## Convening platform

- Visibility for developing country capacity needs and existing support

## Space for peer-learning

- Systematic approach to peer learning and knowledge exchange to address capacity gaps, share practical experiences highlight capacity-building support available

## Mandated space

- Mandated by COP and CMA decisions
- Only COP space dedicated to capacity-building
- Showcase capacity-building activities of bodies and partners

## Inclusive and accessible

- Space for representation for all NPS
- Informal space to host innovative and creative events



# Objectives

Strengthen the capacity of developing countries to prepare, update, and implement their NDCs and NAPs, with a focus on practical implementation challenges and opportunities.

Enhance the reach and visibility of capacity-building activities undertaken by the secretariat, ICG members, PCCB Network and other capacity-building programmes

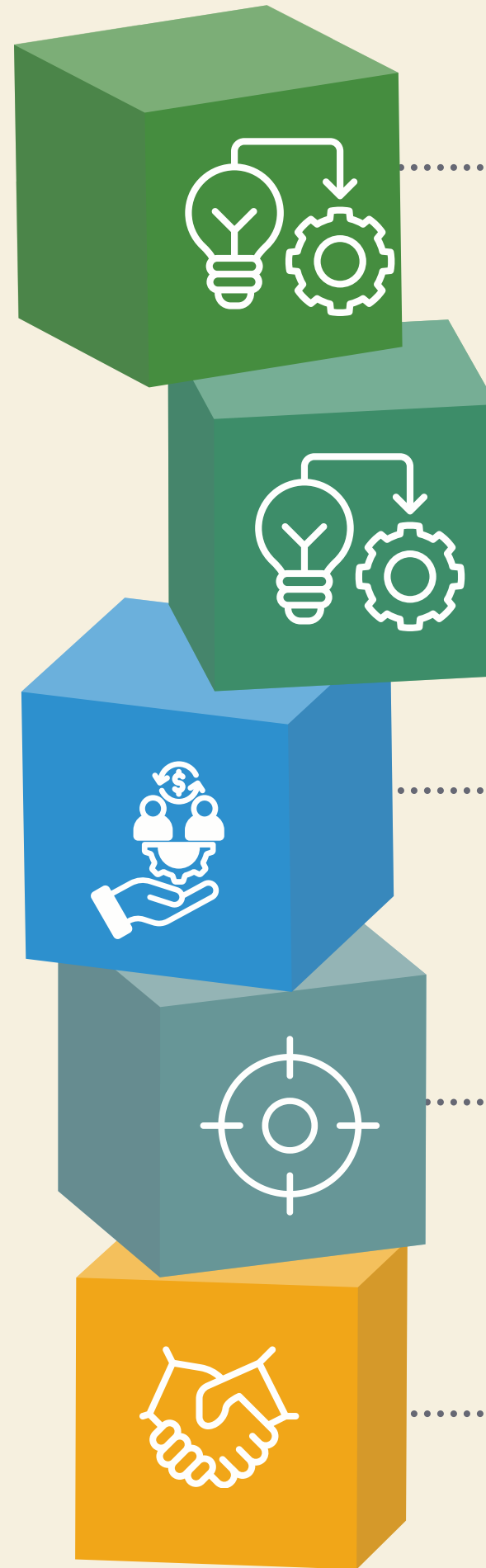
Utilize the insights and outcomes generated to inform and support the PCCB's workstreams, including the State of Capacity building report, knowledge products, and related outputs.

## Finance, technology and capacity-building (MoI)

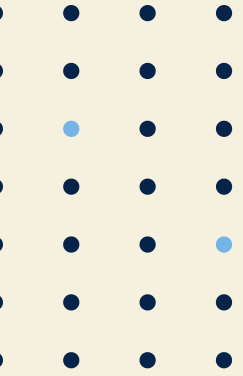

# Analytical Considerations

## Context-specific

Reported gaps and needs reflect national circumstances, institutional arrangements, development priorities and climate objectives

## Reporting differences

Gaps and needs vary in structure, scope, timeframe and level of detail across reporting instruments

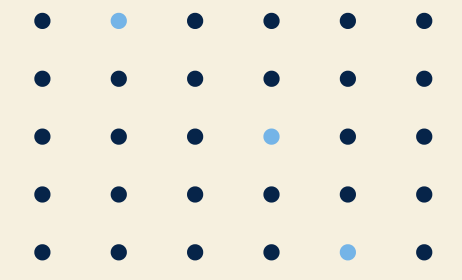
## Lack of defined terms

Parties use diverging terminology for similar issues, leaving gaps open to subjective interpretation

## Formalising definitions

Defining terms too early may give rise to sensitivities or obligations not previously anticipated
