





High level presidency event: Advancing Gender Equality in Climate Action

We are calling on global leaders, civil society and other organisations to come forward with new and strengthened commitments on Gender Day (9 November), to demonstrate how they are implementing the UNFCCC Gender Action Plan.

The event also aims to progress the goals of the **Generation Equality Forum's global Action Coalition on Feminist Action for Climate Justice**, convened by UN Women and co-led by Costa Rica, Maldives and organisational leads. The UK recently joined this Action Coalition as a Commitment Maker, and we have made a range of commitments in support of the Action Coalition's goals.

The strongest commitments will be given a platform at the UK's high-level event in the morning of Gender Day. Major policy shifts or major financial commitments will be prioritised.
