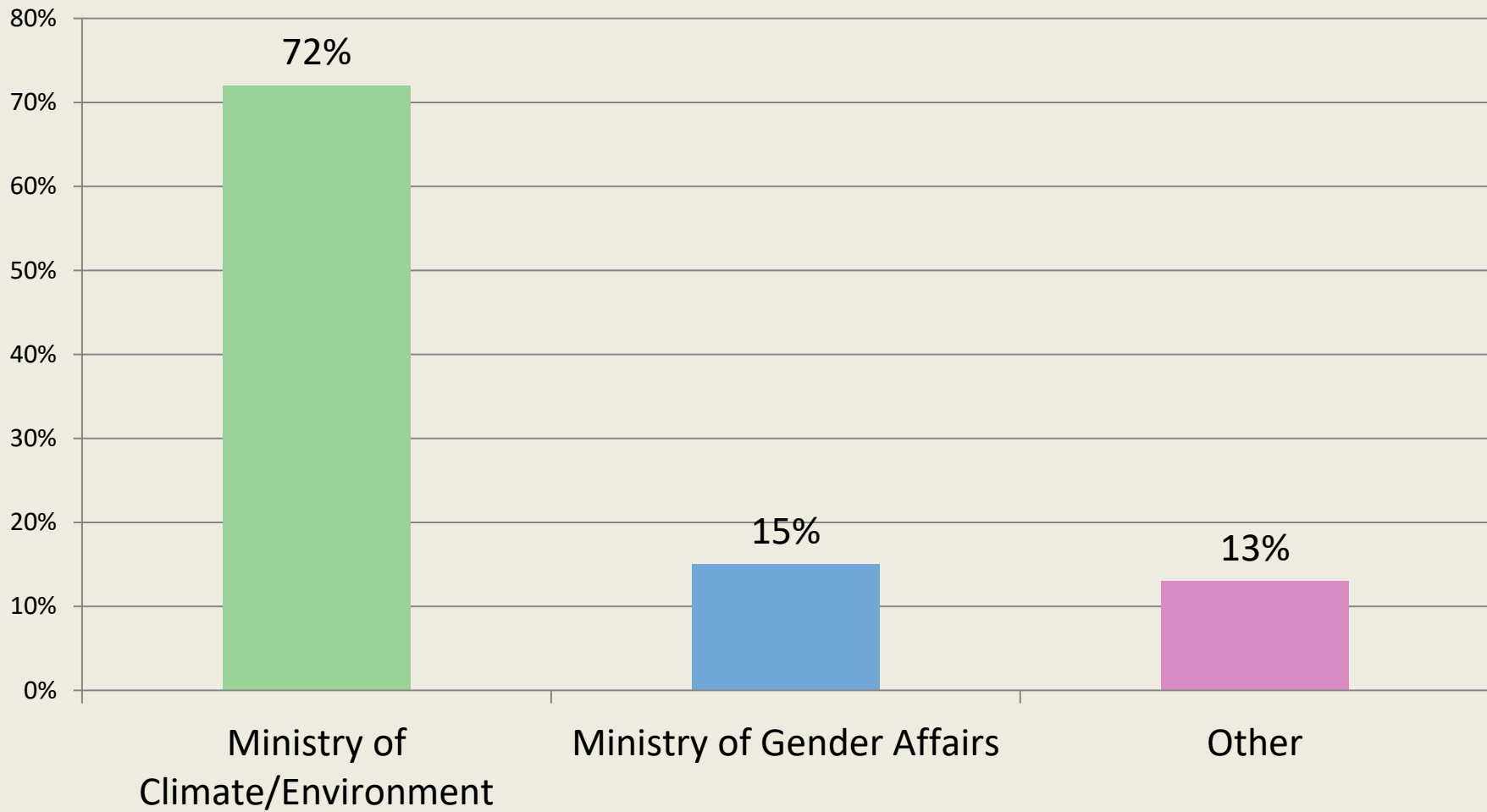

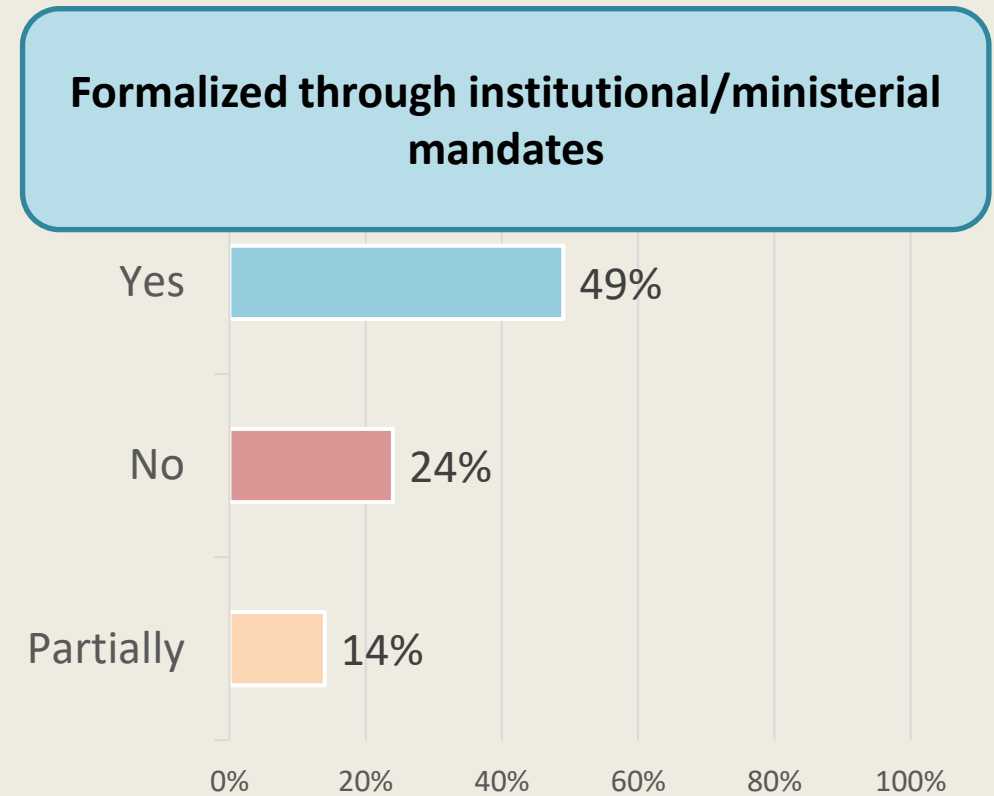
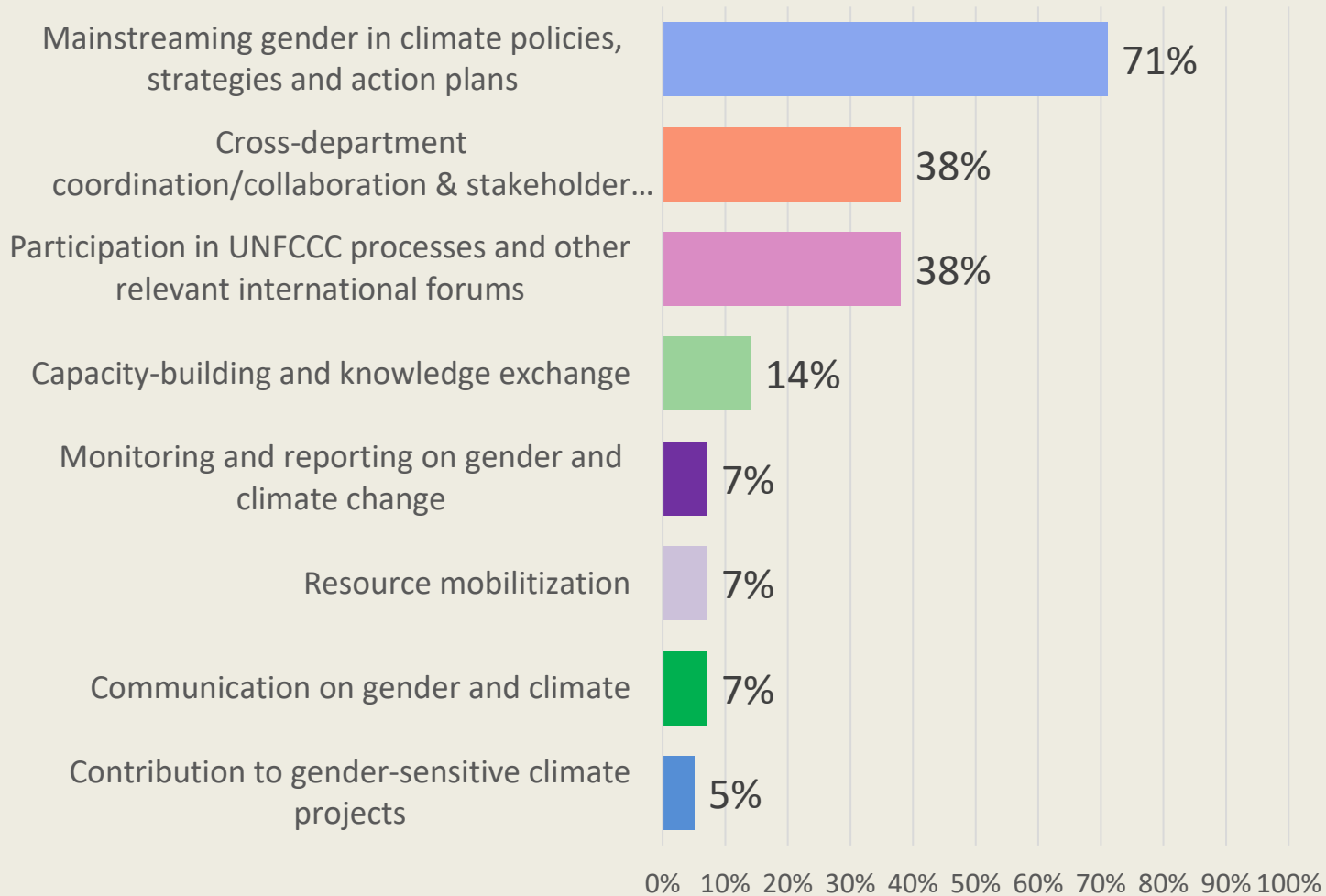

