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## Building capacities to integrate cross-cutting issues, such as gender responsiveness, human rights and indigenous peoples' knowledge, into NDC implementation

### ***Key points:***

- Integrate Human rights, indigenous people, gender, just transition and other cross-cutting issues (better results on the ground, policy coherence, systemic approach)
- Engagement with social partners during transition of closing human rights capacity gap (outcomes can be faster)

### ***Next steps (suggestions or a way forward):***

- Focal Point, workshop (participation) in context of PCCB, Paris Agreement workprogramme
- Create links with different forums, parliament, Party and non-Party stakeholders, ACE and gender focal points
- Raise awareness/access, better/deeper understanding of what it means to include human rights, indigenous people and gender into NDC (eg. mitigation ambition)
- Make sure to integrate it at the local level and also learn from local level (knowledge exchange)
- Clearinghouse for information
- Civil society – accreditation
- Institutional arrangements
