

Procedural background






- In March (2023) the Supervisory Body adopted additional measures integrated with the capacity-building programme to support the transition of eligible CDM projects and requested the secretariat to implement
 - the programme and report on its status twice a year.
- This virtual workshop is part of the capacity building programme implemented by the secretariat in accordance with decision 2/CMA.3, paragraph 12. It is a one-off event during the first intersessional period of 2023, focusing on completion and submission of initial reports.

Modalities for implementing capacity-building activities





- Assess current capacity of countries and stakeholders (e.g. direct communication via RCCs, facilitate setting up/utilization of data collection systems);
- Develop targeted capacity building activities, based on the outcomes of a capacity assessment;
- Provide Technical assistance and mentoring DNAs, PPs and DOEs (e.g., helpdesks);
- Develop online resources and e-learning, and guidance documents on the rules, modalities and procedures for Art6.4 activities (e.g., online and onsite trainings courses, knowledge products, including templates, video tutorials available on website);
- Engage with stakeholders, through, inter alia, roundtable discussions, stakeholder meetings, dialogues and public consultations (e.g., dedicated sessions at the <u>Regional Climate Weeks</u>, Side events, others);
- Synergy and complementarity. Whenever possible, capacity building initiatives will be implemented in an integral and complementary way.

Capacity building identified priority needs (1/2)



Based on mandates of the CMA, RCC 2022 Dialogues and Survey

- Relevant COP and SB decisions.
- Setting baselines for application in host Parties
- Authorization of Internationally Transferred Mitigation Outcomes (ITMOs)
- Managing corresponding adjustments related to ITMOs
- Institutional arrangements, including reporting, for ITMOs
- Assistance to LDCs and SIDS
- Developing the technical capacity for robust reporting
- Registry set-up and system to avoid double-counting
- Ensuring alignment with the long-term trajectory of the Paris Agreement
- Assisting Parties to ensure consistency with guidance on cooperative



Capacity building identified priority needs (2/2)



Based on decisions by the Supervisory Body on transition of the CDM-to

- Designation of National Authorities
- Matters related to participation in the mechanism and contributions to sustainable development
- Types of activities, associated to emission reductions
- Contributions to the achievement of NDCs and to LT-LEDs
- Baseline approaches and other methodological requirements, including additionality and compatibility with
 NDCs and LT-LEDs
- Crediting periods to be applied for Article 6.4 and how those crediting periods are compatible with its NDCs and LT LEDs.
- Any other relevant regulations regarding transition
- Assistance to LDCs and SIDS

Existing network of regional collaboration centres (RCCs)



- RCC Bangkok supports 40 countries from Asia and the Pacific (Hosted by IGES)
- RCC Dubai supports 22 Arab States and 8 South Asian countries (Hosted by WGEO)
- RCC Kampala supports 19 countries in Eastern and Southern Africa (Hosted by EADB)
- RCC Lomé supports 26 countries in15 ECOWAS member states and 11 francophone countries (Hosted by BOAD)
- RCC Panama provides support to 17 Latin American countries (Hosted by UNEP)
- **RCC St. Georges** supports 16 countries in the Caribbean region (Hosted by WINDREF)

UNDERSTANDING NEEDS

The Supervisory Body adopted a Capacity-building programme that focuses on supporting the transition of eligible CDM project activities and programmes of activities to the Article 6.4 mechanism.

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

Increased regional capacity;

The secretariat conducted Hybrid and virtual Intersessional workshops on Article 6;

The RCCs addressed requests of regional stakeholders on Article 6 (help desks) and raised awareness.

KNOWLEDGE SHARING & TOOLS

RCC Kampala joined forces with. UNDP to develop an online course on Operationalizing Article 6.2;

RCC Panama and the Inter-American Development Bank co-organized a workshop on carbon markets;

RCC Bangkok organized a workshop on Climate Finance Mobilization including use of Carbon Markets.

Conclusions