Tasks / responsibilities that NGCCFPs could perform

Based on 37 responses
(5 skipped)

Tasks other NGCCFP already perform:

- Resources mobilization
- Monitoring and reporting
- Capacity-building
- Coordination and engagement functions

Points of convergence between NGCCFP on tasks they do not perform currently:

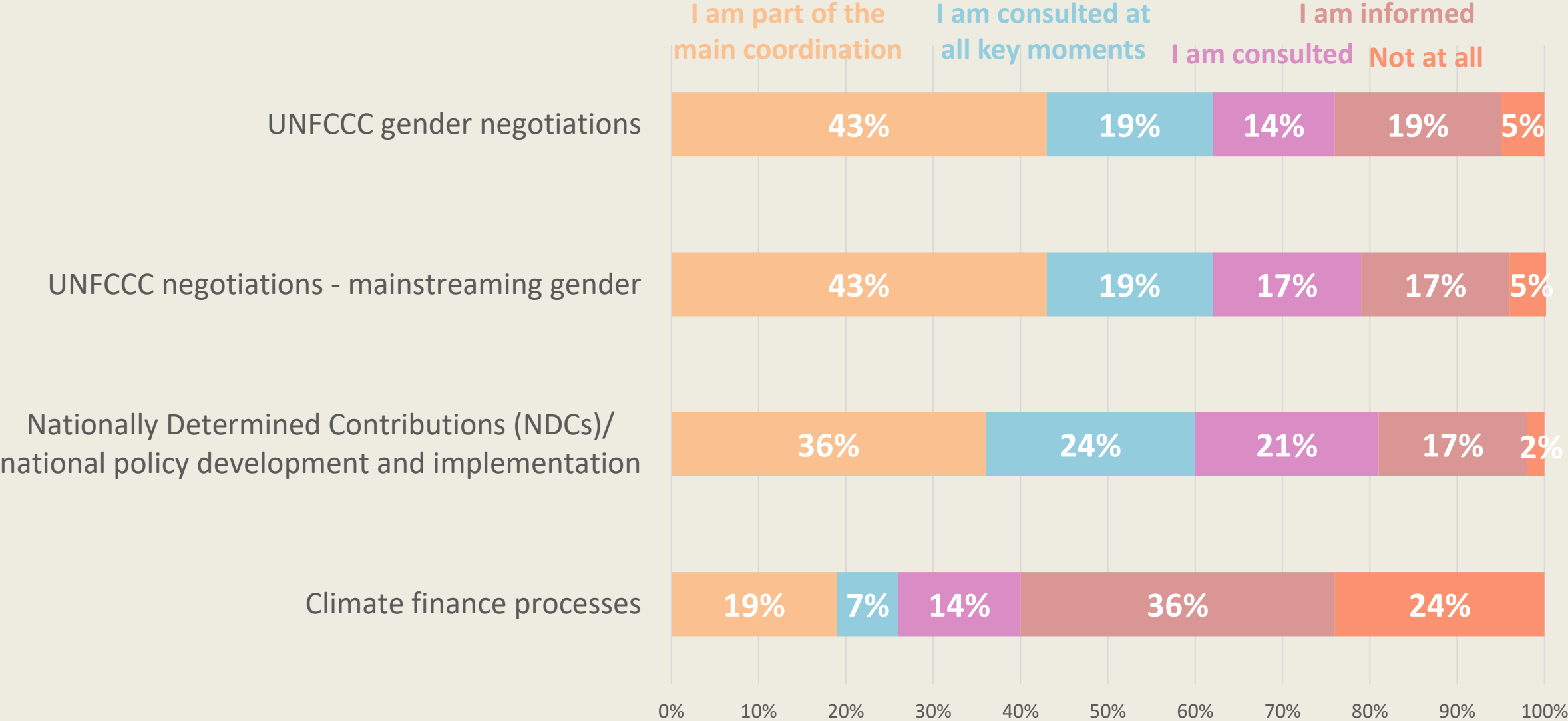
- Regular production of data
- Involvement in discussions at an early stage
- Strengthening engagement with local communities, Indigenous Peoples and women's groups

Tasks NGCCFPs should perform, but are currently not:

