---

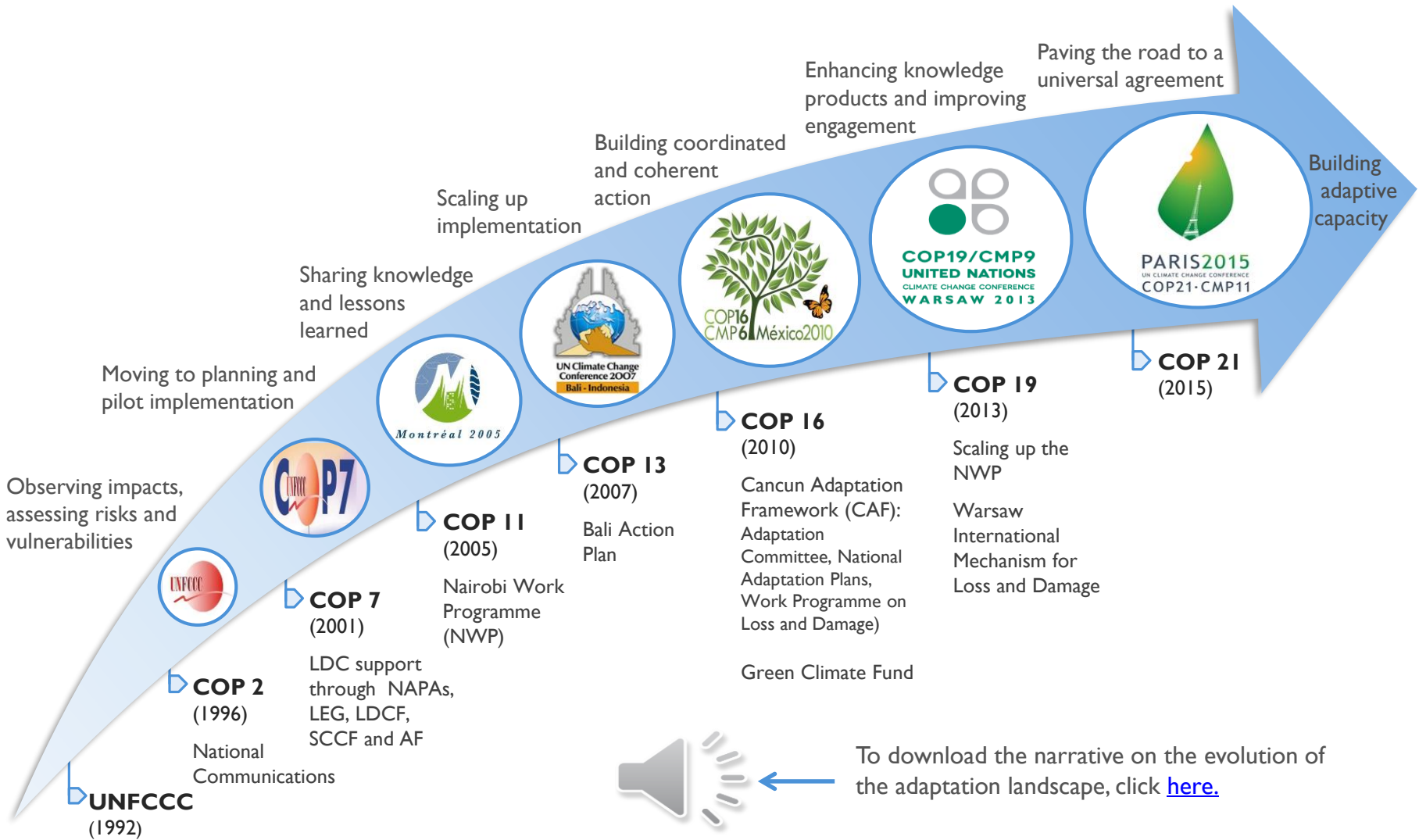
To **assist all Parties**, in particular developing countries, including the least developed countries and small island developing States:

- to **improve their understanding and assessment** of impacts, vulnerability and adaptation
- to **make informed decisions** on practical adaptation actions and measures to respond to climate change on a sound, scientific, technical and socio-economic basis for current and future climate change and variability

