Background

The side event aims to showcase two initiatives of RCC WAC Africa designed to support NDC 3.0 preparation, explore opportunities for enhancing NDC achievement through Article 6 and carbon pricing, and NDC tracking to ensure transparency and effective implementation of countries' NDCs under the Paris Agreement in West and Central Africa.

<u>First initiative</u>: Countries' NDC 3.0 submission is due at the latest by February 2025. In this context, the RCC WAC Africa has analyzed the status of preparation of NDCs by 26 countries in West and Central Africa and the support available and received.

<u>Second initiative</u>: The second initiative focuses on two synthesis reports of carbon pricing approaches in countries under the RCC's jurisdiction (West and Central Africa). These two studies provide a comprehensive understanding of the current state and prospects of carbon pricing in West Africa and Central Africa, respectively.


This integrated event aims to bring together policymakers, stakeholders, and experts from West and Central Africa to discuss the status of NDC preparations, explore carbon pricing as a tool for achieving NDC targets, and enhance development strategies for effective progress tracking. By fostering collaboration and sharing best practices, we seek to empower participants and countries as well as partners in the region to take meaningful action toward sustainable development and climate resilience in their respective countries.

Objectives:

This side event will serve as a platform to share insights and reflect on the outcomes of these initiatives to discuss the opportunities that exist for countries.

Key objectives include:

- 1. Overview of the status of preparation of NDCs and the potential carbon pricing approaches for achieving NDC in the region
- 2. Better understand challenges by the selected countries and facilitate the sharing of experiences, best practices in establishing robust national institutional frameworks and planning processes for effective NDC tracking and implementation and outcomes among participating countries highlighting the progress and impact of these initiatives







- 3. Exchange insights among peers on the technical guidance on assumptions and methodologies to ensure NDCs are aligned with the requirements of Decision 4/CMA.1 and thus trackable
- 4. Discuss and share experiences on the targeted training and resources to be provided to the five countries to strengthen their NDC development and tracking capabilities.




