- 1. One of the key elements for the implementation of NDCs is the provision of capacity-building support. Currently, there are different organizations providing capacity-building support. How can we make sure that there is coherence in this regard at the national level?
- 2. What incentives can be provided to organizations providing capacity-building support to strengthen collaboration, coherence, and coordination in the delivery of readiness and capacity-building support to developing countries?
- 3. What can be done to strengthen collaboration, coherence, and coordination of support for efforts at national level to achieve long-term capacity in developing countries through the UNFCCC process? (policy guidance, work of constituted bodies, etc.)

Enhancing coherence and coordination amongst national and international stakeholders for the design and delivery of capacity-building activities supporting NDC implementation

> Challenges:

- Different challenges across countries (the need to build capacity for local consultants; Capacity-building projects are sometimes short-term)
- Capacity-building needs to be viewed as a long-term process and be kept track on in order to not lose the outcomes and results;
- Competition between organizations in terms of providing capacity-building, each institution has its own incentives and wants to deliver certain outcomes.
- Different organizations with different mandates, and some mandates are similar → need to have collaboration among bodies, need to have conversation and partnership establishment, also in term of innovating, delivering outcomes.
- Capacity-building should be delivered on the basis of identified country needs.
- Examples of practice for coherence objective:
 - Using common methodology/proposals to develop projects together (examples from Crispin and Caribbean)
 - Need to develop long-term agenda (suggest from Indonesia); Committee for Capacity-building at national level (committee should include different actors, civil society, private sector, etc.), bodies should coordinate together (to have coherence in term of mandate, leading roles of ministries, etc.)