- Supporting **capacity-building** at the national and subnational level (50%)
- Being responsible for **stronger institutional coordination mechanisms** (40%)
- Regular **production of disaggregated data** (25%)
- Involvement in **discussions at an early stage** in the preparation of climate plans (20%)
- **Mobilization of gender-responsive funding** (15%)
- Establishment of **monitoring systems** with gender indicators (15%)
- Strengthening **engagement with local communities, Indigenous Peoples and women's groups** (15%)

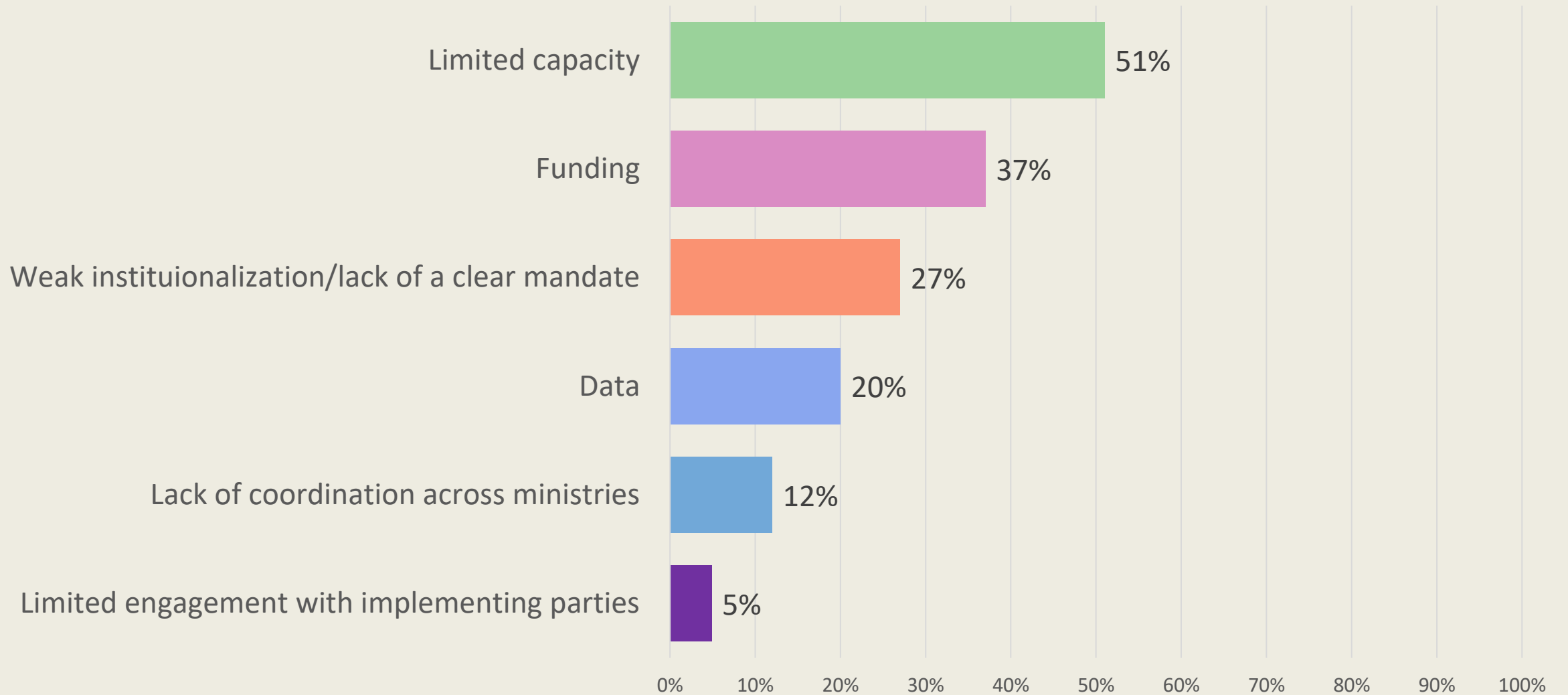

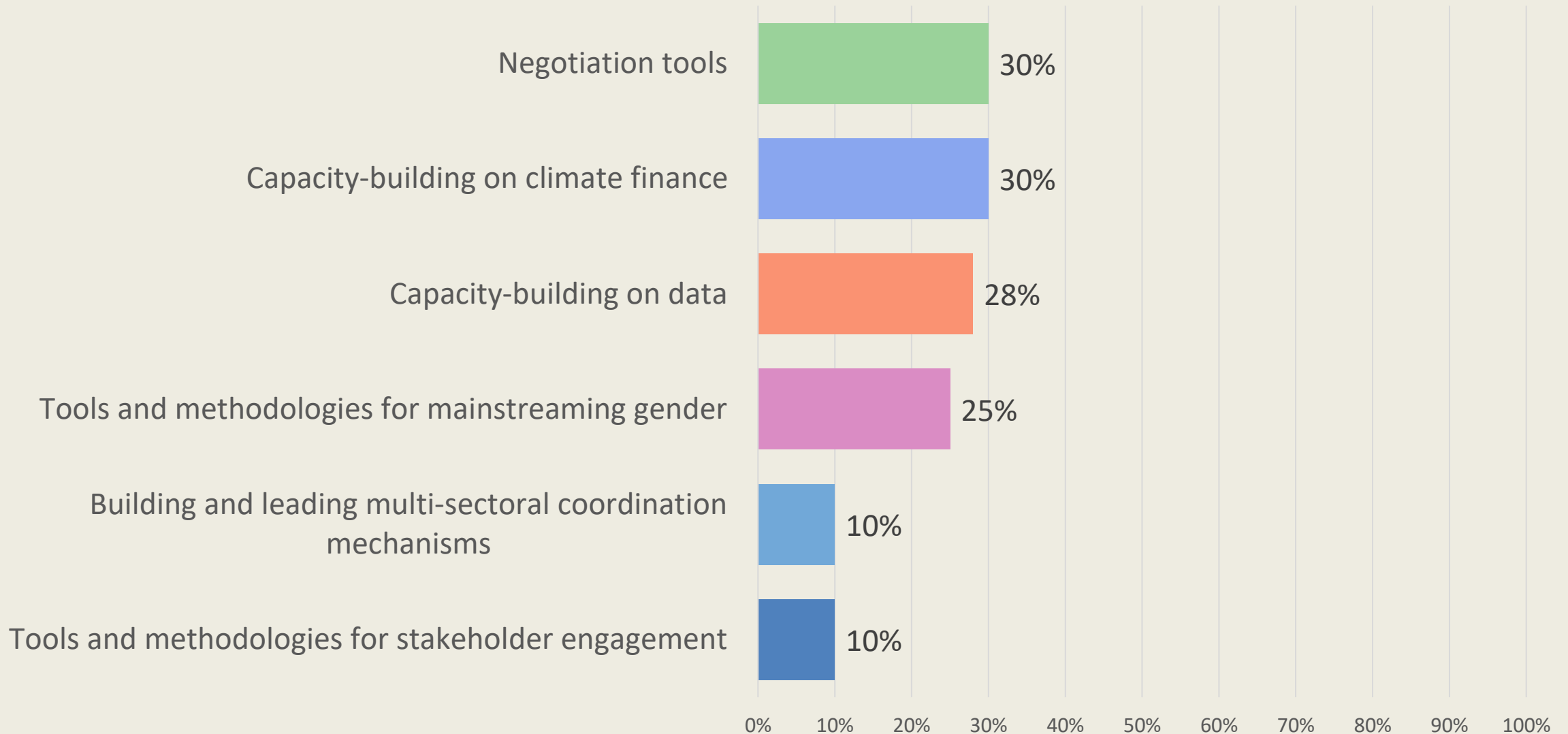

Biggest capacity gaps



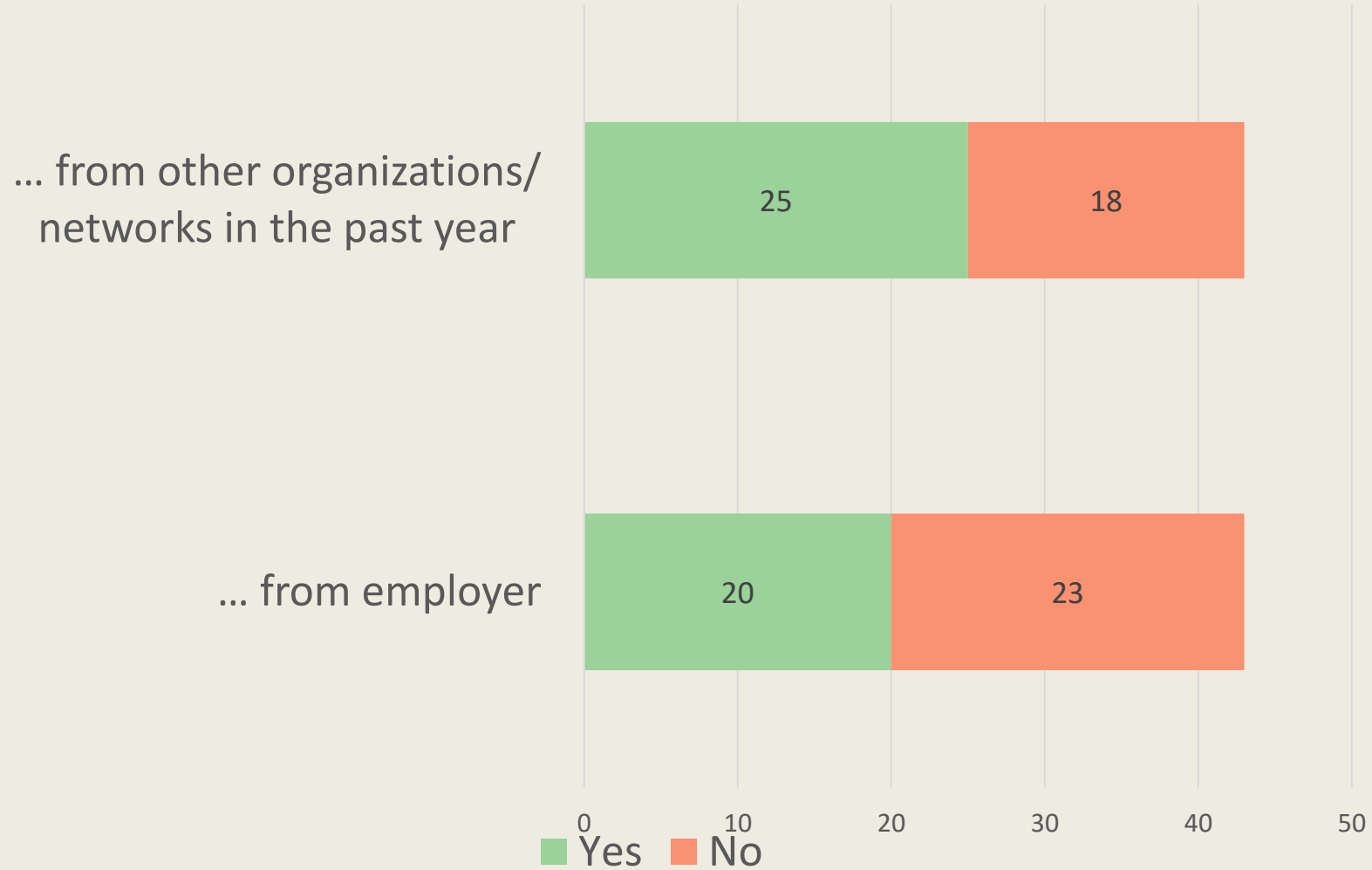

Interest in capacity-building and training



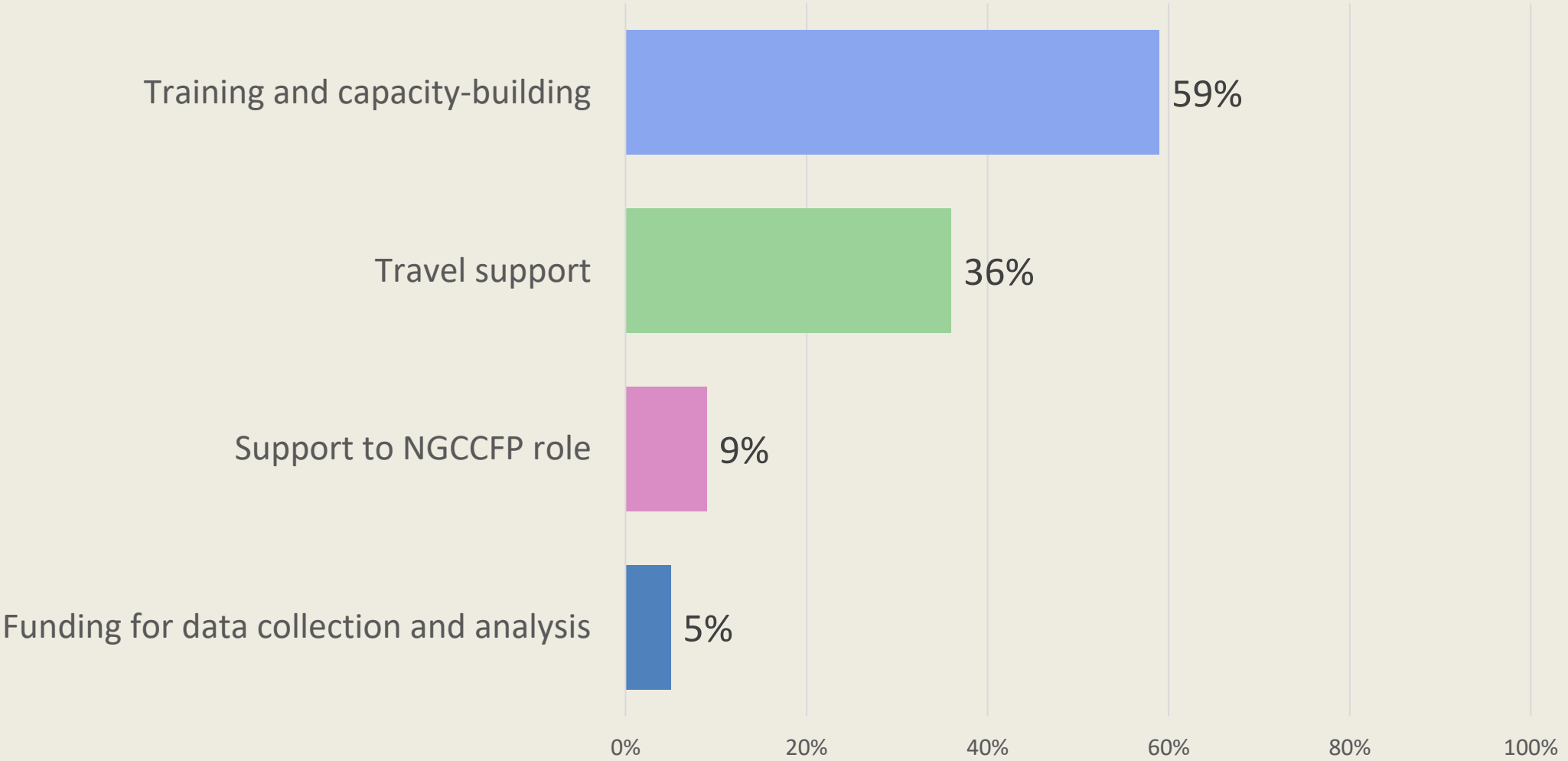

