Dear colleagues,

As you may recall, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA) at its third session established the ad hoc work programme on the new collective quantified goal on climate finance (NCQG) for 2022–2024.¹ As co-chairs of the ad hoc work programme, we have been requested by the CMA to conduct at least three meetings under the ad hoc work programme this year, back-to-back with at least three technical expert dialogues (TEDs), with one dialogue to take place in advance of the sixtieth sessions of the subsidiary bodies (SB 60, June 2024), one in conjunction with those sessions and one well before CMA 6. Two of the dialogues should be organized in separate regions with a view to facilitating inclusive and balanced geographical participation.²

The [ninth TED](#) and the [first meeting](#) under the ad hoc work programme were held from 23 to 26 April 2024 in Cartagena, Colombia. The tenth TED and second meeting under the ad hoc work programme were held in conjunction with SB 60 in Bonn with more than 450 participants, representing governments, multilateral development banks, non-governmental organizations, academia and the private sector. The programme, presentations and video recordings are available [here](#). We take this opportunity to thank all participants for their active and respectful engagements. We also thank Parties for sharing their views on the elements of the NCQG and their expectations for taking the work forward to the eleventh TED and third meeting under the ad hoc work programme before Parties agree the NCQG at CMA 6. Further details, including the dates and provisional programme for the eleventh TED and third meeting under the ad hoc work programme, will be made available on the [NCQG website](#) in due course.

In preparation for the eleventh TED and third meeting under the ad hoc work programme, we would like to:

1. Invite written inputs ahead of the third meeting under the ad hoc work programme;
2. Invite submissions on the topics and sub-topics and format for the eleventh TED and the third meeting under the ad hoc work programme;
3. Invite consultations with groups of Parties.

1. Invitation for written inputs

As outlined at the fourth session of the second meeting under the ad hoc work programme, we intend to update the input paper well ahead of the third meeting under the ad hoc work programme. The updated input paper will be based on the views expressed at and submissions made during the tenth TED and second meeting under the ad hoc work programme.

To help us update the input paper, we would like to invite Parties to send us written inputs by **Monday, 5 August 2024**, on the following:

- a) Views/elements from previous submissions and interventions that have further evolved and can be updated, and/or could be further elaborated;
- b) Proposals for helping us bridge ideas on the various elements pertaining to the NCQG.

Please note that early submissions would allow us to make the input paper available well ahead of the third meeting. To facilitate the identification of bridging ideas, we strongly encourage Parties to use the intersessional period to reach out to each other to discuss areas where you see common ground.

2. Submissions on the eleventh technical expert dialogue and the third meeting under the ad hoc work programme

In addition, as mandated in decision 8/CMA.5, paragraph 14, we invite Parties, constituted bodies under the Convention and the Paris Agreement, the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism, climate finance institutions, observers and observer organizations, and other stakeholders, including from the private sector, to submit their views on the eleventh TED and the third meeting under the ad hoc work programme via the [submission portal](#) by **Monday, 5 August 2024**. In these submissions, we encourage Parties and other stakeholders to share ideas on what should be discussed at the eleventh TED and the third meeting under the ad hoc work programme, and through what format.

3. Invitation to consultations

We take this opportunity to reiterate our encouragement to Parties and groups of Parties to engage with each other to identify and bring forward bridging solutions across the elements of the NCQG.

We also invite and encourage interested groups of Parties for informal bilateral consultations in July and August to assist us in our preparation of the input paper and in the preparation for the eleventh TED and third meeting under the ad hoc work programme. In particular, we would like to hear Parties' views on the work ahead of us, including any additional views to complement your written inputs.

We look forward to working with all Parties in a fruitful and constructive spirit and emphasize our intention to chair the ad hoc work programme in an open, inclusive, and transparent manner, ensuring participatory representativeness.
