#### Salient points from the submissions:

- A necessary shift is required from donor-driven and project-based programming frameworks with pre-determined outcomes and qualitative indicators to country-driven and programmatic approaches with adaptive management and capacity retention strategies.
- Co-evaluation of capacity-building needs and priorities, co-creation of knowledge and capacity-building outcomes, and collaborative partnerships are important to ensure capacitybuilding efforts cater to country-specific needs, are sensitive to the power dynamics between the providers and recipients of capacity-building, and are inclusive of the local and indigenous knowledge and experience.

- The way in which capacity-building efforts are designed, financed, implemented, and evaluated have implications on the enhancement (or lack thereof) of country ownership in the process and over time.
- Coordination mechanisms are crucial for improving the country ownership and capacity retention, and could be fostered through enhanced institutional arrangements and networks, improved communications, and updated legal mandates.
- The interlinkages between capacity-building and elements of ACE are key in ensuring various groups of stakeholders are aware of and actively engaged in the ongoing efforts and the built capacity would be retained and strengthened over time.

The Committee could consider inviting an expert on Action for Climate Empowerement (ACE) to advise on how synergies between capacity-building and ACE can be mobilised.
- Regardless of the **in-person** nature of this year's Hub, **online interactions** with off-site audiences and/or speakers and innovative forms of capacity-building through visual and digital media will be greatly encouraged. Additionally, based on an assessment of the previous hubs and participant feedback received, long classroom-style presentations will not be encouraged.

The activities of the PCCB Network are also aligned with PCCB's priority areas and are guided by the PCCB Network task force.
- The evaluation framework for the pilot phase of the PCCB Network seeks to provide an overview of the Network's growth, reach, and progress during its pilot phase.




