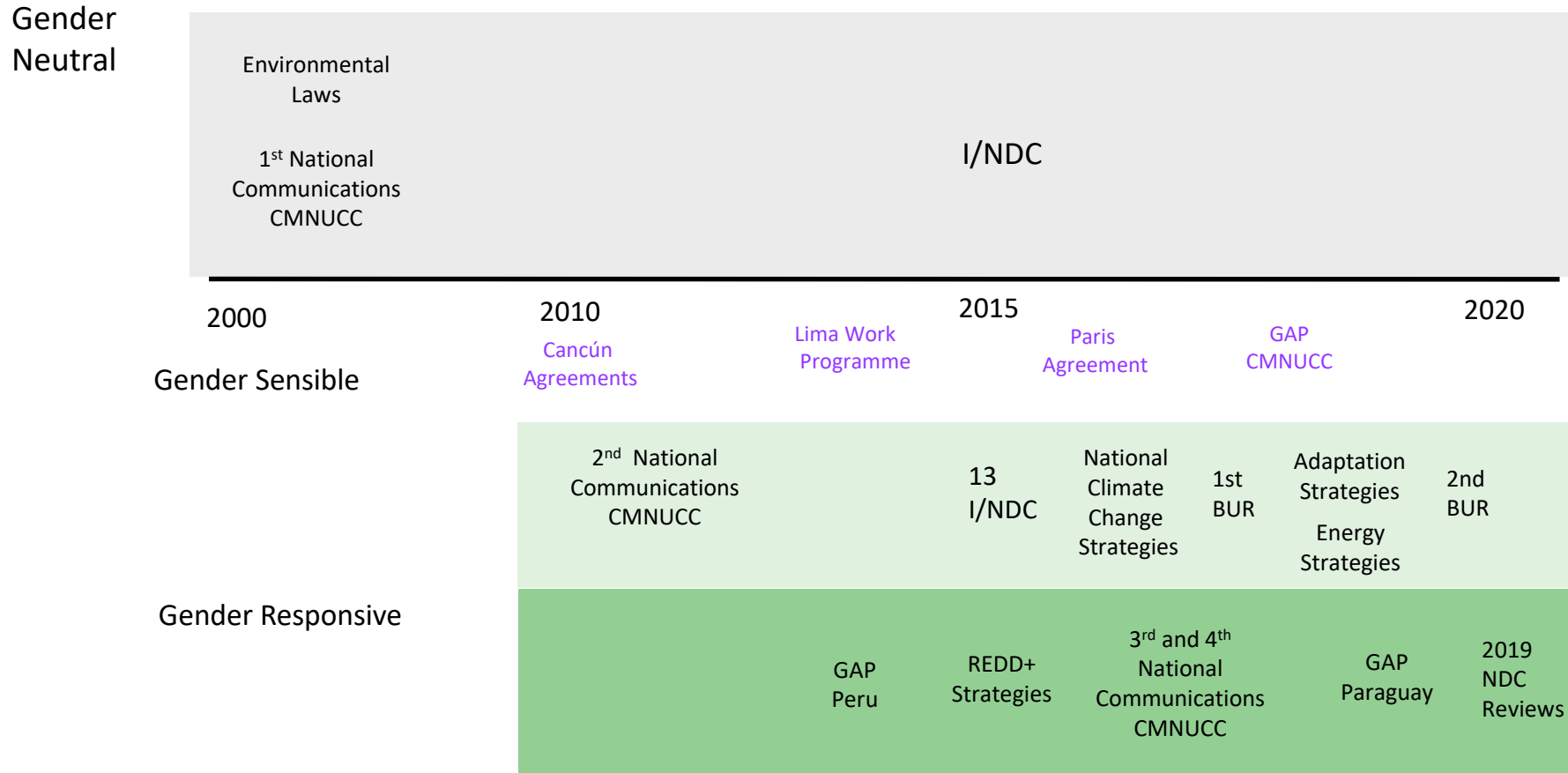
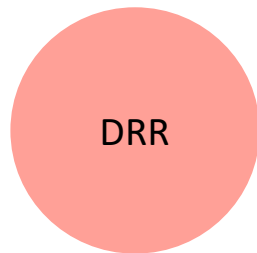
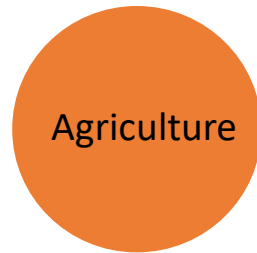
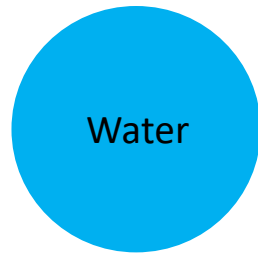


