Common tabular formats for the electronic reporting of the information on financial, technology development and transfer and capacity-building support provided and mobilized, as well as support needed and received, under Articles 9–11 of the Paris Agreement

Informal note by the co-facilitators

06 December 2019, 21:00

Note: The draft elements and tables contained in the annex to this informal note have been prepared by the co-facilitators of the negotiations on this agenda sub-item under their own responsibility. The draft elements and tables have been drawn from views submitted by Parties prior to and during the fiftieth and fifty-first session of the Subsidiary body for Scientific and Technological Advice¹ (SBSTA) and further discussion among Parties at the fifty-first session of the SBSTA. The draft elements and tables are preliminary, are not exhaustive, have no formal status, and should not be considered as final in any way. They are intended to assist the SBSTA in advancing the discussions on this matter and do not prejudge further work or prevent Parties from expressing their views at any time.

Overview of the informal consultations on this item

The informal consultations on agenda sub-item 11(c), “Common tabular formats for the electronic reporting of the information on financial, technology development and transfer and capacity-building support provided and mobilized, as well as support needed and received, under Articles 9–11 of the Paris Agreement”, at the session were co-facilitated by Delphine Eyraud (France) and Seyni Nafu (Mali).

The co-facilitators prepared, under their own responsibility, this informal note, which Parties considered at the last meeting of the informal consultations.

The co-facilitators recognize that Parties were of the view that the common tabular formats for the electronic reporting of the information on financial, technology development and transfer and capacity-building support provided and mobilized, as well as support needed and received being developed of the biennial transparency report shall follow the modalities, procedures and guidelines (MPGs) contained in decision 18/CMA.1, and that the existing biennial report common tabular format provide a good starting point.

The co-facilitators noted that due consideration be given to the choices that Parties can make in providing information in the tables in particular for developing country Parties with regard to paragraphs 133, 134, 136, 138, 140, 142, 144.

The draft elements and tables for discussion for the common tabular formats for reporting information on financial, technology development and transfer and capacity-building support provided and mobilized, as well as need and received under Articles 9-11 of the Paris Agreement are provided in the annex to the note.

ANNEX

General elements for discussion

- Providing the opportunity to disaggregate type of support cross-cutting into mitigation and adaptation proportions, if available
- Information in relation to technology development and transfer (TT) and capacity-building (CB):
 - TT table should include only activities that are exclusively for technology development, demonstration, deployment, diffusion of transfer, and are different to projects that have a component of technology transfer or development, TT and CB tables should aim to provide information that are not captured in the financial tables
 - Cross-referencing of information provided in financial tables (tick-box) and in TT and CB tables.
 - Facilitation of automatic population from common parameters between CTFs on finance support provided, needed and received and CTFs on technology development and transfer support provided, needed and received, and CTFs on capacity building support provided, needed and received.
- Use of footnotes providing clarifying guidelines on inputs or qualifiers for CTF parameters
- Use of documentation box for the provision of information on underlying assumptions, definitions and methodologies used for reporting information related to parameters or reflect such information in the narrative reporting of the biennial transparency report
- Include instruction in the BTR outline under information on support provided that states that climate finance amounts can only be inputted into the CTFs if the specific amount in whole or part has been allocated for the purpose of responding to climate change in line with the Convention and Paris Agreement
- Summary tables:
 - Financial support provided, financial support needed, and financial support received
 - Summary table on financial support provided should include all years since 2011 to provide transparent information on progression
- Table on financial support received by developing country Parties under Article 9 of the PA:
 - 1 table: information on financial support received
 - 2 tables: information on financial support received through bilateral, regional and other channels and financial support received through multilateral channels
- Table on support needed and received by developing country Parties for the implementation of Article 13 of the Paris Agreement and transparency-related activities:
 - 1 table, including 2 sub-columns for support needed and support received
 - 2 tables: support needed and support received
 - 5 tables: support received for BTR, support needed and received for future reporting, support needed and received for reporting-related capacity-building/national reporting infrastructure development
- Challenges related to tables for reporting on support needed and received: tracking data and tracking finance needed and received outside of the national governments, private finance, a project level originating from multiple finance contributors, and targeting climate change vs other development goals
- Standardised lists of options:
 - Sector and sub-sector
 - Expected use, impact and estimated results, e.g. CO₂-equivalent tons avoided, number of beneficiaries
 - Results achieved, e.g. underachieved, achieved, overachieved
 - Type of technology, e.g. using the definition of TEC – “Hardware or Software”
- Information on calendar/fiscal year should be reported in documentation box, BTR chapter or in the heading of each table
- CTFs should be designed so that non-inclusion of information that is not applicable or available (where relevant) does not appear to be a deficiency in a Party’s reporting:
 - Notation keys

- Columns with no information, if information is not available, would not appear in the final table submitted
- Facilitate comparability of information and automatic transfer from external databases

 - Title of project/programme: Insert footnote that where Parties report the title of support in the form of 'other', they shall specify what 'other' is.
- Amount:
 - Climate-specific heading is removed or, new parameter for description of climate-specificity and percentage share of amount
 - Disaggregate by financial instrument
 - Should parties choose to provide grant equivalent amounts, to be presented in additional columns alongside face value, or by financial instrument or to provide such information in the Additional information parameter
 - Definition of grant equivalent
 - Insert footnote that if the resources used to mobilize support is channelled regionally or multilaterally, Parties should disaggregate its contribution to the overall resource to avoid double counting in this regard.
