#1 A brief history of the UNFCCC: Lessons from the past for a better future


United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC)

- Agreed in 1992 at Rio Summit, ratified in 1994.
- Goal: stablisation of greenhouse gas concentration in the atmosphere at a level that prevents dangerous anthropogenic interference with the climate system.
 The time frame allows people and planet to adapt their economies sustainably.
- Convention does not contain concrete targets to tackle climate change but is rather framework for future agreements and policies.
- Annex I (developed states (OECD countries) and states in transition) and Annex
 II countries (developing) to follow principle of "common but differentiated responsibilities" (CBDR).
- COP = Conference of Parties is the supreme decision-making body.
- Climate COPs are held every year, location rotates based on regional divisions.
