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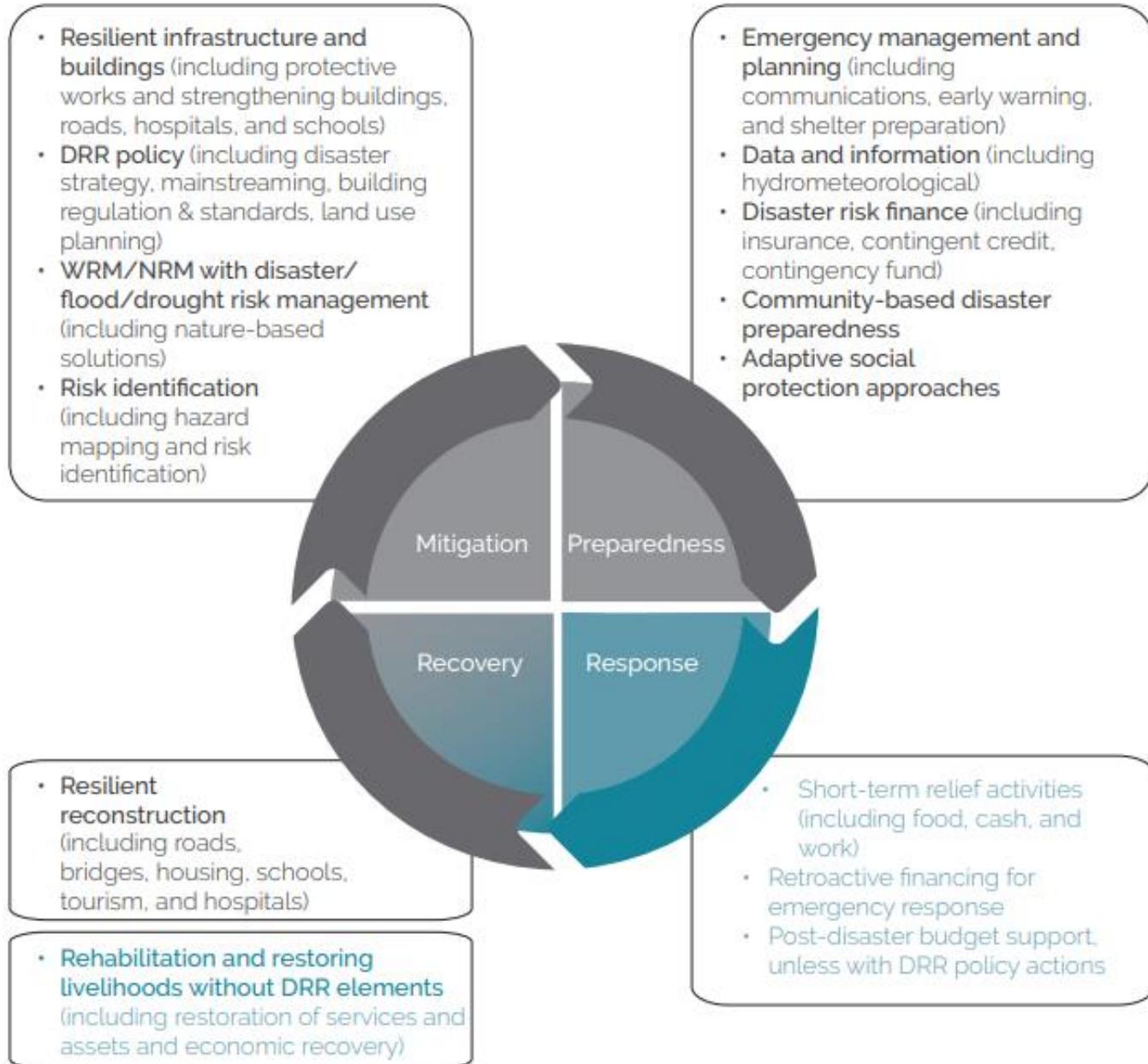

Some background context

- \$13.5 billion in adaptation support last year alone, ~\$8b targeting IDA countries
- IDA has existing crisis response windows and a slow onset window
- Emergency response instruments – DPLs, Cat-DDOs
- Treatment of future climate impacts is baked into WB engagement
 - WB to “Paris Align” all projects as of July 1st
 - CCDRs focus on how to maximize development and climate needs
- Environment and Social Framework protocols can inform discussions on non-economic losses

Taxonomy of WBG disaster risk management engagement



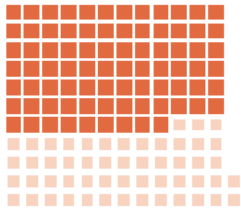

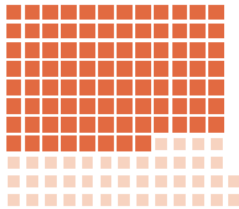

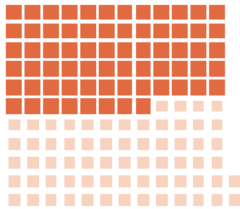
