New Regional Collaboration Centre Established in Dubai

(Dubai, United Arab Emirates, 20 October 2019) - Today marks the official launch of the Regional Collaboration Centre Dubai, a collaboration between UN Climate Change and the World Green Economy Organization (WGEO) dedicated to advancing the goals of the Paris Climate Change Agreement in the Middle East, North Africa and South Asia.

RCC Dubai was launched, with support from the Government of UAE, at the opening ceremony of the Global Ministerial Conference on Green Economy, convened by WGEO, by Ovais Sarmad, Deputy Executive Secretary of UN Climate Change, and H.E. Saeed Al Tayer, Chairman of WGEO. The launch took place on the margins of the World Green Economy Summit.

CDM Passes New Milestones in Cooperative Action on Climate Change

(UN Climate Change News, October 2019) - The Clean Development Mechanism (CDM) has passed two exciting milestones - its millionth cancellation on the UN carbon offset platform and its 2-billionth issuance, demonstrating ongoing demand for cooperative action on climate change.

An increasing number of subnational and national governments are using carbon-pricing instruments as part of efforts to address greenhouse gas emissions in their jurisdictions. Some domestic emissions trading systems, including the Colombian emissions trading system and carbon tax, the European Union Emissions Trading System, the Korean emissions trading system, the South African and Colombian carbon tax and the Swiss emissions trading system, have been using CERs as eligible offset units that emitters in these jurisdictions can use for compliance with emission obligations.

(Panama city, Panama, 1 October 2019) - UNDP Latin America and Caribbean office based in Panama has published the "<u>Guideline for Latin American climate change negotiators: towards the implementation of the Paris Agreement</u>". The purpose of this guideline is to provide a solid base of information to the negotiators in the region, to facilitate their participation in international climate change negotiations. Latin America is highly vulnerable and has enormous potential to contribute to the reduction and absorption of GHG emissions, and to the discussion about the transformation towards low-carbon and climate-resilient development models. The guide seeks to complement other tools developed to guide climate change negotiators to get the full picture or big picture of the negotiation process. RCC Panama collaborated with technical inputs to the guideline.

Climate Neutral Now Initiative Reaches 200-Participant Milestone





(San Jose, Costa Rica, 10 October 2019) - PreCOP25 - ParlAmericas in collaboration with the Legislative Assembly of Costa Rica and the RCC Panama (UNFCCC-CAF) organized a side event in the margins of PreCOP25 which took place in San Jose, Costa Rica from October 8 to 10. The high-level side session "Strengthening Climate Governance as a Tool to Achieve a Just Transition towards Decarbonization" included the participation of Member of the Legislative Assembly Paola Vega (Costa Rica), Vice President for Central America of the Parliamentary Network for Climate Change; Senator Veronica Camino (Mexico), Vice President for North America of the Parliamentary Network for Gender Equality; Member of the Chamber of Deputies Jorge Rathgeb (Chile), Vice Minister of Water and Seas of Costa Rica Haydee Rodriguez, Deputy Executive Secretary Ovais Sarmad, UNFCCC and President of the Centre for Urban Sustainability of Costa Rica Andrea San Gil Leon.

The side event fostered a dynamic dialogue and exchange of good practices among diverse actors in relation to how effective and inclusive climate governance, can contribute to achieving a just transition towards a decarbonized world. Panel discussions also emphasized the importance of having a gender perspective in the development of climate solutions that leave no one behind. It boosts and spreads the <u>Parliamentarian call for action</u> declaration released as an outcome of the <u>4th Climate Change Gathering</u> which took place in Suriname on August, it will serve as a parliamentary contribution to the COP25.

One of the conclusion of the event was that concessional financing has been decreasing, countries must prepare and strengthen their capacities to access climate credits in the best terms and conditions; for this, alliances with other institutions, non-governmental organizations and with experienced accredited agencies are key.

Currently RCC Panama has provided technical support during previous editions.

Minister of the Environment, H.E. Milciades Concepción, stressed that these young people are an example for everyone; these leaders who already supporting Panama to become a low GHG emission economy.

(Panama City, Panama, 2 October 2019) - RCC Panama received the cordial invitation from the <u>Panama</u> <u>Industrial Union (SIP)</u> to participate in the "XIV edition of the International Sustainability Symposium", this year the main theme was "Sustainable



consumption and production, circular economy". The opening speech was given by Minister of Environment H.E. Milciades Concepcion.

During session "How do we achieve decarbonization of the economy? It was highlighted that the Paris Agreement provides the necessary tools to boost a decarbonized economy through mitigation, adaptation and financing actions. It was also mentioned that some of the areas that show progress in actions towards economy decarbonization in the region are renewable energy, energy efficiency, electric mobility, the calculation of carbon footprint in industry and eco-labeling.

together with the <u>National Energy Secretariat (SNE)</u> from Panama, this event provided the opportunity to harmonise the awareness of the relevant existing work in the region carried out by regional and multilateral institutions. Countries presented an overview of their energy systems, policy priorities and strategies. The workshop provided IRENA the chance to showcase the details of <u>REmap</u> and <u>FlexTool</u> methodologies and processes and guide a discussion on the status, opportunities and challenges of renewable energy development in the different energy sectors.

4th Gathering of the Parliamentary Network on Climate Change

(Paramaribo, Surinam, 8-9 August 2019) - RCC Panama participated

during the the "4th Gathering of the Parliamentary Network on Climate Change" which was organized by ParlAmericas and served as an opportunity to dialogue on concrete and effective legislative solutions to meet the urgency of climate change and contribute to the implementation of the Paris Agreement in line with the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals, including how parliaments can support the management and supervision of the carbon market and non-market mechanisms in their respective countries.

The <u>Parliamentarian call for action declaration</u> was released as an outcome of the gathering and as a parliamentary contribution to the UN Climate Action Summit and COP25. CDM CERs were acquired by ParlAmericas to made the gathering carbon neutral under its Climate Neutral Now pledge.
