Title: Regional Dialogue on Article 6 Operationalization in Latin America

Theme: Cooperative approaches/market and non-market instruments

Background

The implementation of Article 6 of the Paris Agreement offers significant opportunities for countries to cooperate in achieving their climate goals while enhancing sustainable development. Latin American countries are increasingly interested in engaging in cooperative approaches, given the potential for both economic growth and emissions reductions. However, there remain challenges in capacity building, governance structures, and understanding the practical implications of Article 6 at the national and regional levels.

On the other hand, the Latin America has had diverse experiences in implementing carbon pricing instruments, often tailored to local contexts. These instruments provide a foundation for the development of cooperative approaches under Article 6. This side event will present the status for operationalization of Article 6 in the region, their relationship with Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs), and the integration with nationally determined contributions (NDCs) and national carbon pricing mechanism. Promoting a dialogue that will offer an updated perspective on how countries are positioning themselves to engage in Article 6, leveraging both existing carbon pricing infrastructure and new opportunities for cooperation.

Additionally, this event will take the opportunity to present key findings from the Concept Paper on the progress of operationalization of Article 6 in Latin America, coordinated between CCAP and RCC LatAm, which evaluates the region's progress, challenges, and priorities in implementing Article 6. Furthermore, the event will serve as the official launch of the Carbon Markets Observatory Initiative financed by the European Union through Euroclima Program and supported by UNEP and RCC LatAm.

The Regional Collaboration Centre for Latin America (RCC LatAm), in coordination with the Center for Clean Air Policy (CCAP) and the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), will host this side event to provide a platform for Latin American countries to share experiences, discuss best practices, and identify challenges and opportunities related to the implementation of Article 6.

Objectives:


- Present early findings on the progress of operationalization of Article 6 in Latin America.




