## Thank you - excellencies, colleauges,

- Just transition is about how we manage change in a way that creates and preserve welfare for all.
- Just transition pathways will be different from country to country. At the same time, we are all in this transition together so we should learn from each other's experiences.
- For Norway, our just transition pathway is fundamentally about three things:
  - First inclusivity and meaningful participation in our transition to a low emission society. As an example, when we are developing and implementing our NDC, this is done on basis of a broad public hearing and consultation.
  - Second it is about <u>creating opportunities</u> by fostering new green and decent jobs. In that process, social dialogue through our tripartite cooperation is fundamental. We need a labor force with skills fit for a low emission future. Education and training and reskilling is crucial for us.
  - ➤ Third <u>just transition is about leaving no one behind</u> by respecting human rights and designing our policies in a way that do not adversely affect vulnerable groups in our population. I believe that our welfare state model, which go far beyond climate policies, is the best and most effective response to just transition.
  - International cooperation fosters understanding and awareness among governments, and among those engaged in shaping our low emission future.
    International cooperation can show best practices on

HOW we ensure and speed up a just transition. We already see positive initiatives coming forward in support to just transition pathways in developing countries.

- In shaping the solutions for just transition pathways, a broad set of actors and arenas must be mobilized. We believe that the UAE just transition work programme can play an important role in bringing together Parties and non-parties, in pointing to solutions and in giving us signals on how to move forward.
