## **PCCB Focus Area 2025**

## Capacity-building for designing holistic investment strategies, bankable projects and stakeholder engagement to strengthen the implementation of NDCs and NAPs in developing countries

Was agreed intersessionally and formally acknowledged by COP 29 and CMA6







## Background

- COP 21 decided that the PCCB will annually focus on an area or theme related to capacity-building.
- The 2025 focus area is "Capacity-building for holistic investment" strategies, bankable projects, and stakeholder engagement to strengthen the implementation of NDCs and NAPs in developing countries."

### **Investment Strategies**



Detailed public investment plans for achieving NDC and NAP goals while considering country-specific climate priorities and local contexts, available financial resources, investment instruments, macroeconomic conditions, and debt burdens.

### **Bankable Projects**



Projects demonstrating financial viability, risk mitigation and clear returns on investment. Attractive to investors, banks, and development institutions. Vary based on countryspecific needs and contexts.

### Stakeholder Engagement



Essential for collaboration, strengthening institutional capacities, and creating enabling environments for effective climate action – crucial throughout all aspects of project design and implementation.

# **Gaps and Needs Mapping**

**Objective: to identify critical gaps between the capacity-building support** provided by key stakeholders and the specific capacity-building needs expressed by governments

# Key gaps identified (1)

- Inability to maintain a sound grasp of broader macroeconomic conditions and market trends and their relationship with climate action
- Insufficient alignment of climate policies across sectors and public institutions
- Insufficient alignment of green projects with NDC & NAP goals and objectives
- Inadequate understanding of various reliable revenue models



# Key gaps identified (2)

- Unfamiliarity with the range of financial instruments at their disposal
- Lack of a comprehensive understanding of available financial sources and clear definition of climate finance
- Unfamiliarity with effective stakeholder engagement strategies across multiple levels
- Inadequate data collection, management and reporting

# Highlights





Emphasis on finance and capacity-building as critical pillars and enablers of climate action. A platform to exchange knowledge on the specific barriers and challenges and ways to address them.



Embedding capacitybuilding into various initiatives can influence top-down approaches and avoid duplication.

# Focus area-aligned takeaways

## Investment strategies

- Country-driven, needsbased CB efforts are more holistic than project-based approaches
- Cross-cutting activities with co-benefits for efficiency (ie linking climate & biodiversity)
- Data-driven planning

## Bankable projects

- Emphasis on support from • Learning exchange **GCF** Readiness between communities and institutions for retained Programme MELs and data-driven skillsets
- planning for identifying initiative impact and improvements needed
- Local government training programs for project design

# **Capacity-building Hub**

- The Capacity-building Hub is a space for **representation** and collaboration among stakeholders engaged in capacity-building activities.
- Established at COP24 and a **mandated annual event** held during COP.
- The 6th Capacity-building Hub took place at COP29 with over 1,500 participants. Hosting 42 sessions and featuring more than 240 experts from over 150 institutions.











# 7<sup>th</sup> Capacity-building Hub



- Mainstreaming of **cross-cutting issues**
- Knowledge co-creation and shared learning
- Hands-on capacity-building through the **CB Hub Academy** (UNU-VIE)
- Systematization of **capacity gaps and needs** and respective solutions
- Strengthening sectoral partnerships
- Alignment with yearly COP and capacity-building **priorities**
- **Cross-fertilization** between thematic pavilions
- **Synergizing** with capacity-building efforts of the Secretariat

### Phase 1: Detailed implementation

- Data collection (from UNFCCC reporting) processes)

- Clustering of needs based themes
- Report on capacity gaps and needs (eg NDR report)
- Develop MEL framework capacity-building
- Leverage and mobilize PCCB Network and ICG