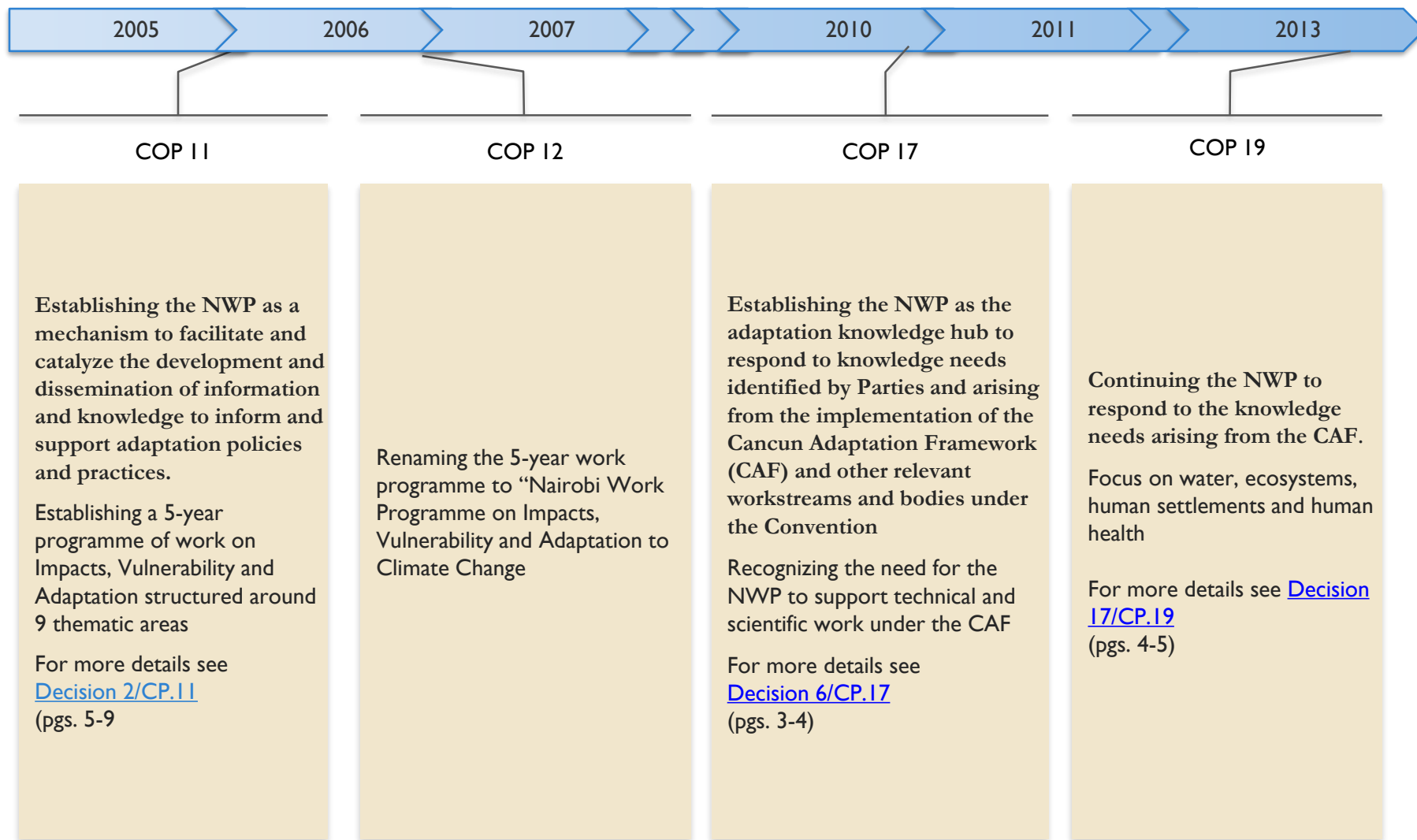

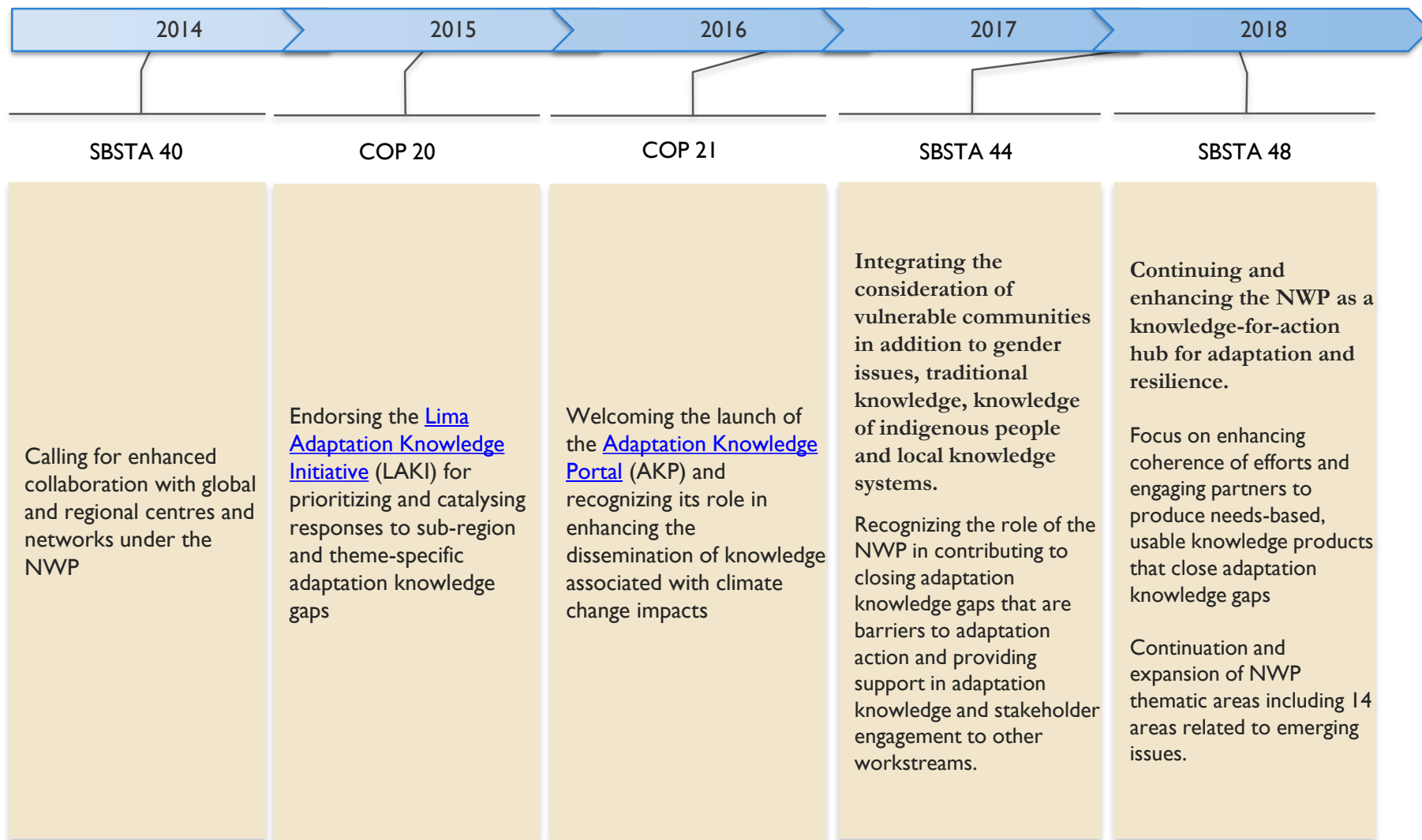

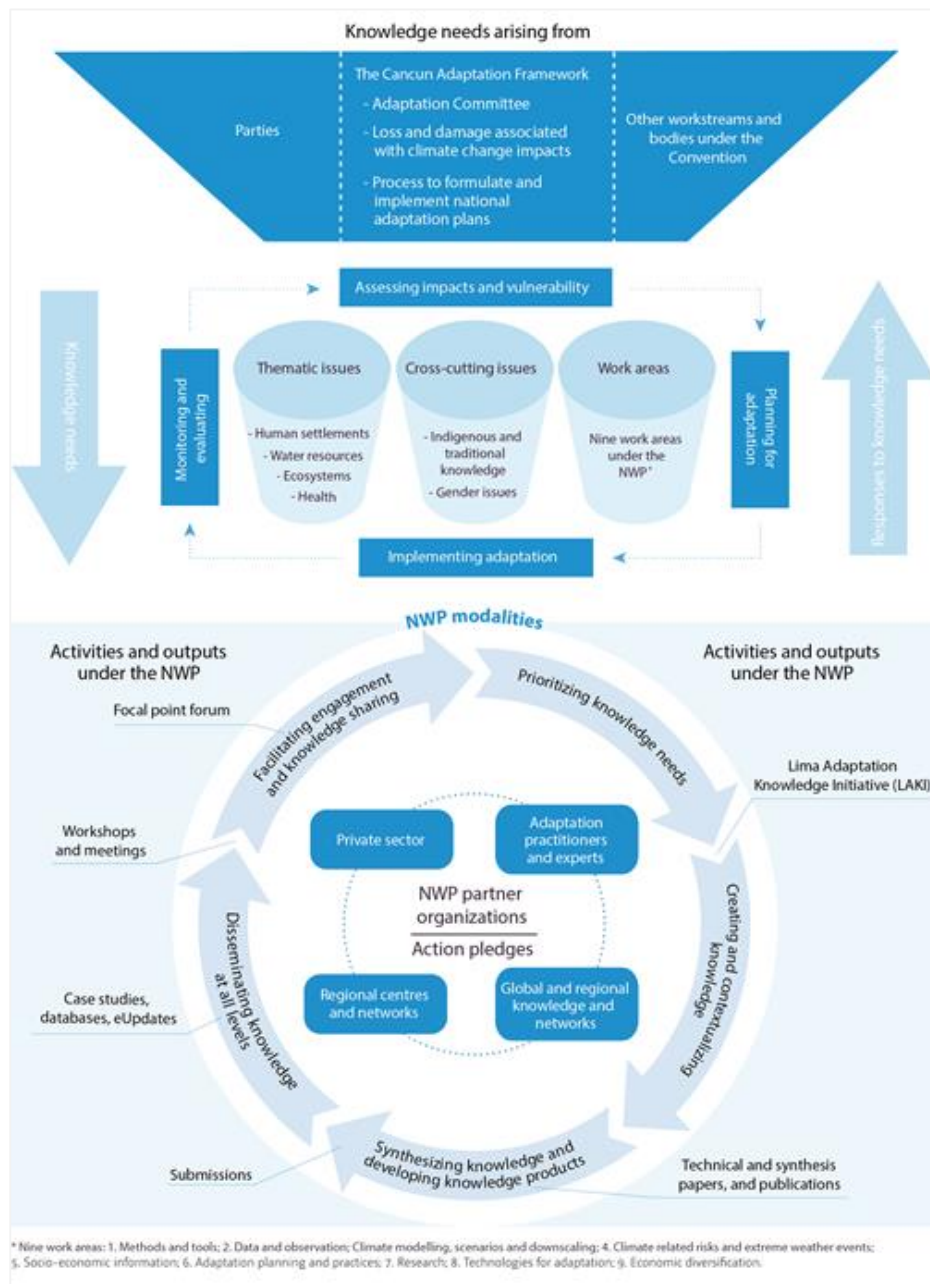

# NWP mandates and modalities for knowledge support on adaptation



- The NWP is established as a knowledge hub on adaptation under the Convention to facilitate and catalyze the development and dissemination of information and knowledge to inform and support adaptation policies and practices at the regional, national and subnational levels through a diverse range of modalities.
- Implementation of the work programme is under the guidance of the Chair of the SBSTA and with assistance from the secretariat, and with contributions from Parties and other adaptation stakeholders.
- Operating under the overall guidance of the SBSTA Chair, the NWP contributes to advancing adaptation implementation by providing knowledge support through four key functions:
  - Engaging stakeholders
  - Synthesizing knowledge
  - Disseminating knowledge
  - Fostering collaboration
