

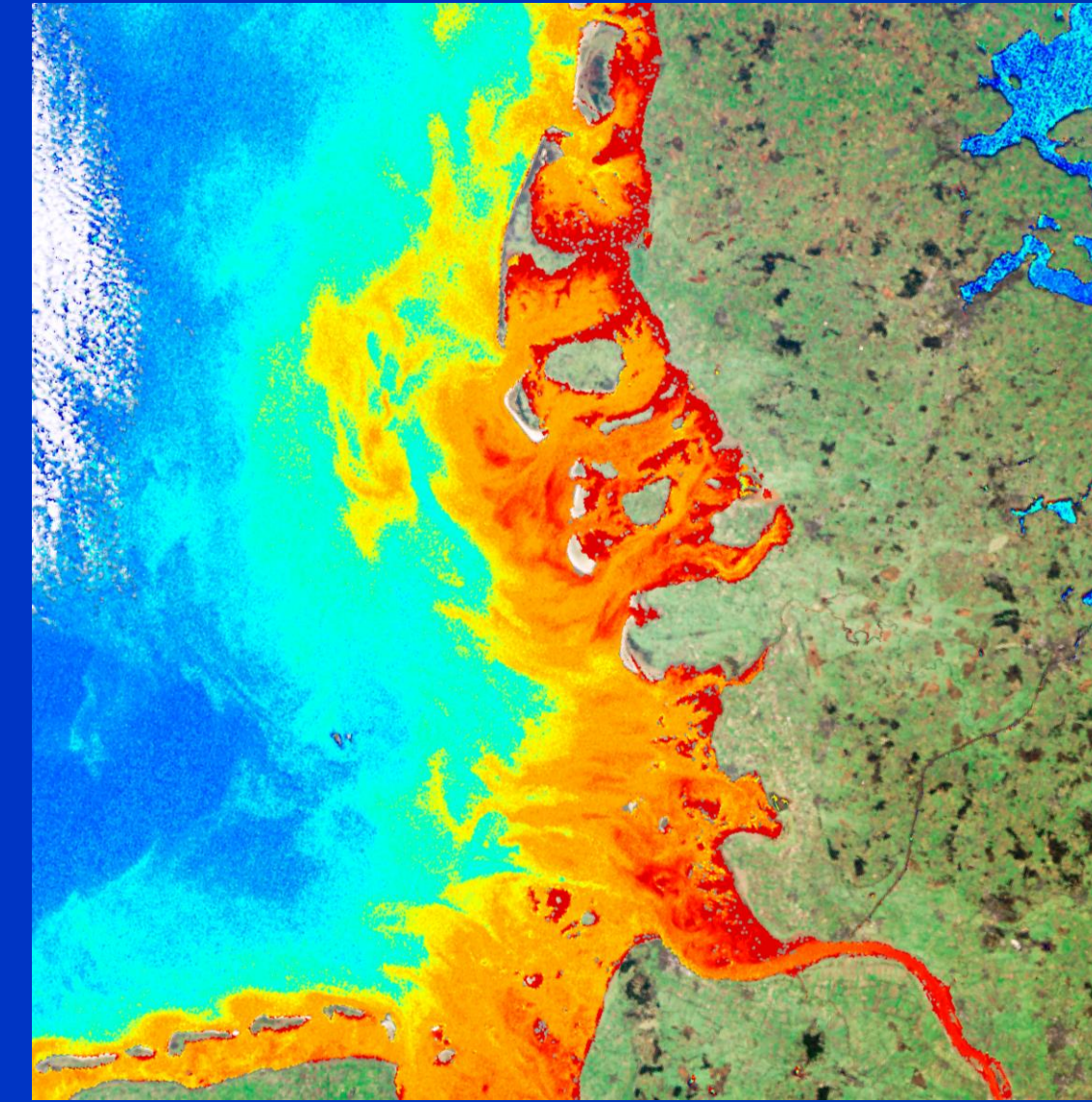
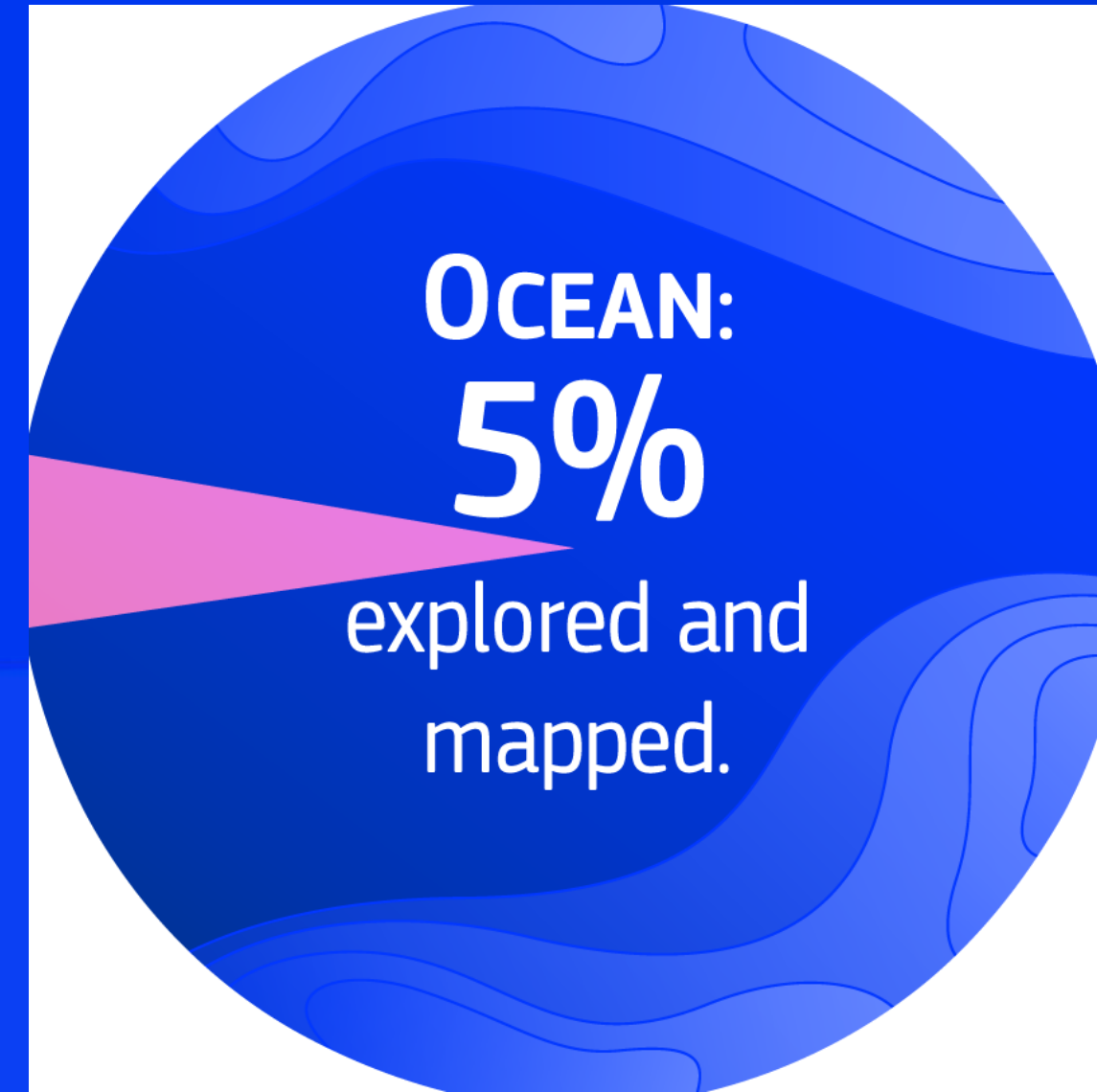