Support received through employer

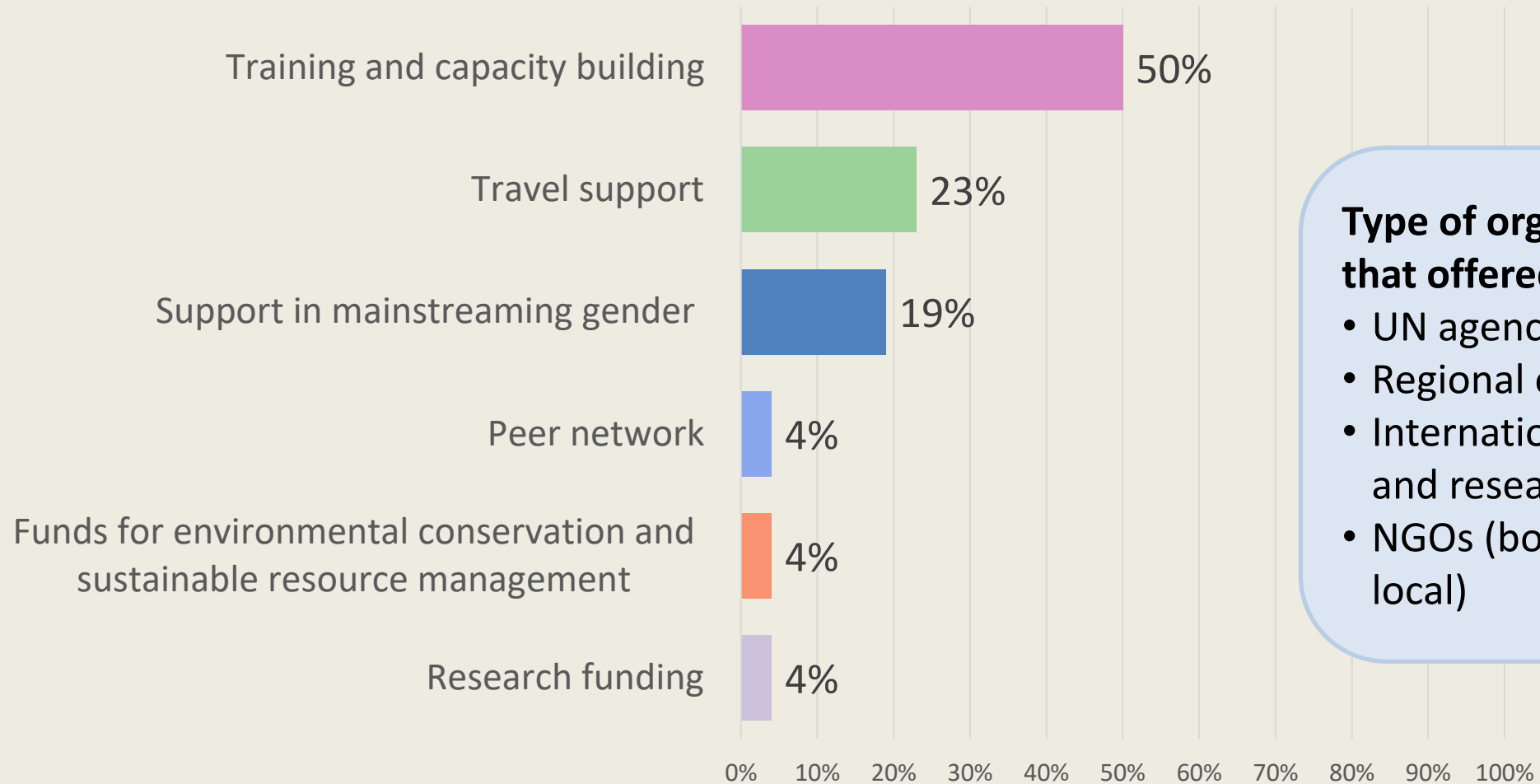

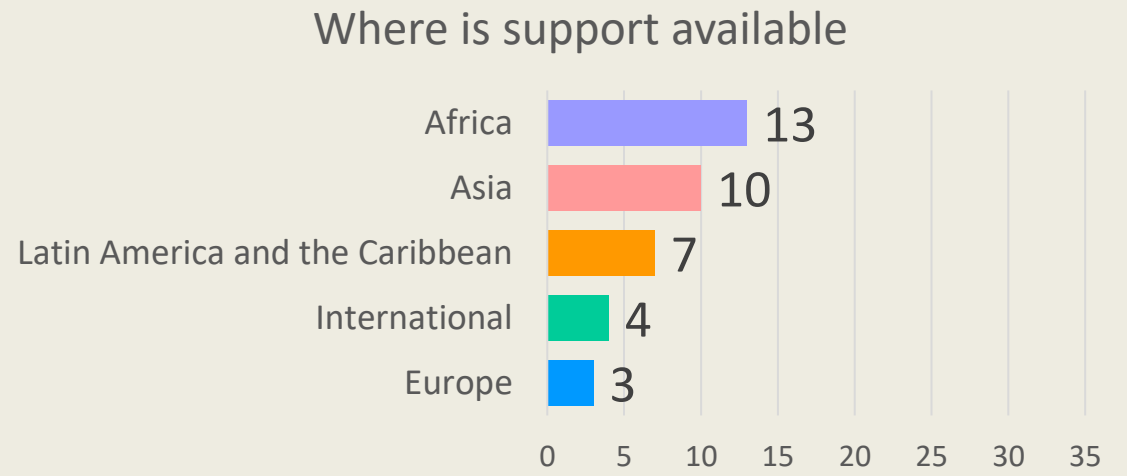

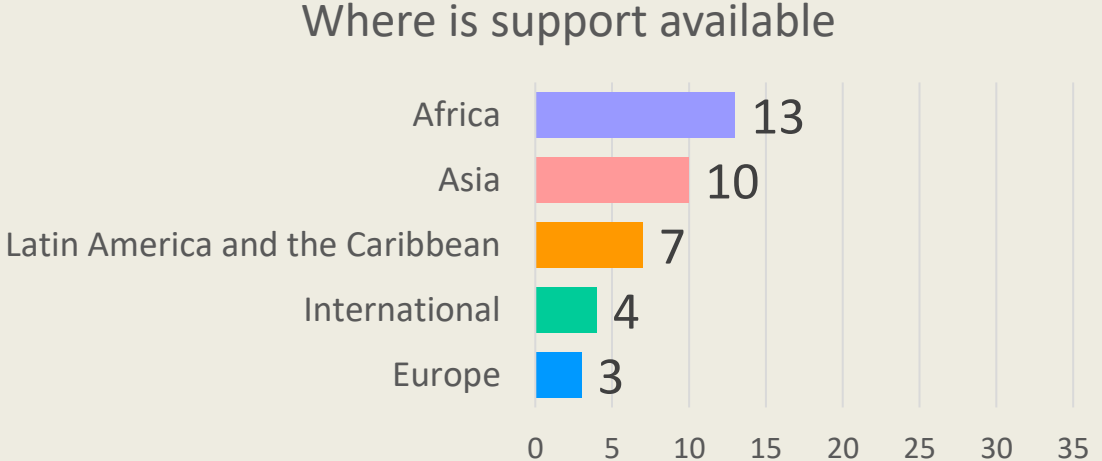
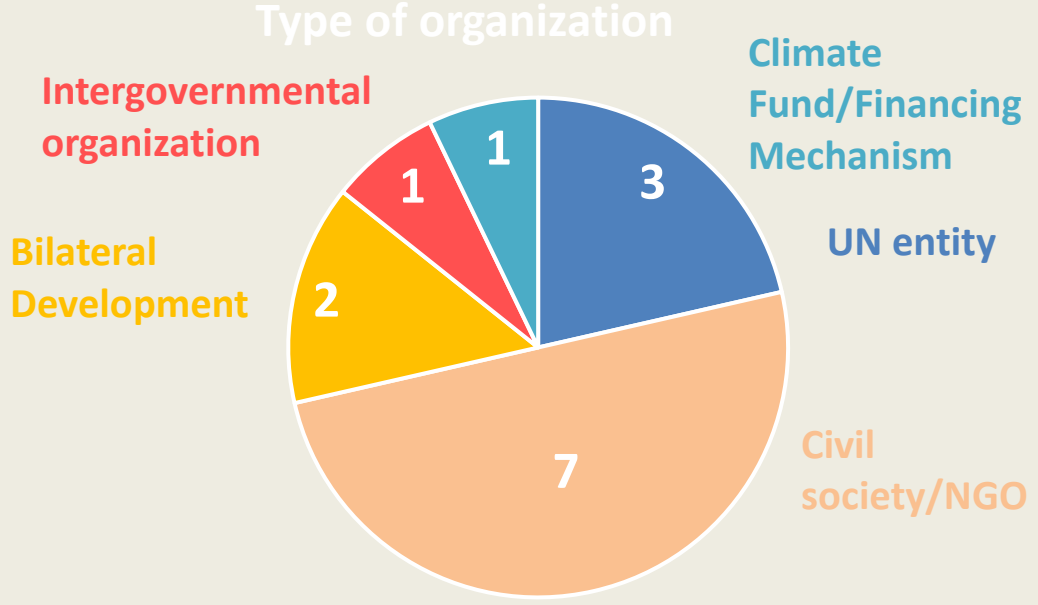
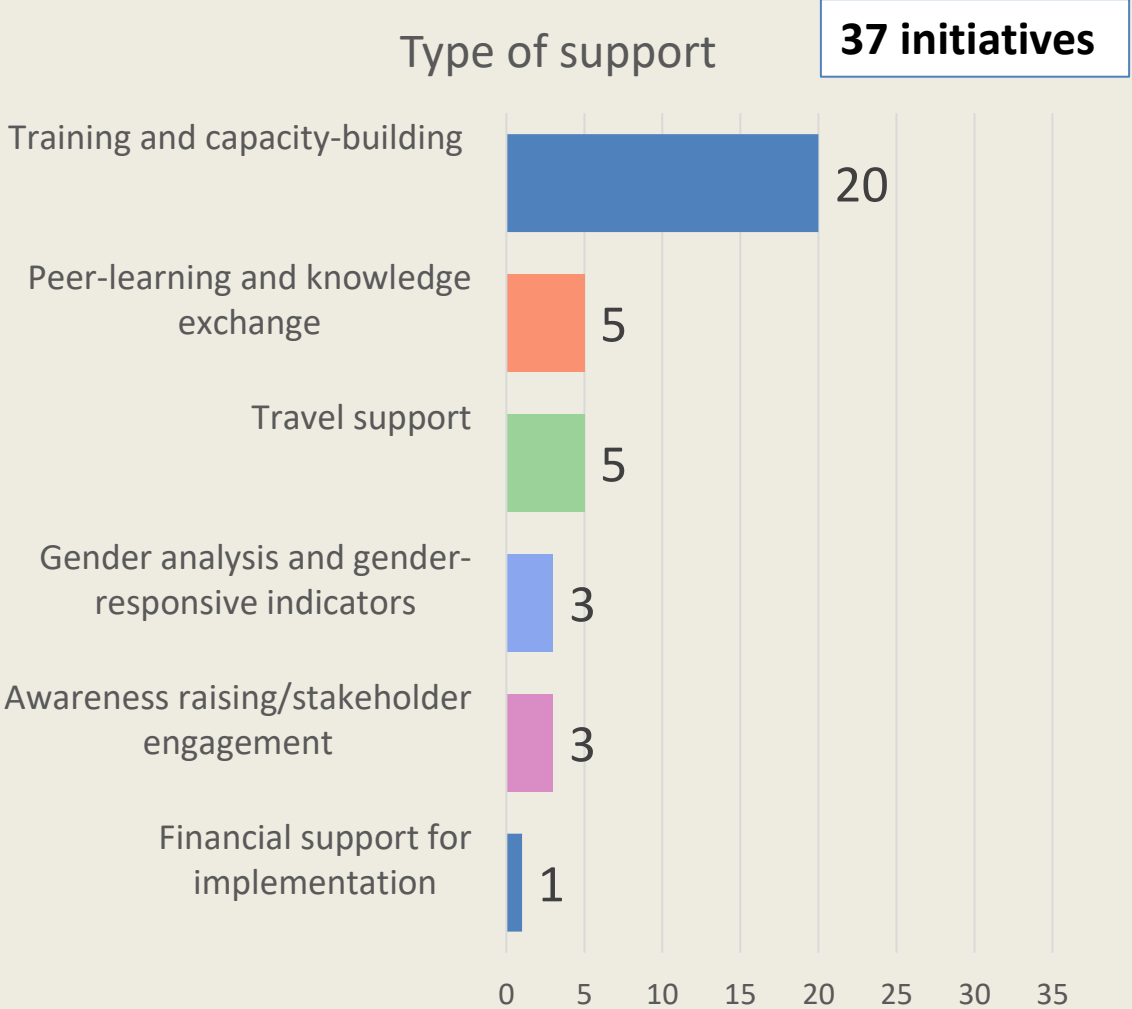

