Discussion scope of the 8th Durban Forum on capacity-building:

Overarching topic

 Strengthening institutions at national level to support capacity-building activities for the implementation of NDCs in developing countries"

Sub-topics

- The role of academia, research institutions and other national or subnational institutions in strengthening and retaining capacities in developing countries;
- Enhancing coherence and coordination amongst national and international stakeholders (such as inter alia. government institutions support providers, civil society organizations, subnational authorities, academia and research institutions, and the private sector) for the design and delivery of capacitybuilding activities supporting NDC implementation;
- Best practices and available tools or methodologies for assessing the impact and effectiveness of capacity-building activities in strengthening national institutions capacity to implement NDCs.

Mandate & background

 - Fostering global, regional, national and subnational cooperation (1/CP.21, para 73 (d));
 - Exploring how developing country Parties can take ownership of building and maintaining capacity over time (1/CP.21, para 73 (f)); and
 - Identifying opportunities to strengthen capacity at the national, regional and subnational level (1/CP.21, para 73 (g)).
- Decision at PCCB 2 to identify options to strengthen the Durban Forum, including through regional dialogues building on efforts of experts on the ground.

Mandate & background

Document PCCB/2019/6

PCCB was established in December 2015 with the aim to address gaps and needs, both current and emerging, in implementing capacity-building in developing country Parties and further enhancing capacity-building efforts, including with regard to coherence and coordination in capacity-building activities under the UNFCCC (1/CP.21, para 71).

- ❖ At PCCB 2, the PCCB decided to undertake a national-level pilot exercise to gather information on capacity gaps and needs related to the implementation of NDCs.
- ❖ Technical paper compiles and synthesizes findings from the pilot exercise to inform the PCCB's work in this area and provides inputs for possible recommendations by the PCCB to the COP.



Scope & methodology of technical paper

Document PCCB/2019/6





- Based on information contained in PCCB members' submissions on the results of their national-level pilot exercise undertaken from September 2018 to March 2019 as well as semi-structured interviews conducted with those PCCB members in April 2019.
- Geographical scope: Burundi, Dominican Republic, Georgia, Guatemala and Indonesia as well as members of the Organisation of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS)
- Findings are complemented with:



Insights from review and analysis of official documents from countries of participating PCCB members



Information shared by multilateral capacitybuilding providers



Outcomes:

- ✓ Key capacity gaps and needs identified in mitigation, adaptation and cross-cutting areas
- ✓ Set of good practices identified and compiled
- ✓ Recommended actions for the PCCB

Recommendations for consideration by the PCCB

The COP may wish to consider inviting Parties in a position to do so, intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations as well as the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism and the Technology Mechanism to support developing countries in undertaking the assessment of their capacity gaps and needs with regard to the full implementation of their current NDCs and the development of new or updated NDCs by 2020.

The COP may wish to request the PCCB to:

i. Continue its work on **collecting and sharing experiences**, good practices and lessons learned from a national level assessment of capacity gaps and needs related to climate action;



Recommendations contd.

- ii. Develop a toolkit to guide a national level assessment of capacity gaps and needs relating to the implementation of the Paris Agreement, taking into account lessons learned from national capacity needs assessments conducted with support from the GEF, activities under the Readiness and Preparatory Support Programme of the GCF, and other relevant initiatives;
- iii. Prepare and regularly update an overview of existing capacity-building programmes and other sources of support to developing countries in building their capacity for the implementation of the Paris Agreement, as well as to collect and share experiences and lessons learned of developing countries that have made use of the aforementioned support;
- iv. Analyse the governance and coordination structures for the development and implementation of NDCs and national adaptation plans in place in all developing countries and identify good practices in this regard, including detailed information on the associated processes of building systemic, institutional and individual capacities that led to the good practice, as practical references for all developing countries;

Recommendations

Document PCCB/2019/7

- PCCB may wish to consider developing a standard on how to mainstream gender into its activities and include it in its progress report to COP 25.
- PCCB may consider developing recommendations for consideration by COP 25:
 - Request the PCCB to raise awareness of the importance of gender-responsive approaches and the importance of integrating gender considerations into climate capacity-building through the capacity-building portal, the capacity-building hubs, its social media network on Facebook, and its workplan activities.
 - ➤ Invite the PCCB to utilize and expand its networks with relevant stakeholders in order to:
 - ✓ Ensure that the PCCB's activities take gender considerations into account;
 - ✓ Increase the visibility of relevant existing work related to mainstreaming gender considerations into climate capacity-building by improving accessibility of information and inclusiveness. For instance, through the capacity-building portal and the PCCB Facebook page, and by linking to the UNFCCC gender pages and other portals, where appropriate.



Recommendations (contd.)

Document PCCB/2019/7

- Invite Parties to build the capacities of national institutions to:
 - ✓ Integrate gender considerations at all stages of NDC implementation;
 - ✓ Apply gender analysis and gender budgeting approaches;
 - Ensure a gender-balanced structure and meaningful participation in planning and decision-making processes.
- Invite Parties to establish partnerships, communication channels, and coordination mechanisms between gender and climate stakeholders to strengthen coherence and coordination. For instance, by nominating and building the capacity of the National Gender and Climate Change Focal Points.
