AKNOWLEDGING that the Paris Committee on Capacity-building (PCCB), established at COP21, addresses current and emerging gaps and needs in implementing and further enhancing capacity-building in developing countries. The PCCB fosters collaboration between actors at all levels (local, national, regional and global) strengthening networks and partnerships to enhance synergies and promote knowledge and experience sharing. Through its network and its communication tools, the PCCB facilitates access to information and knowledge for enhancing climate action in developing countries;

AGREEING THEREFORE to launch a new “Youth4Capacity” Programme, to support concrete activities aimed at strengthening the capacities of young people, particularly in vulnerable countries, and the African region, and promote the active exchange of experiences and lessons learned, in the framework of the Youth4Climate initiative, through various channels including through the PCCB Network;

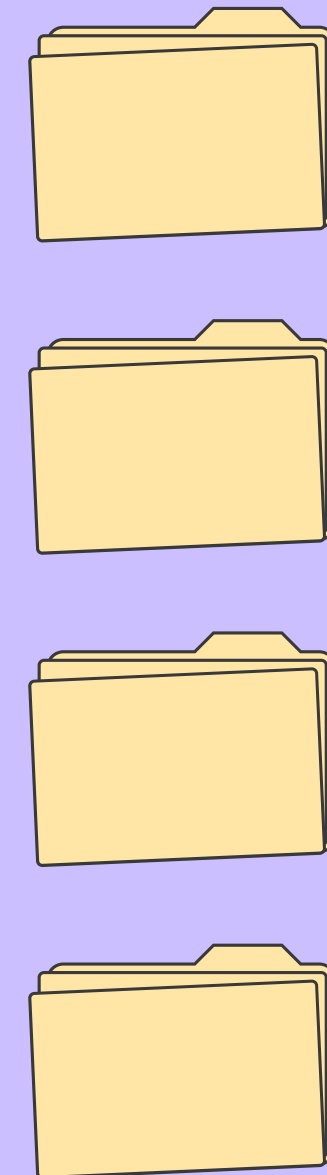
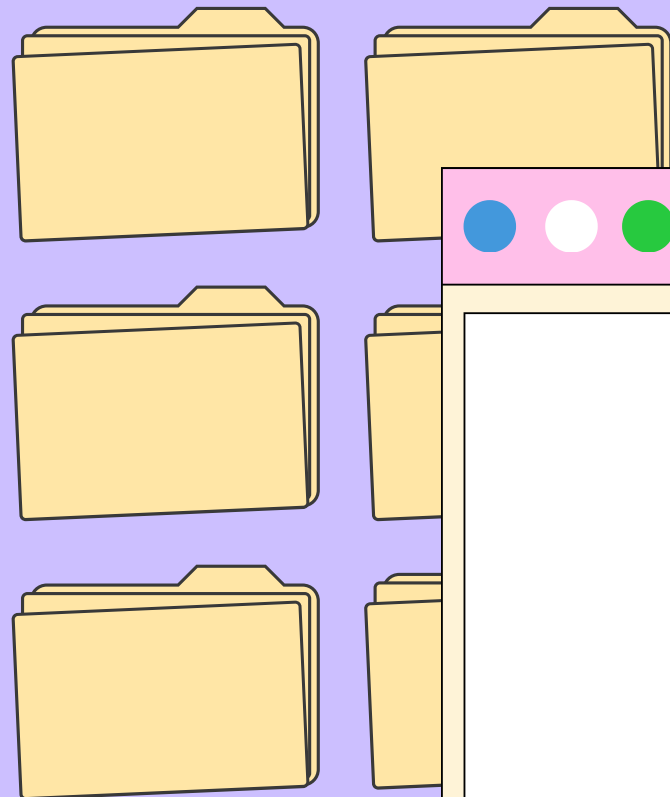

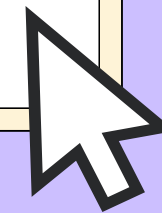

Becoming... Series



- Preparing an advocacy
1. Choose your issue. Identify the problem and why this is important. Research the issue.
 2. Background research. Gain a better understanding of your issue to understand what worked and what didn't? Are there any other people or groups who are already working on this issue?
 3. Understand existing policies. Are you can build on? Who is responsible for influencing your issue?
 4. Identify your resources. Map out what you can leverage. Think about who you can work with.
 5. Capitalize on social media. What are the most effective platforms in your country? What digital campaigns can you create? Who can you collaborate with?
 6. Write an advocacy plan. Develop a campaign. What resources do you have? What are the challenges? Who are your target audiences? Identify your goals.

Outcomes

- Long-term, country-driven capacity-building – embedded within national institutions rather than delivered as isolated interventions – has been consistently called for.
- Unified government approaches, aligned with technical assistance, country platforms and harmonized standards, were identified as essential to overcoming fragmentation and translating NDCs and NAPs into bankable investments.
- Strong, coordinated institutions were widely seen as the foundation for building readiness at scale.
- A broader structural challenge was surfaced: fragmented support and limited coordination across capacity-building actors.

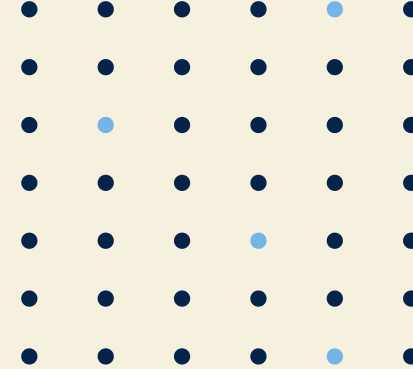
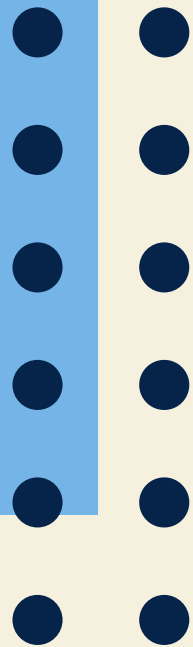
