Building capacities for the tracking of and reporting on the implementation and impacts of NDCrelated actions, and the finance used to support these actions

Key discussion points:

- Gaps related to collecting, centralizing, reporting;
- The Rule Book on the PA being developed and needs to be finalized to better identify the needs of countries in terms of capacity-building with regards to developing standard and metrics for reporting on progress towards NDC implementation;
- Need to take a step-wise approach to capacity-building;
- Availability of data for decision makers is critical, there needs to be a mandate for data collection and data sharing across ministries at the national level;
- There should be a mechanism for capturing lessons learned. Sharing experiences among countries useful;
- At the international level the PCCB should work with other institutions involved in the delivery of capacity-building support in order to better collect and diffuse the lessons learned and experience;
- Linkages between the NDC and the SDGs. Use indicators useful for both. Can't have siloed approach;
- Role of the sub-national actors and institutional is critical. Need to empower them to ensure quality of data collection. Capacity building beyond national actors.



Guiding questions for breakout group 3

- 1. What are the specific types of capacity gaps countries are facing with regard to the tracking of and reporting on NDC implementation and progress and how can capacities be effectively enhanced in a way that benefits the country's planning process (i.e. not only for reporting to the Convention)?
- 2. How can providers and recipients of capacity-building support ensure that lessons learned are integrated into subsequent actions within the implementation of the NDC and good practices are effectively scaled-up?
