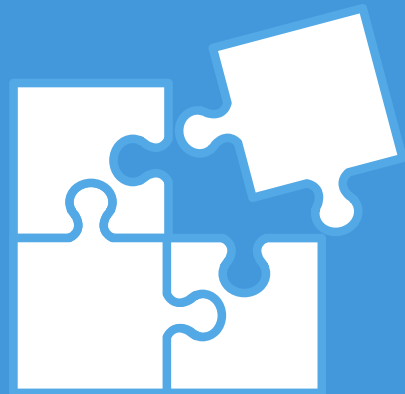

Under the umbrella of these work areas, the PCCB Network activities can be clustered as follows:



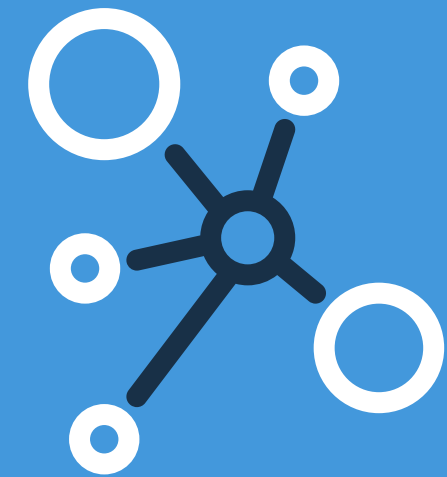
Technical exchanges & peer learning:

newsletters, stories, podcasts, postcards, interviews, and blog posts.

