



THE FIRST GLOBAL STOCKTAKE OF THE PARIS AGREEMENT

BACKGROUND

The Global stocktake (GST), as stipulated by Article 14 of the Paris Agreement, assesses the collective progress towards the purpose and long-term goals of the Paris Agreement in a comprehensive and facilitative manner, considering mitigation, adaptation and the means of implementation and support (MOI), in the light of equity and the best available science. The GST will also consider the social and economic consequences of response measures and efforts to address loss and damage

THE EVENT

This event aims to provide information about the GST, including its process and timelines, sources of input, technical assessment, as well as the expected outcomes.

The event will also provide a space to hold conversations on the themes of the GST (mitigation, adaptation, means of implementation, as well as response measures and loss and damage) and an opportunity to discuss possible inputs at the regional level, including on the collective progress to date, challenges and barriers to achieve the Paris Agreement goals, and directions to enhance action and ambition, highlighting effective and innovative solutions in the region.
