WHAT ARE THE RACE TO ZERO DIALOGUES?

The Race to Zero has set the overarching objective of mobilizing all actors towards net **zero emissions by 2050** at the latest. The **Climate Action Pathways** define the sector-specific plans that will unlock the systems transformations required to achieve this zero carbon future.

The Dialogues will showcase support for the main actions required to start on our transformation pathways. These ten pathways should be seen as the **'lanes' of the racetrack** in the Race to Zero: the fast tracks to the future. Each sector needs to run in its own lane – with its own opportunities and challenges – so that, **together, we can reach the finish line.**

A **global campaign** to rally **leadership and support** from businesses, cities, regions, investors for a **healthy, resilient, zero carbon recovery** that prevents future threats, creates decent jobs, and unlocks inclusive, sustainable growth.




