
Enhancing institutional, technical, relational and strategic capacities for NDC implementation

Key discussion points:

- Awareness, ownership, empowerment, engage stakeholders (local, neighbors, organizations)
- Impact political decision maker through political parties, communicate voters interest (e.g. affordable energy), minimized risks by transformation change (mitigation + adaptation + energy access + development)
- Broaden scope of assistance, besides short term (technical), focus on long term (e.g. curriculum for student empowerment, multi-donor exercises to address multi stakeholders)
- Invest in domestic CB providers, processes for handholding of knowledge transfer, establish internal data base to maintain knowledge
- Include CC to civil servant training
- Change mindset in mitigation/adaptation silos