Evolution of the climate agendas, policies and actions in Latin America from gender neutral to gender responsive

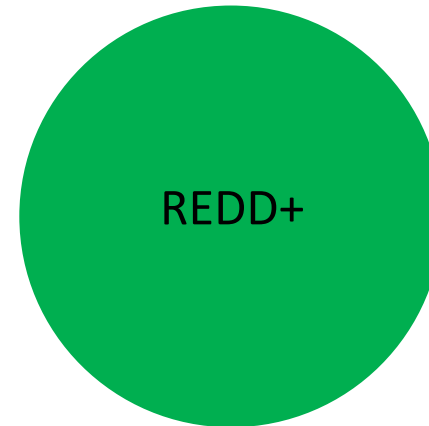

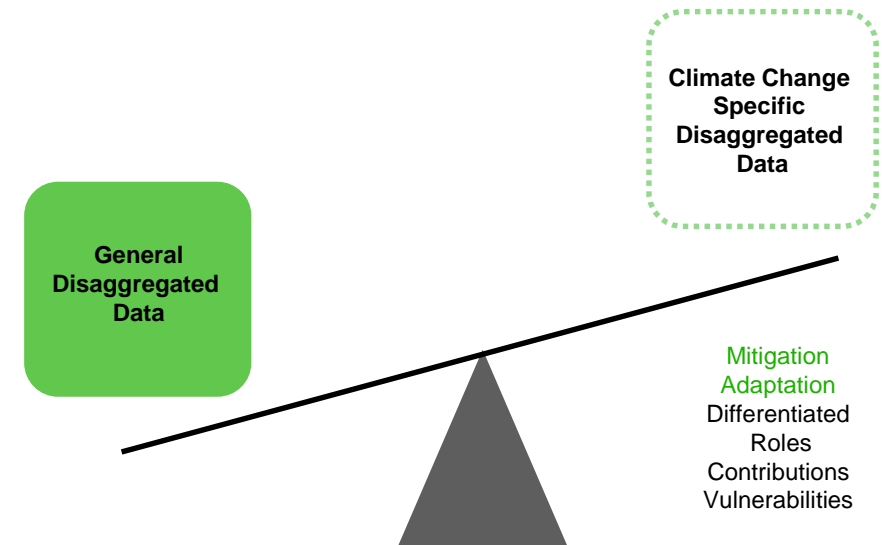

Common challenges that countries face to integrate gender equality and women's rights

1. Countries have not defined a common approach to promote gender equality and women's rights in their climate policies and agendas.
2. There is a lack of specific data on gender and climate change in the region.
3. There is little to none harmonization been the different national policies and initiatives that are developed for the different sectors related to climate change.



Opportunities in the region to design and implement a gender responsive climate agenda

1. Promote an exchange of experiences to share how they have integrated gender in different areas.
2. Establish a South-South Cooperation on gender and climate change
3. Engage civil society in the development of climate policies, strategies and initiatives that integrate gender in a more systematic and comprehensive manner
4. Bridge knowledge, address gaps, strengthen capacities in the long term through partnerships and lead to inclusive participation in order to better integrate gender equality and women's rights in national climate agendas, policies and actions