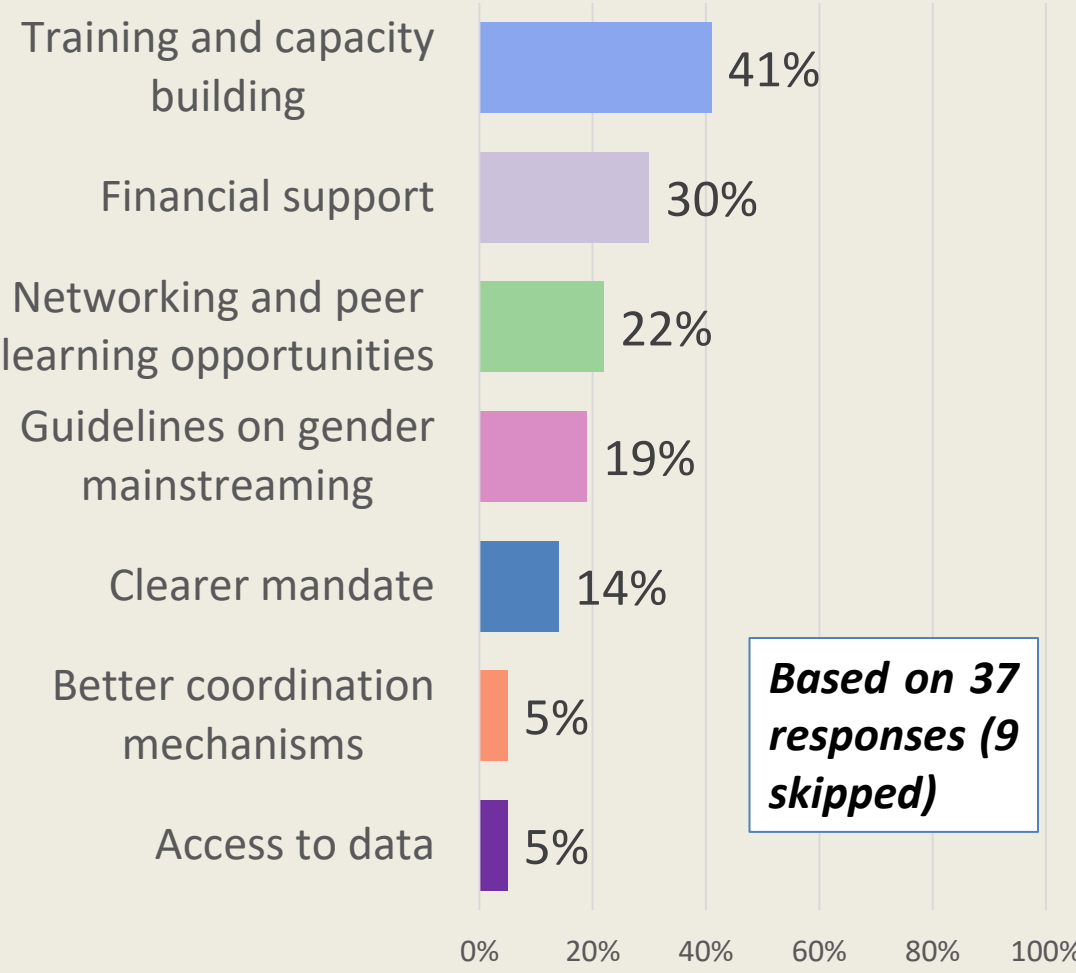
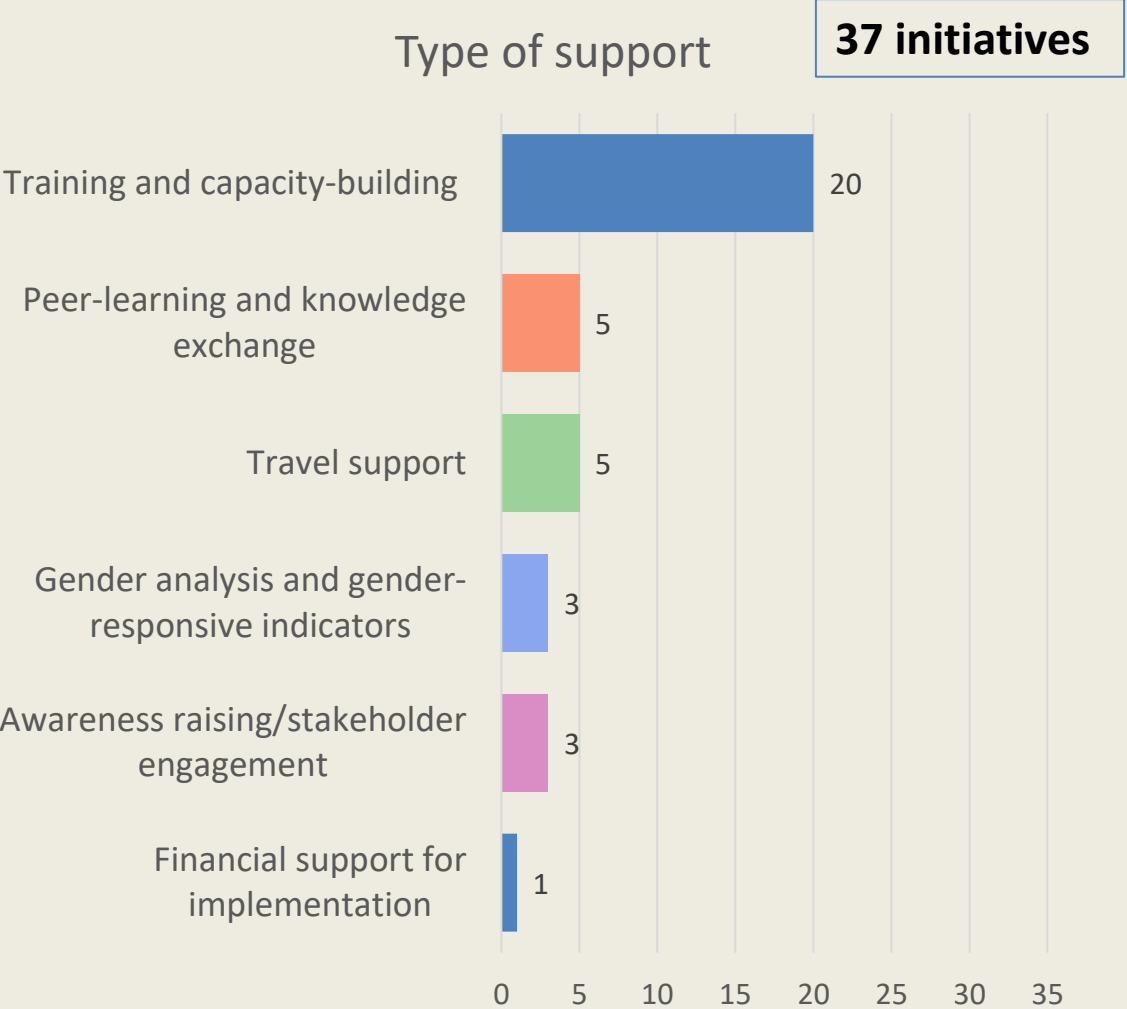
Planned support for NGCCFPs II