Improving the way we collect, share and use ocean data.

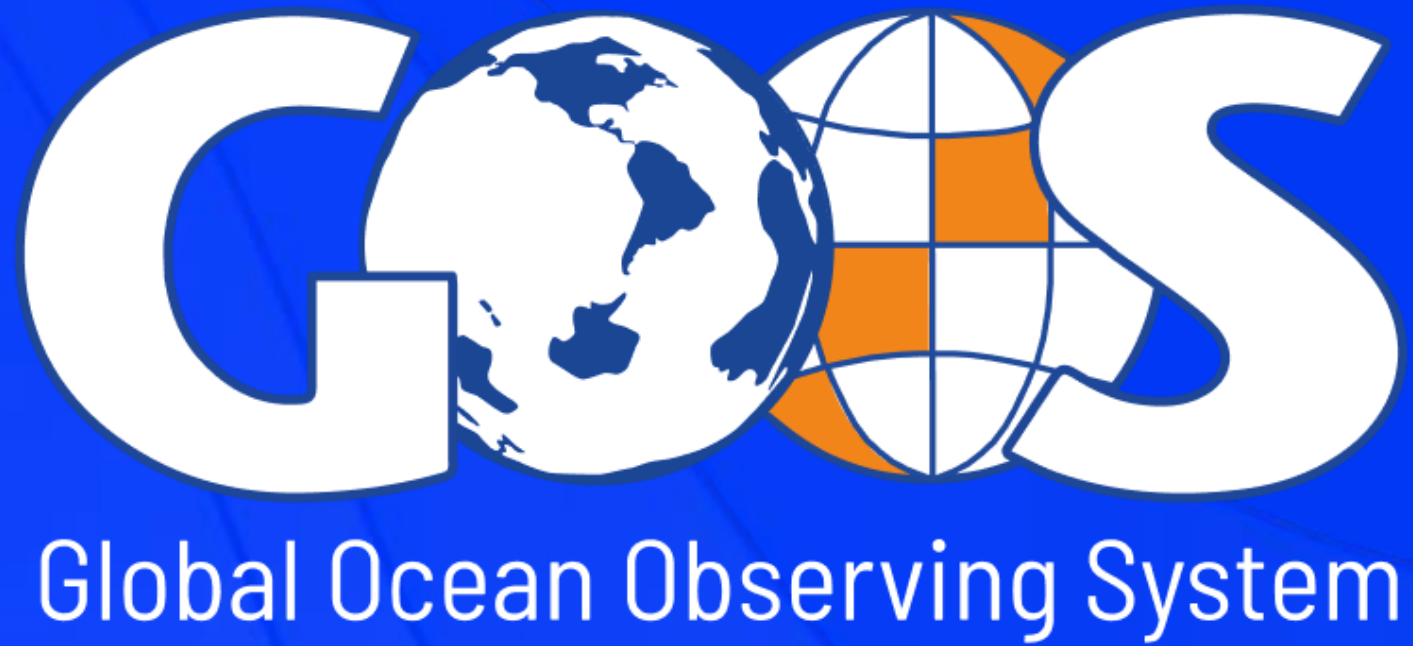
European governance framework for ocean observation

- Strategic partnership with the **Intergovernmental Oceanographic Commission**.
