EmPower: Women for Climate-Resilient Societies is a unique collaboration between UN Women and UN Environment Programme that aims to put gender equality at the heart of climate action and disaster risk reduction in the Asia-Pacific region. EmPower influences change by building gender equality into national, subnational and regional climate policymaking, cultivating leadership of civil society organizations, harnessing renewable energy to build livelihoods for rural women, generating and collecting sex-age-diversity disaggregated data on gender and climate and fostering regional commitment and supporting intergovernmental processes linking climate and gender.

With the support of the Swedish Development Cooperation Agency, EmPower is working in three countries (Bangladesh, Viet Nam and Cambodia) and at a regional level in Asia-Pacific.



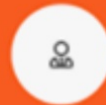

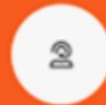

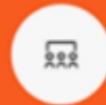

# Priority Area C: Coherence



## Gender and Climate Change Brief for the Katowice Committee of Experts on the Impacts of the Implementation of Response Measures (KCI)

The secretariat provides the constituted body members with a package of information briefs about gender integration under the UNFCCC process. They include an introduction to the mandates, an explanation of gender and commonly used terminology, as well as the gender and climate change nexus, and an annex of relevant resources. This brief describes how the **KATOWICE COMMITTEE OF EXPERTS ON THE IMPACTS OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF RESPONSE MEASURES (KCI)** addresses the gender perspective.

### GENDER AND THE ROLE OF CONSTITUTED BODIES

Integrating gender considerations – understanding and considering differing needs, priorities, access to resources, roles, power – and engaging women and men equally at all levels of climate planning and implementation can ensure more effective mitigation and adaptation outcomes and making certain that women and men have equal opportunities to contribute to and benefit from climate action.



**ALL CONSTITUTED BODIES ARE REQUESTED TO** include in their regular reports information on progress towards integrating a gender perspective into their respective processes (decision 3/CP.25, para 12) and the secretariat is requested to produce a biennial synthesis report on progress in integrating a gender perspective into constituted body processes (decision 3/CP.25, para 15(b)).

How are constituted bodies supported in progressing in integrating a gender perspective?

1. Technical paper (ECCC/TF/2018/1) provides information on entry points for integrating gender considerations into UNFCCC workstreams.
2. Secretariat to provide capacity-building support to constituted bodies and secretariat staff in integrating a gender perspective into their respective areas of work in collaboration with relevant organizations, as appropriate (3/CP.25 LWPG para 15(c)).
3. Secretariat to ensure that members of constituted bodies are introduced to gender-related mandates and to the relevance of gender in the context of their work in a consistent and systematic manner (3/CP.25 GAP activity C.1).

### GENDER UNDER THE UNFCCC – GENERAL CONTEXT

The **PARIS AGREEMENT** acknowledges in its preamble “that climate change is a common concern of humankind, Parties should, when taking action to address climate change, respect, promote and consider their respective obligations on human rights, the right to health, the rights of indigenous peoples, local communities, migrants, children, persons with disabilities and people in vulnerable situations and the right to development, as well as gender equality, empowerment of women and intergenerational equity”. There are also references to gender-responsive adaptation action (Art. 7) and capacity-building (Art. 11).

The **KATOWICE CLIMATE PACKAGE** includes multiple references to gender/women/social (impacts, consequences)

**VIRTUAL WORKSHOP**

The COP presidency (COP 26, para. 41) invites to appoint and provide support for an NSGCF for climate negotiations, implementation and monitoring.

Under the enhanced time work programme on gender and the gender action plan [Decision COP 26/1](#), the secretariat was requested, with the coordination of the national gender and climate change focal points (NSGCFs), Parties and relevant organizations, to organize an in-person workshop on 26 (2) to discuss and clarify the role and the work of the NSGCFs, and prepare a paper drawing on the recommendations on the role sought in their common workshop (2020 January 1-2). Due to the global COVID-19 situation, the in-person workshop has been postponed. To ensure momentum and to ensure the advancement of the requested deliverable, the secretariat is organizing virtual workshops from June to October 2020, and will conclude with the in-person workshop in 2021.

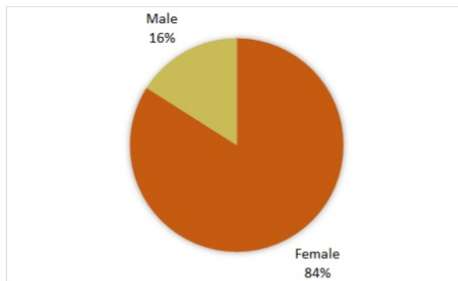
NGCCFP SKILLS WORKSHOP REGISTRATION BY REGION



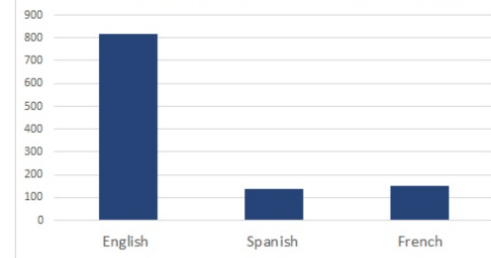
NGCCFP SKILLS WORKSHOP REGISTRATION BY SECTOR

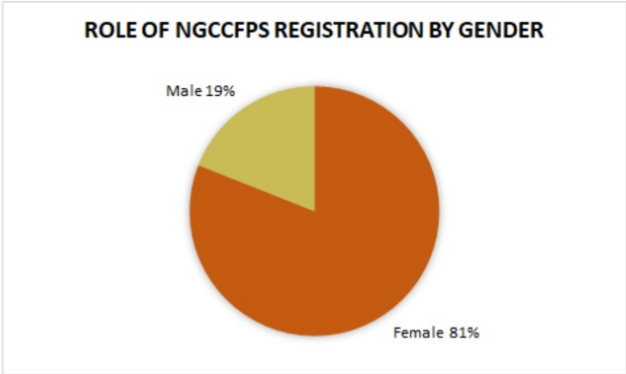
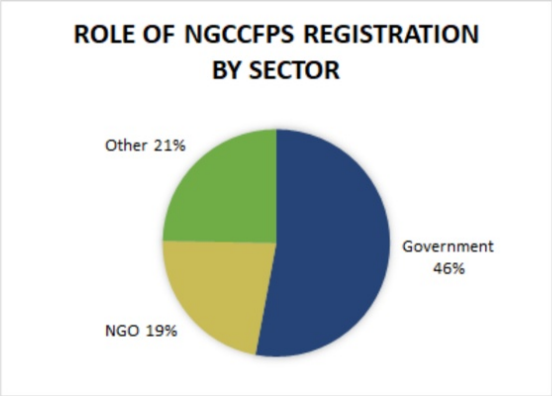
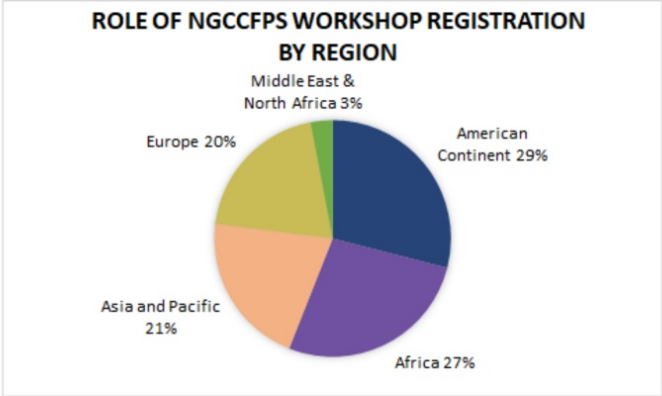
