Annotations to the provisional agenda

1. Opening of the meeting

1. The sixteenth meeting of the Paris Agreement Implementation and Compliance Committee will be opened by the Co-Chairs of the Committee on Tuesday, 24 March 2026.

2. Adoption of the agenda and organization of work

2. In conformity with rule 6 of the rules of procedure of the Committee (decision [24/CMA.4](#), annex), the Committee will be invited to consider the provisional agenda (document PAICC/2026/M16/1), annotated in the present document, for adoption. The Co-Chairs will present the proposed sequence of discussion for the meeting.¹

3. Information from the secretariat in relation to the submission of reports and communications from Parties to guide the Committee in its functions in accordance with its rules of procedure

(a) Information made available pursuant to rule 18 of the rules of procedure

3. The Committee will be invited to consider the most up-to-date information made available by the secretariat pursuant to rules 7 and 18, paragraph 1, of the rules of procedure on:
 - a. Communication and maintenance of nationally determined contributions (NDCs) by Parties in the public registry referred to in Article 4, paragraph 12, of the Paris Agreement;²
 - b. Submissions of mandatory reports or communications of information by Parties under Article 13, paragraph 7(a) and 7(b) as well as under Article 13, paragraph 9, and Article 9, paragraph 7, of the Paris Agreement;³
 - c. Participation by Parties in the facilitative, multilateral consideration of progress (FMCP) under Article 13, paragraph 11, of the Paris Agreement;⁴ and
 - d. Submissions of mandatory biennial communications of information under Article 9, paragraph 5, of the Paris Agreement.⁵

4. Having considered the information referred to above, the Committee will be invited to take any decisions or actions the Committee deems appropriate, notably relating to any initiation of a consideration of issues under paragraph 22(a) of the modalities and procedures⁶ and rule 18, paragraph 2, of its rules of procedure, or any resolution thereof.

(b) Information made available pursuant to rule 19 of the rules of procedure

5. Further, the Committee will be invited to consider the final technical expert review reports (TERRs) prepared under Article 13, paragraphs 11–12, of the Paris Agreement and made available to the Committee pursuant to rules 7 and 19, paragraph 1, of its rules of procedure.⁷
6. Having considered the information, the Committee will be invited to take any decisions or actions the Committee deems appropriate, notably relating to the identification of cases of significant and persistent inconsistencies of the information submitted by a Party pursuant to Article 13, paragraphs 7 and 9, of the Paris Agreement with the modalities, procedures and guidelines for the enhanced transparency framework (MPGs),⁸ for the purposes of paragraph 22(b) of the modalities and procedures, pursuant to rule 19, paragraph 2, of the rules of procedure.⁹

4. Consideration of issues and engagement with Parties concerned

(a) Consideration of information provided by Parties concerned

7. The Committee considered information provided by Parties concerned at its 14th and 15th meetings and agreed on how to respond to each of these Parties.¹⁰ The Committee also reaffirmed its preparedness to continue its engagement with Parties concerned.¹¹
8. The Committee will be invited to consider any further information provided by Parties concerned in response to the notifications sent to Parties¹² or to subsequent communications by the Committee, as well as any updates provided by the secretariat in this regard. The Committee will further be invited to take any decisions or actions the Committee deems appropriate.

(b) Consultations with Parties concerned

9. At its 15th meeting, the Committee engaged in consultations with four Parties concerned who had requested to have a consultation during that meeting of the Committee.¹³ The Committee engaged with them and considered the challenges and constraints as well as the intentions they outlined with regard to the communication of their NDCs and/or their BTRs.¹⁴ It agreed to follow up inter-sessionally, and at its 16th meeting, to explore specific opportunities to assist these Parties.¹⁵ Also at its 15th meeting, the Committee noted a request by a Party to be consulted, and agreed to make the necessary arrangements for this consultation.¹⁶
10. The Committee will be invited to continue engagement with the respective Parties concerned, and/or other Parties that requested a consultation,¹⁷ and to consider the information provided by the Parties concerned as well as any expert advice and additional information sought and received by the Committee from processes, bodies, arrangements and forums under and serving the Paris Agreement, in accordance with paragraphs 25(c) and 35 of the modalities and procedures and rules 10 and 21 of the rules of procedure.
11. The Committee will be invited to take any decisions or actions the Committee deems appropriate, including to explore specific opportunities to assist the consulted Parties.¹⁸

5. Consideration of systemic issues

12. According to paragraph 32 of the modalities and procedures, the Committee may identify issues of a systemic nature with respect to the implementation of and compliance with the provisions of the Paris Agreement faced by a number of Parties and bring such issues and, as appropriate, any recommendations to the attention of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA) for its consideration.¹⁹
13. Building on its discussions at its 13th and 14th meetings,²⁰ the Committee, at its 15th meeting, continued its consideration and identification of possible issues of a systemic nature with respect to the implementation of and compliance with the provisions of the Paris Agreement faced by a number of Parties.²¹
14. The Committee noted with concern the large number of Parties that had, by the end of its 15th meeting (2 October 2025), still not communicated an NDC, and the significant number of Parties that had not submitted mandatory reports and information under the ETF.²² The Committee also noted the constraints and challenges raised by Parties included in paragraph 25 of the report on the 15th meeting.²³ Some Committee members noted that the setting by the CMA of a clear and explicit deadline for the next round of NDCs, as well as the effective communication of that

deadline to Parties and the public, is of critical importance. Some Committee members recalled decision [4/CMA.1](#), paragraphs 1–3, and noted the importance of support to developing country Parties in preparing, communicating and accounting for their NDCs.²⁴

15. The Committee agreed to continue to discuss whether the matters referred to in paragraph 14 above²⁵ relate to issues of a systemic nature.²⁶

6. Consideration of matters relating to gender and Action for Climate Empowerment

16. In response to decision [3/CP.25](#), the Committee is requested to continue to include in its regular reports information on progress towards integrating a gender perspective into its processes.²⁷ In addition, with the adoption of the Belém gender action plan,²⁸ the Committee is invited to consider the good practices and reporting thereon identified in the synthesis report by the secretariat on progress in integrating a gender perspective into constituted body processes²⁹ and to include in their annual reports information on how they are improving the content and structure of their reporting in this area.³⁰
17. In addition, as part of the Glasgow work programme on Action for Climate Empowerment (ACE), the Committee is invited to include in its regular reports information on how ACE is implemented under its workstreams.³¹
18. The Committee will be invited to consider presentations from the secretariat on gender and on ACE. The Committee will further be invited to consider how the goal of gender inclusivity and ACE are implemented under its respective workstreams and how to reflect on it in its annual report.

7. Budgetary and financial matters

19. As agreed by the Committee at its second meeting and in accordance with rule 6, paragraph 2(f), of its rules of procedure, budgetary and financial matters are included as a standing agenda item on the provisional agenda for each meeting. The Committee will be invited to take note of the information presented by the secretariat.

8. Dates of the seventeenth meeting of the Committee

20. In accordance with rule 5 of its rules of procedure, the Committee will be invited to consider and agree on the dates, duration and venue of its seventeenth meeting on the basis of a proposal from the Co-Chairs of the Committee.
