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Sport: A Global Mutirão for Climate Action

Sport is more than games, tournaments, or medals — it is a universal language, a global mutirão* that unites billions around shared values, identity and purpose. Its cultural power is unparalleled: it captures hearts and minds, inspires millions through role models, and connects communities worldwide.

From the Olympic Games to the World Cup, every nation competes and every culture connects. On the world's biggest stages and the local pitch alike, sport unites every nation, every community, every culture.

We now face our greatest opponent: climate change and the urgent need for social and environmental resilience. Like a team confronting a world-class adversary, the challenge is immense - yet sport has repeatedly achieved the impossible: last-minute comebacks, underdog victories, and challenges met with teamwork, preparation and belief. This is why sport must be recognised as your strategic partner. It can unify people, mobilise communities, and help shift social norms around energy, transport, food, and policy transitions - turning ambition into meaningful action.

The climate crisis is the greatest challenge — only a united team can beat it.

To win, we need every player on the field.

We are in a decisive moment. The climate crisis is accelerating, with far-reaching implications for how sport is played and enjoyed worldwide. The window for effective action is narrowing. As governments and global institutions work to drive resilience and transformation, one of the world's most powerful cultural forces stands ready to catalyse change: sport.

Moments become momentum. Make this moment matter.

Sport inspires hope, uplifts communities, and reaches billions. It transcends cultures, borders and generations. Sport cannot solve climate change alone, but it can mobilise action at a scale few other sectors can match. It offers a unique platform to engage citizens, to speak to youth and diverse communities in a language they understand. It can model a sustainable and regenerative future and accelerate the delivery of local and national climate goals. Sport is essential to society and stands ready to partner.

Across the globe, sport is already contributing. From stadiums powered by renewable energy to clubs integrating active mobility and low-carbon fan travel, from athletes speaking out for climate action to grassroots programs building local resilience — sport is driving real-world change. More than a messenger, sport connects sectors — from energy and transport to food systems, apparel, and education. Sport brings climate issues to life in ways people can see, feel, and act on. Its reach into classrooms, media, and community spaces offers a trusted and scalable vehicle for climate engagement, particularly among young people who are demanding action.

We call on public and private institutions, national governments, city leaders and international bodies to formally recognise and invest in the role of sport as a climate action partner. That means embedding sport in your climate strategies and supporting its capacity to deliver awareness, community engagement and tangible solutions. We urge you to support initiatives that use sport as a tool for engagement and resilience, from youth programming to infrastructure innovation.

We call for strategic alignment. Cities hosting global sporting events or nurturing local clubs can partner with sport to deliver on their climate ambitions. Whether through low-emission transport planning, the use of stadiums as resilience hubs, or leveraging athlete voices to support climate stories, sport offers an essential platform to deliver impact.

Together, we can level the playing field for a fair and resilient future.

We call for leadership grounded in the values that sport and sustainability share: fairness, transparency, resilience, and above all, teamwork. **One team of 8 billion people, pulling in the same direction.**

This unity allows us to turn ambition into action. Investing in sport is investing in people, and in solutions. It is a commitment to cohesion, to hope, and to the belief that transformation is possible when we move together. Sport is playing its part. We invite you to join us — not on the sidelines, but on the field — as partners in delivering a just, resilient, and sustainable future for all.

The world knows what teamwork can achieve. Let's play to win. The moment for decisive action is here. Sport is ready.
