Background and outlook

In 2019, the Paris Committee on Capacity-building (PCCB) published its Strategic Plan for Stakeholder Engagement, Communication, and Resource Mobilization to enhance the implementation of its rolling workplan. Emphasizing the importance of sharing information and results of activities among capacity-building actors and stakeholders, the plan recognizes the establishment of a network as a critical vehicle for accomplishing the PCCB's mandate under its priority areas.

In the same year, the PCCB, with the support of UN Climate Change, drafted a concept note if for the PCCB Network, and held a consultation session in the 2nd Capacity-building Hub, attended by relevant stakeholders at COP25. Based on the inputs received, the PCCB agreed to launch a one-year pilot phase for the implementation of the Network, starting with an open call for registration in March 2020, followed by the steps illustrated in the figure above.

The Network is a work-in-progress and will continue to evolve through inclusive processes of consultation and mutual learning. An evaluation of the pilot-phase is set to take place in the first quarter of 2021, and feed into the work of the PCCB and the Network for the way forward.

Membership