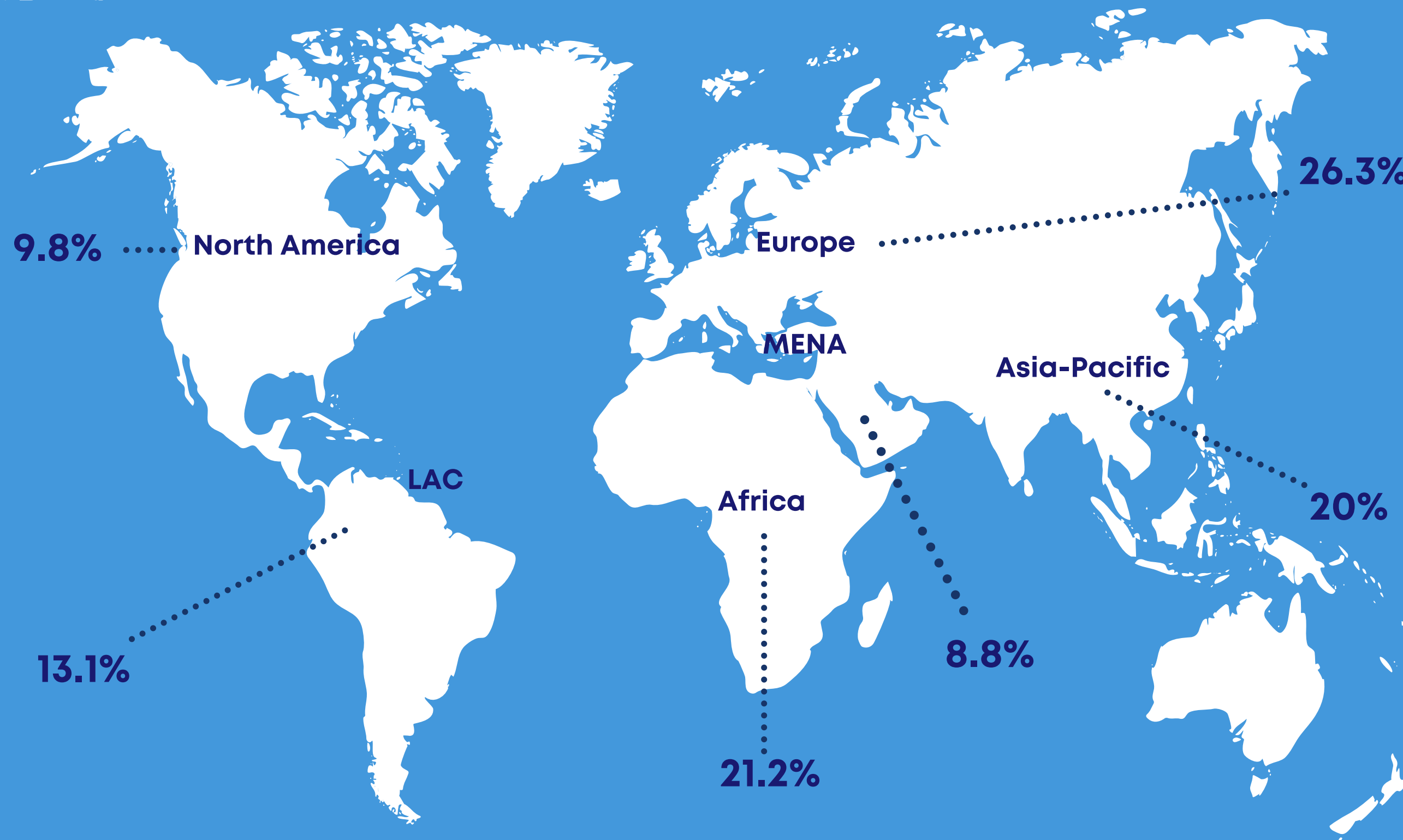


Networking & Engagement:

all-member meetings, regional meetups, surveys, and open call for proposals.

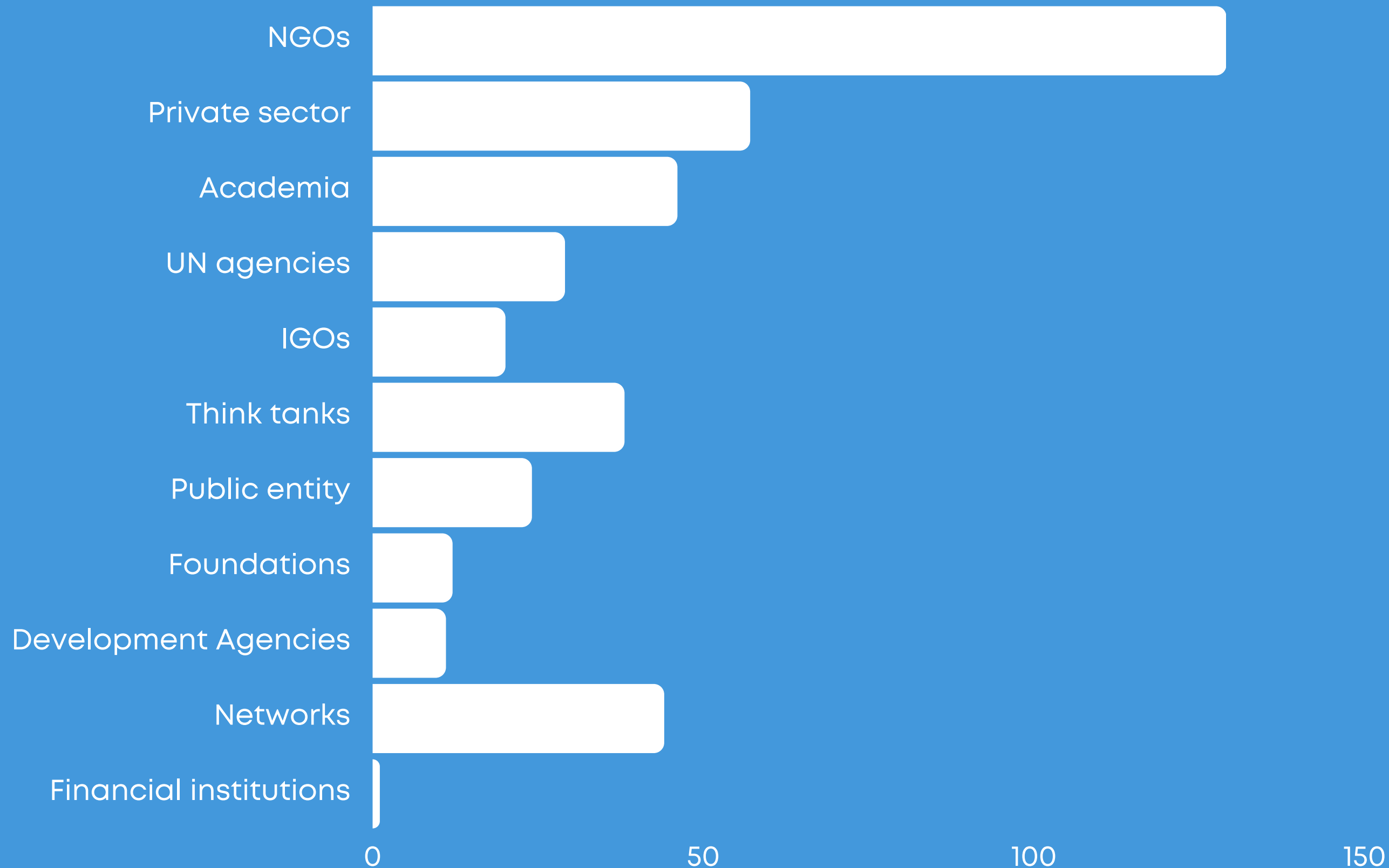
NETWORK IN NUMBERS

Regional Distribution

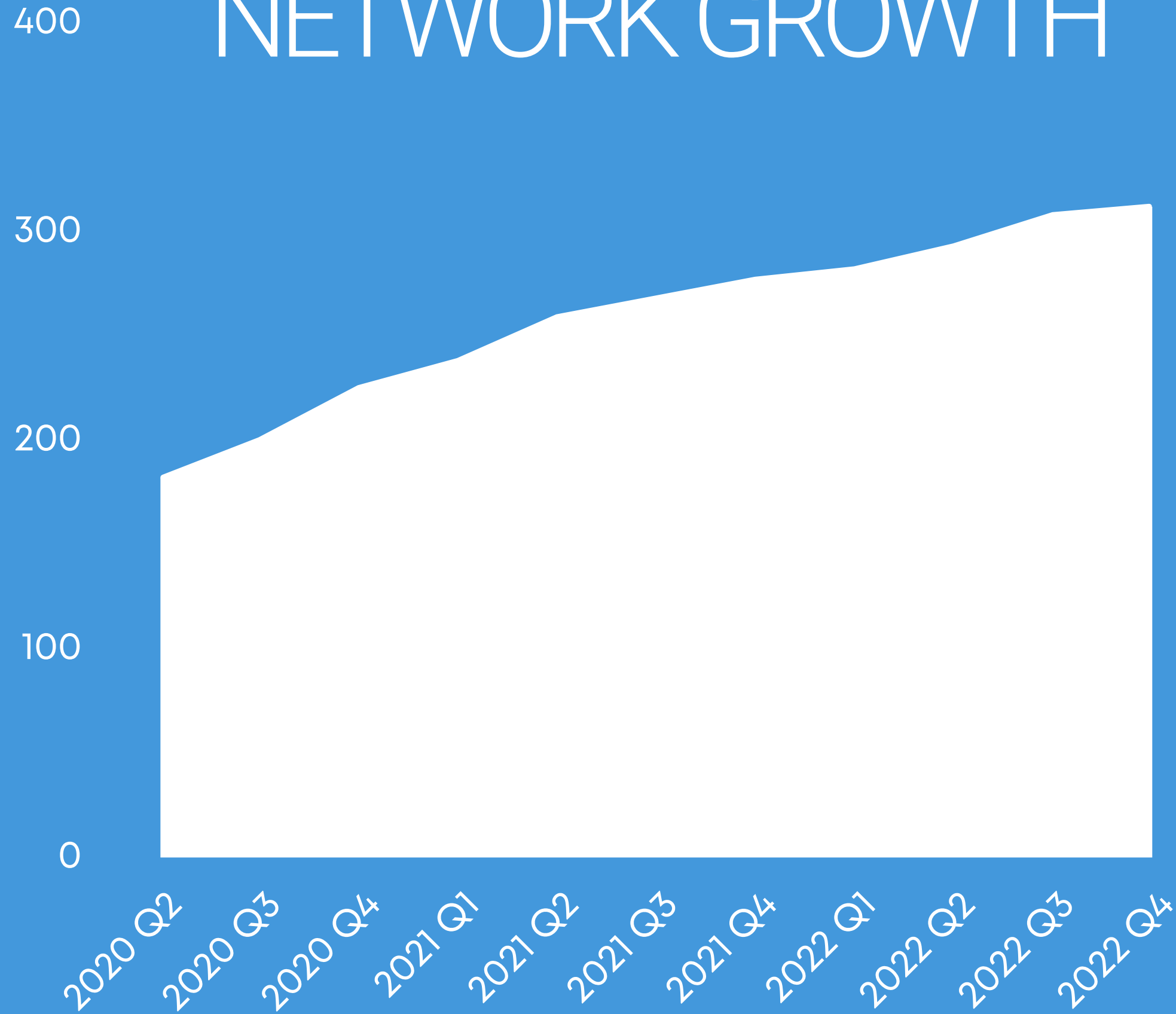

Institutions focused on cross-cutting issues

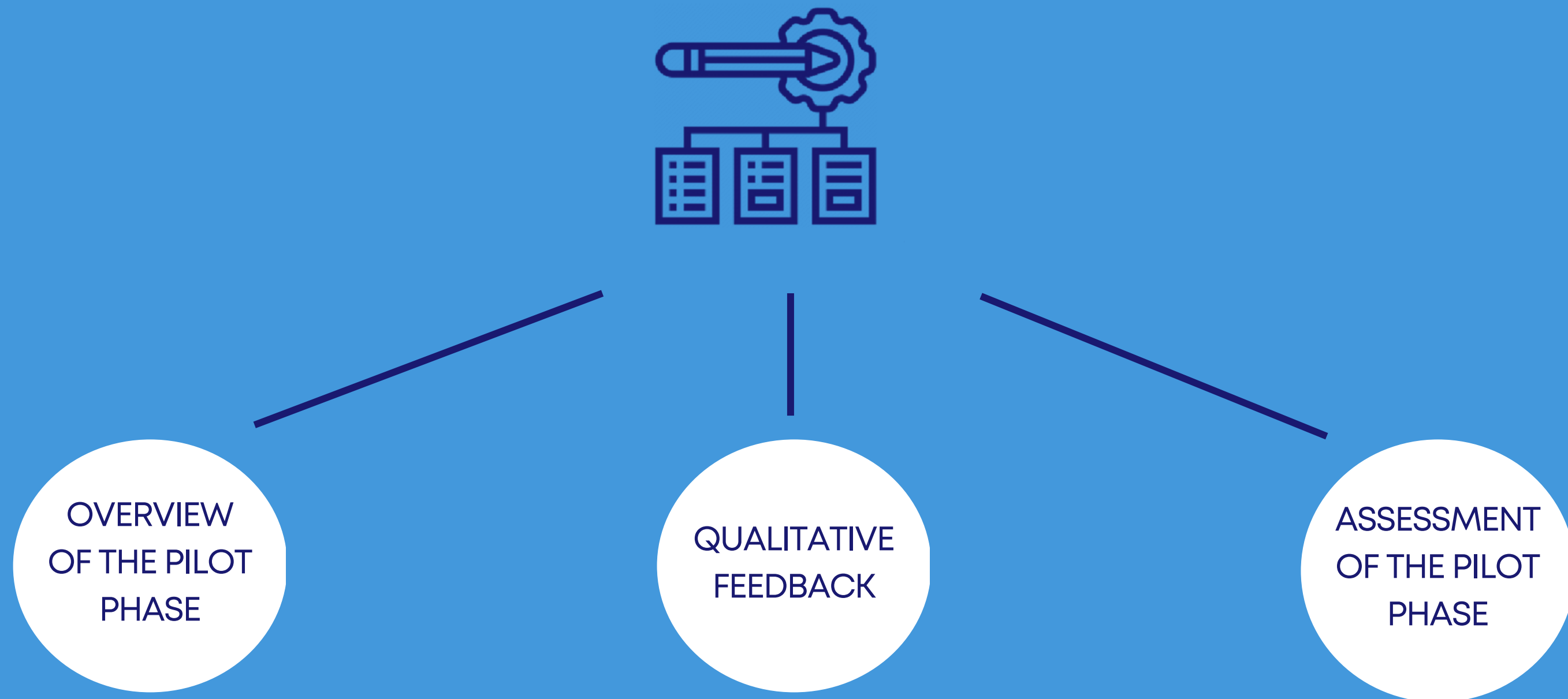
