I am pleased to notify non-governmental organizations (NGOs) that the **17<sup>th</sup> Focal Point Forum of the Nairobi work programme (NWP)** will take place during the 29th session of the Conference of the Parties (COP 29) in Baku, the Republic of Azerbaijan, on Wednesday, **13 November 2024, from 10:00 to 13:00 (GST/UTC+4)** at MR 11 in Zone C of the Baku Stadium. This event is open to all COP 29 registered participants.

Organized under the guidance of the Chair of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA), the 17<sup>th</sup> Focal Point Forum<sup>1</sup> will provide space for Parties, NWP partners, scientists, policymakers and practitioners to engage in discussions on how the NWP can play a meaningful and central role in knowledge and engagement in the current political context – both within and beyond the UNFCCC process. The Forum aims to explore ways to ensure that the NWP remains agile and responsive to both current and future needs.
