

Input to the draft Recommendation: Requirements for the development and assessment of Article 6.4 mechanism methodologies

The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA), by its decision 3/CMA.3 "Rules, modalities and procedures for the mechanism established by Article 6.4", requested the Supervisory Body to "develop provisions for the development and approval of methodologies, validation, registration, monitoring, verification and certification, issuance, renewal, first transfer from the mechanism registry, voluntary cancellation and other processes pursuant to chapters V.B–L and VIII of the annex (Delivering overall mitigation in global emissions) (...)".

This submission presents Conservation International's recommendations for consideration by the Article 6.4 Supervisory Body as it continues its work to develop guidance to the CMA on Requirements for the development and assessment of Article 6.4 mechanism methodologies under the mechanism. It is presented in response to the Call for input 2023 - Issues included in the annotated agenda and related annexes of the eighth seventh meeting of the Article 6.4 Supervisory Body, and it addresses specifically Annex 14 - Draft recommendation: Requirements for the development and assessment of mechanism methodologies.
