1. Opening of the meeting

1. The 27th meeting of the plenary of the Compliance Committee of the Kyoto Protocol will be opened by the co-chairpersons of the plenary.

3. The plenary will also be invited to consider the organization of work of the plenary, as presented in the indicative schedule, for agreement.

3. Report on the twenty-sixth meeting of the plenary

4. The plenary will be invited to take note of the report on its 26th meeting prepared by the co-chairpersons, with the assistance of the secretariat (document [CC/26/2024/4](#)).

**4. Consideration of matters relating to gender and
Action for Climate Empowerment**

5. The plenary will be invited to consider a presentation from the secretariat on matters relating to gender and Action for Climate Empowerment (ACE). In accordance with the enhanced Lima work programme on gender and its gender action plan,² the plenary will be invited to reflect on its efforts of integrating a gender perspective into its processes and consider how to include information on progress in that regard in its annual report to the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol (CMP).³

6. In addition, the plenary will be invited to reflect on how ACE and its six elements – education, training, public awareness, public participation, public access to information and international cooperation on climate change – can be promoted and how it is integrated under its workstreams, in light of the Glasgow work programme on ACE and its action plan.⁴

The facilitative branch will be invited to report to the plenary on the branch's work since the 26th meeting of the plenary, including outcomes of the branch's in-depth assessment of its work undertaken in response to the mandates in the procedures and mechanisms and the rules of procedure and any recommendations to the plenary that the branch deems appropriate.⁶

8. Other matters

10. Based on its consideration of the reports of the branches under items 6 and 7 of the provisional agenda, including any recommendations made by the branches, the plenary may wish to consider the need for any meetings in 2026 as well as any matters related to budget and finance.

11. The plenary will be also invited to consider any other matters that may be raised.

Parties to the Kyoto Protocol**

12. The plenary will be invited to consider the draft of the annual report of the Compliance Committee to the CMP (document CC/27/2025/3), including any recommendations to the CMP that the plenary may decide to include.
