A Time for Transformation: Building a More Sustainable, Resilient, and Inclusive Asia-Pacific after COVID-19 - Position Paper



RCC Bangkok host partner, the Institute for Global Environmental Strategies (IGES), has released a position paper on the spread of the new coronavirus (COVID-19) and associated global environmental challenges, based on the results of its analysis to date.

In this paper IGES identifies key issues through the lens of environment and sustainability, and recognizes that the COVID-19 pandemic is closely

related to – and extends beyond – these issues, and cannot be left unaddressed.

The UN Climate Change Standing Committee on Finance (SCF) has launched two calls for contributions and case studies in order to prepare two key technical reports related to climate finance.

The deadline for contributions is **30th June 2020**.

Determining the needs of developing countries related to implementing the Convention and the Paris Agreement The first of its kind, the report will include available information and data on needs by type, theme and sector, across regions, including on the needs of States in Asia and the Pacific.
