Mandates

Decision 18/CMA.1

- Requested the SBSTA to **develop, pursuant to the MPGs, a training programme for technical experts participating in the technical expert review.** (*Para 12(c)*)
- Technical experts shall complete the training programme referred to in decision 18/CMA.1, paragraph 12(c), prior to serving on a technical expert review team. (*Annex, para 173*)

Decision 5/CMA.3

- Adopted the training programme for technical experts participating in the technical expert review of BTRs, as contained in its annex VII. (*Para 1(e)*)
- Requested **the secretariat, incorporating, as appropriate, technical advice from the CGE and LRs, to develop the training programme for technical experts participating in the BTR reviews**, as outlined in annex VII, taking into account experience and lessons learned from developing existing training programmes under the Convention. (*Para 30*)
- Requested the secretariat **to implement the training programme for technical experts participating in the BTR reviews**, as outlined in annex VII, taking into account technical advice from the CGE and LRs to the secretariat. (*Para 31*)
- Make available the training courses providing a general overview of the ETF under the Paris Agreement by **1 March 2023**, and other courses relating to information to be reviewed in accordance with decision 18/CMA.1, annex, paragraph 150 by **September 2023.** (*Para 33*)
- Requested the secretariat to **report to the SBSTA on progress** in the development of the training programme at its 57th session and at each subsequent session until the development of the training programme has been completed. (*Para 32*)

Mandates

Decision 9/CMA.4

- Decides that a Party may, on a voluntary basis, request the secretariat to organize a review of the information reported by the Party pursuant to decision 18/CMA.1, annex, chapter IV, as part of the technical expert review pursuant to decision 18/CMA.1, annex, chp. VII. *(Para 1)*
- The voluntary review consists of: *(Para 2)*
 - Reviewing the information reported by the Party in its biennial transparency report, in accordance with the modalities, procedures and guidelines contained in decision 18/CMA.1, annex, chp. IV;
 - Facilitating the improvement of the reporting of information pursuant to decision 18/CMA.1, annex, chp. IV, by identifying, in consultation with the Party, areas of improvement and capacity-building needs related to reporting.
- Further decides that the Party undergoing the voluntary review may select specific sections of the chapter in the biennial transparency report pursuant to decision 18/CMA.1, annex, chp. IV, for particular attention by the expert review team conducting the review. *(Para 3)*
- Requests the secretariat to include in the technical expert review team for conducting the voluntary review an expert with expertise in the areas outlined in decision 18/CMA.1, annex, chp. IV, who has completed the course on general and cross-cutting aspects for the technical expert review under the enhanced transparency framework under the Paris Agreement referred to in decision 5/CMA.3, annex VII, and the training course referred to in paragraph 8 below, taking into account decision 5/CMA.3, para. 34; *(Para 6)*
- Requests **the secretariat to develop and implement a training course for experts participating in the review**, as part of the training programme outlined in decision 5/CMA.3, annex VII, and taking into account decision 5/CMA.3, paras. 33–34. *(Para 8)*



Exam period

- 107 expert on the RoE registered.
- 93 took examination -> 90 successfully passed.

Course E development

Proposed approach

- Content will cover key areas relating to climate impacts and adaptation reporting.
- Development of the course content will be in a staggered manner based on the availability of resources.
- The secretariat is currently conceptualizing the content and learning objectives of the course.
- A concept note on the course development will be presented to CGE and LRs to seek for their technical advice at the upcoming 3rd meeting with the CGE & LRs on 22 June.

Implementation approach

Training course

In accordance with annex VII of decision 5/CMA.3 and decision 9/CMA.4, the training programme will include the following courses:

- General and cross-cutting aspects for the technical expert review under the enhanced transparency framework under the Paris Agreement;
- Technical review of national inventory reports of anthropogenic emissions by sources and removals by sinks of greenhouse gases;
- Technical review of the information necessary to track progress made in implementing and achieving nationally determined contributions under Article 4 of the Paris Agreement;
- Technical review of the information on financial, technology development and transfer and capacity-building support provided to developing country Parties under Articles 9–11 of the Paris Agreement;
- Voluntary technical review of the information on climate change impacts and adaptation reported in Article 7 of the Paris Agreement reported in accordance with chapter IV of the annex to decision 18/CMA.1.


Learning

- Training courses will be made available online publicly on UNFCCC website with option to download an offline version.
- Training courses facilitated by instructors will be organized, with the possibility of including hands-on training and/or seminars periodically, depending on the availability of resources.
- Refresher seminars for the experienced reviewers may be organized, contingent on the needs and depending on the availability of resources.

Examinations

- Examinations will be administered periodically for the experts who are nominated to the RoE, have completed the relevant training courses and have registered for the examination period.
- The examination will be administered online and will be in the English language. The exams will only have automated grading type of questions to facilitate and expedite grading.
- To pass the examination, participants need to score a minimum 65 per cent of points. The retake of the examination of the same course on account of an unsuccessful outcome will be limited to three.
- Depending on the need and the availability of financial resources, the examination may also be administered in-person or in a hybrid format.


Examinations for experienced reviewers






Timeline and the progress of the work
