# Joint Mitigation Adaptation activities

First submissions to SBSTA on JMA were in 2014. The science on the importance of ecosystem integrity – and the importance of community management for successful adaptation/mitigation outcomes – has only strengthened since then.

## Strengthening Direct Access and Linkages

- Web-based platform presented in June provides an excellent basis from which to build and innovate approaches to access and ‘match-making’
- National Focal Point as facilitator and partner for innovative finance
- The platform should provide clear simplified guidance and templates for registered stakeholders to upload NMA proposals or project concept notes
- The Guidance should support enhanced linkages across climate mitigation and adaptation, biodiversity and sustainable development. Direct linkages to national biodiversity strategies and action plans (NBSAPs) should be explored.
