

### Third Plan of Action of the Task Force on Displacement (2022–2024)

Unedited

#### Chapeau:

The third Plan of Action of the Task Force on Displacement identifies deliverables that will contribute to implementing the TFD/WIM ExCom recommendations for integrated approaches to avert, minimize and address displacement related to the adverse impacts of climate change.

The third Plan of Action will be implemented over the period of two years (2022 - 2024).

The implementation of this Plan of Action will be guided by the following overarching objectives:

- Contributing to the implementation of the functions of the WIM as they relate to human mobility associated with the impacts of climate change: enhancing knowledge and understanding of comprehensive risk management approaches; strengthening dialogue, coordination, coherence and synergies; enhancing action and support, including finance, technology and capacity-building;
- Maximizing synergies and capitalizing on the added value of the TFD as a convening body well-positioned to bring together a broad range of stakeholders seeking to address the climate change and mobility nexus.
