SUPPORT ON NAPS



Status - 1 June 2020:

- 84 proposals submitted (USD 205M requested)
- **62**% approved (52 proposals)

LDC specific:

- 32 proposals by LDCs (40% of portfolio)
- USD 78M in funding requested
- 17 proposals (USD 39M) already approved
- 5 technically cleared and with NDAs and DPs for final iteration
- Of remaining 10 proposals, 9 with NDAs and DPs, and 1 (Tuvalu) with GEF Sec.



Pace of approval of LDC proposals:

- Steady increase
- 2 of 15 approved in 2017 \rightarrow 17 of 32 approved so far in 2020
- 4 approvals since beginning of 2020 (2 in March)
- Secretariat remains committed to review and approve expeditiously
- The impact of COVID-19 is moderate-low

Feedback from countries not forthcoming on covid-19 impacts. Needed to provide strategic support

STATUS OF ACCREDITATION OF LDC ENTITIES



- Asia: 2 DAEs in Bangladesh; 1 DAE in Bhutan
- LAC: 2 nominated Haiti
- Africa: 2 DAEs (Rwanda & Senegal)
- Challenges:
 - Capacity to develop good funding proposal (post accreditation gaps and needs)
 - Assessment of gaps to better understand (apply Readiness support)

Support:

- Revamped PPF procedures assistance for proposal development.
- Increase focus on expansion of PPF for DAEs good CN to access PPF
- Collaboration with other Funds (ongoing initiative on CPDAE Community of Practice for Direct Access Entities with AF)

ENSURING PROGRESS IS MAINTAINED WITH COVID-19



Status

- Not experiencing significant delay in resubmissions
- Challenge in getting feedback from NDAs and DPs on COVID-19 impact
- TA support undersubscribed
- Small cohort of national or regional Delivery Partners in adaptation planning
- Implementation challenges (delivery partner-country agreements, procurement)
- Heavy reliance on external support

ENSURING PROGRESS IS MAINTAINED WITH COVID-19



Strategies:

- Constant follow-up once review sheets are shared. Open lines of communication
- Priority action e.g. TA Support (Mali, Tuvalu, Chad)
- Encouragement to utilize national/regional DPs. Greater likelihood of understanding local context and formulating transformation proposals
- Technical clearance meetings weekly schedule
- Multiple sequential proposals address urgent matters, validate later actions, better manage capacity for implementation

ESSENTIAL PROGRAMMES FOR CONSIDERATION



- Climate information services and early warning systems help to strengthen evidence base for decision making
- Technical capacity development
- Sub-national / regional / local adaptation planning coordination mechanisms
- Integrating solutions on priority sectors e.g. water and health; coastal ecosystems and livelihoods, agriculture and water, urban and watershed ecosystems
- Increase private sector and civil society partnership in adaptation
- Financing strategies and concept notes development leveraging USD 3M window