Comparison support and support needs

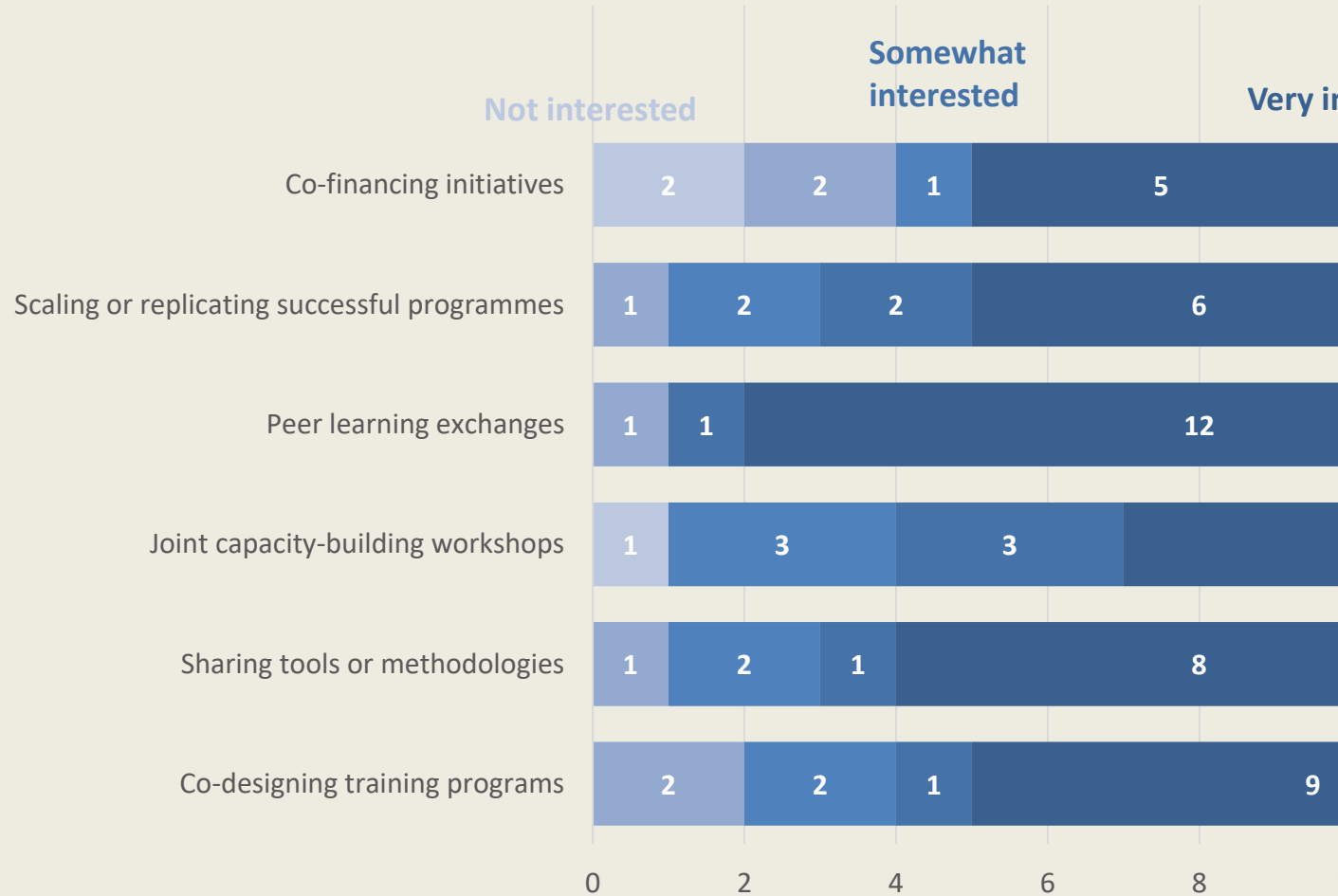

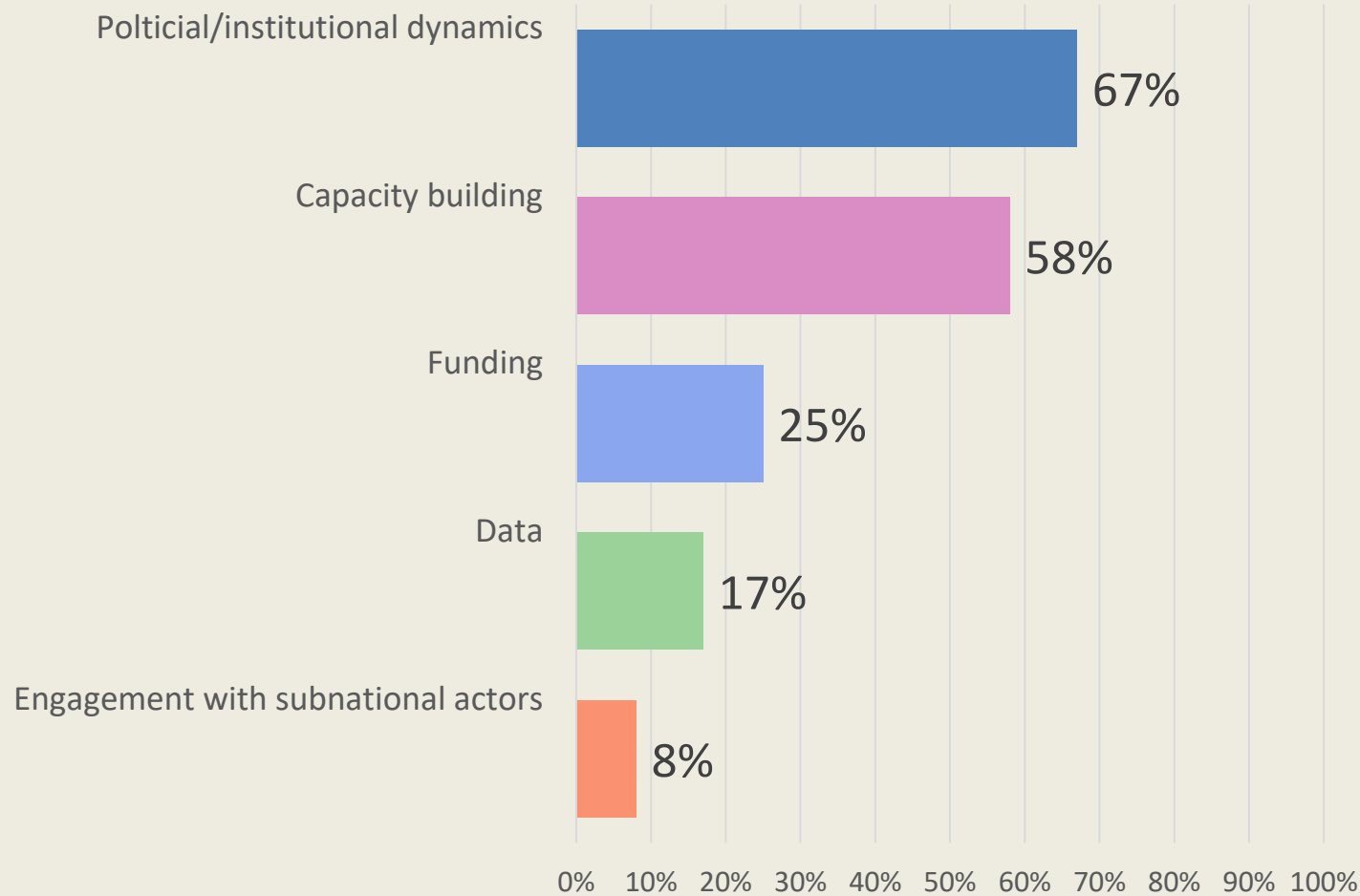


Other type of collaboration partners would be interested in:
