## Background note on the draft 2021–2024 workplan of the Paris Committee on Capacity-building

Recommended actions by the Paris Committee on Capacity-building

The Paris Committee on Capacity-building (PCCB) will be invited, during its 4<sup>th</sup> meeting, to:

- a) Consider and discuss the draft of its 2021–2024 workplan;
- b) Finalize the workplan during the meeting or agree to finalize the workplan intersessionally.

### I. Possible actions for consideration by the Paris Committee on Capacity-building

1. The PCCB may wish to consider and discuss the draft of its 2021–2024 workplan, which is contained in the annex to this document.

2. The PCCB may also wish to consider the following procedural options for finalizing the workplan, as follows:

(a) *Option 1*: Agree on the 2021–2024 workplan of the PCCB at the 4<sup>th</sup> meeting of the PCCB, to be presented to Parties for consideration at COP 26 in line with 9/CP.25, paragraph 15;

(b) **Option 2**: Agree on the 2021–2024 workplan of the PCCB intersessionally, to be presented to Parties for consideration at COP 26 in line with 9/CP.25, paragraph 15. This will involve intersessional work and decision-making via conference calls and other electronic means to reach agreement on the workplan on a no-objection basis.

#### II. Background

3. The PCCB was established at COP 21 in 2015. Its aim is to address gaps and needs, both current and emerging, in implementing capacity-building in developing country Parties and further enhance capacity-building efforts, including with regard to coherence and coordination in capacity-building activities under the Convention.<sup>1</sup> In 2019, CMA 2 decided that the PCCB shall also serve the Paris Agreement in accordance with the mandate and terms of reference agreed by the COP.<sup>2</sup>

4. In accordance with a mandate from COP 21, the PCCB currently manages and oversees the 2016–2020 capacity-building workplan.<sup>3</sup> During its 1<sup>st</sup> meeting, in May 2017, the PCCB became operational and adopted a rolling workplan for 2017–2019 in order to implement the mandates from the COP. Later in 2017, the PCCB included this rolling workplan in its annual technical progress report to COP 23.<sup>4</sup> In 2019, COP 25 requested the PCCB to extend its rolling workplan until the end of 2020.<sup>5</sup>

5. COP 25 also requested the PCCB to develop a workplan for the period of its extension on the basis of the priority areas and activities contained in the annex to decision 9/CP.25 for consideration at COP  $26.^{6}$ 

6. In the same year, the CMA decided that the PCCB shall also serve the Paris Agreement in accordance with the mandate and terms of reference agreed by the COP.<sup>7</sup> CMA 2 decided that the priority areas and activities of the PCCB are those agreed at COP 25.<sup>8</sup>

7. In response to the request from the COP to develop a workplan (see para. 5 above), the PCCB requested the secretariat to develop, under the guidance of the Committee, the draft 2021-2024 workplan of the PCCB intersessionally for consideration at the 4<sup>th</sup> meeting of the PCCB.

#### Annex

## Workplan of the Paris Committee on Capacity-building for 2021–2024

1. The Paris Committee on Capacity-building (PCCB) was established at the twenty-first session of the Conference of the Parties (COP), held in 2015, with the aim of addressing gaps and needs, both current and emerging, in implementing capacity-building in developing country Parties and further enhancing capacity-building efforts, including with regard to coherence and coordination in capacity-building activities under the Convention.

2. <sup>1</sup> In 2019, the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA), at its second session, agreed that the PCCB shall serve the Paris Agreement in accordance with its mandate and terms of reference.<sup>2</sup>

3. Also in 2019, at COP 25, the PCCB was reviewed and its mandate extended by five years.<sup>3</sup> In further refining the mandate of the PCCB, the COP set out three priority areas:

(a) Enhancing coherence and coordination of capacity-building under the Convention with a focus on avoiding duplication of efforts, including through collaboration with bodies under and outside the Convention that engage in activities related to capacity-building, as appropriate and in accordance with their respective mandates;

(b) Identifying capacity gaps and needs, both current and emerging, and recommending ways to address them;

(c) Promoting awareness-raising, knowledge- and information-sharing and stakeholder engagement with bodies and relevant actors under and outside the Convention, as appropriate and in accordance with their respective mandates.<sup>4</sup>

4. The COP decided that, going forward and subject to the availability of resources, the PCCB shall conduct the activities set out in the annex to decision 9/CP.25, in accordance with the priority areas referred to in paragraph 2 above.<sup>5</sup> Furthermore, it decided that the PCCB shall work on any additional activities that may be assigned to it by the COP within its mandate, subject to the availability of resources.<sup>6</sup> The CMA confirmed that the above-mentioned priority areas and activities also apply to the work of the PCCB under the Paris Agreement.<sup>7</sup>

5. The COP requested the PCCB to develop a workplan for the period of its extension on the basis of the priority areas mentioned in paragraph 2 above and the activities mentioned in paragraph 3 above for consideration at COP 26,<sup>8</sup> and requested that the workplan include core elements such as priority areas, activities, deliverables, timelines and expected results, in accordance with the above-mentioned priority areas.<sup>9</sup>

6. At COP 25, Parties and relevant institutions were invited, as appropriate, to provide support and resources to the PCCB for implementing its workplan in the light of the aim of the Committee referred to in paragraph 1 above.<sup>10</sup>

7. The second workplan of the PCCB, for 2021–2024, builds on the successful activities undertaken by the PCCB during implementation of its first workplan, for 2017–2020, and in designing the second workplan, the PCCB took into account lessons learned from implementing the first.

8. To support the implementation of its first workplan, in 2017 the PCCB formed four working groups. These groups will continue to exist and will in 2021–2024 support the implementation of the second workplan of the PCCB. The areas of work of three of the working groups correspond to the three priority areas mentioned in paragraph 2 above. The fourth working group focuses on cross-cutting issues.

#### Cross-cutting issues

9. The PCCB was requested by the COP to take into consideration cross-cutting issues such as gender responsiveness, human rights and indigenous peoples' knowledge in managing its first workplan.<sup>11</sup> The PCCB will continue taking cross-cutting issues into consideration in managing and implementing its second workplan.

10. In line with the decision on gender and climate change, in which the COP called for all constituted bodies under the Convention to include information on progress towards integrating a gender perspective in their processes,<sup>12</sup> the PCCB developed a gender mainstreaming standard.<sup>13</sup> The PCCB will continue to apply this standard while implementing the activities of its second workplan.

#### Monitoring, evaluation and reporting

11. The PCCB will regularly monitor and evaluate the progress, outcomes, impacts and effectiveness of the activities under its second workplan, and, as requested by the COP, will report on the expected work under its workplan and on the progress, outcomes, impacts and effectiveness of the activities in its workplan in its annual technical progress report.<sup>14</sup> The CMA confirmed that the PCCB shall also report to it through this report.<sup>15</sup>

12. The PCCB will periodically review the implementation of its second workplan and may adjust it, as appropriate, taking into account new mandates from and priorities identified by the COP and the CMA, as well as invitations or requests for collaboration from bodies or processes under and outside the Convention. The workplan will also be periodically updated to include further details on the activities contained therein.

#### Stakeholder engagement and communication, and outreach

13. The PCCB is developing a stakeholder engagement strategyand a communication strategyto support the implementation of its workplan for 2021–2024 and to guide it in effectively engaging and consulting with and informing stakeholders, as well as raising public awareness of climate change related capacity-building.

14. These two strategies build on and supersede the strategic plan on communications, stakeholder engagement and resource mobilization of the PCCB, which was developed in 2018 and guided the implementation of the work of the PCCB in 2019 and 2020.

15. In developing each of the priority areas and associated activities of its second workplan, the PCCB has aimed to strengthen engagement and collaboration with institutions, organizations, frameworks, networks and centres under and outside the Convention, including those at the intergovernmental, regional and national level, and through them, the subnational level, where appropriate, in order to enhance the implementation of capacity-building and the provision of support to developing country Parties.

16. The PCCB will engage with various stakeholders in undertaking its work, including through inviting observers to meetings and opening working groups to the participation of external experts. Other key channels through which the PCCB will communicate and engage with stakeholders are its informal coordination mechanism for capacity-building under the Convention, the PCCB Network, the Capacity-building Hub and social media. The column "Collaboration" in the workplan table provides an indicative, preliminary list of stakeholders the PCCB intends to collaborate with on the activities under its workplan.
