Artículo 6.8

Las Partes reconocen la importancia de disponer de **enfoques no relacionados con el mercado** que sean integrales, holísticos y equilibrados y **que les ayuden a implementar sus contribuciones determinadas a nivel nacional**, en el contexto del desarrollo sostenible y de la erradicación de la pobreza y de manera coordinada y eficaz, entre otras cosas mediante la mitigación, la adaptación, **la financiación, la transferencia de tecnología y el fomento de la capacidad**, según proceda. Estos enfoques tendrán por objeto:

- (a) Promover la ambición relativa a la mitigación y la adaptación;
- (b) Aumentar la participación de los sectores público y privado en la implementación de las Contribuciones Determinadas a nivel Nacional (NDC, por sus siglas en inglés); y
- (c) Ofrecer oportunidades para la coordinación de los instrumentos y los arreglos institucionales pertinentes.

Process of uploading NMA to the Platform

The delivery of a new NMA

- Develop the proposal for the new NMA in the offline form
- National Focal Point accesses the online form on the UNFCCC website to submit the new NMA
- The National Focal Point that delivers the form can be the host Party or the supporting Party

After delivery

- UNFCCC will verify concurrence with the National Focal Points of all Parties included in the delivery
- Once confirmed, it will be published on the Platform after 30 days

Application to submit NMA to the Platform

 - Title, abstract, contact information of the Submitting Party
 - Focus Area, Dates, Other Participating Parties and Non-Party Participants)
- Section 3:

NMA Platform

The NMA Platform is designed to record and exchange information on non-market approaches under Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement. It is established in accordance with decision 8/CMA.4 and enables participating Parties and non-Party stakeholders to identify, develop and implement non-market approaches. The platform includes information on finance, technology and capacity-building support available or provided for these initiatives.

Non-market approaches under Article 6.8 support Parties' climate efforts by promoting mitigation and adaptation ambition. They aim to enhance participation from the public and private sectors, as well as civil society organizations, in implementing nationally determined contributions. They also create opportunities for coordination across different climate instruments and institutional frameworks.

Each non-market approach is identified voluntarily by participating Parties, involves more than one participating Party and does not involve the transfer of mitigation outcomes. Initiatives must support the achievement of host Parties' nationally determined contributions, align with the eleventh preambular paragraph of the Paris Agreement and minimize any potential negative environmental, economic or social impacts.

The NMA Platform is designed to record and exchange information on non-market approaches under Article 6, paragraph 8, of the [Paris Agreement](#). It is established in accordance with [decision 8/CMA.4](#) and enables participating Parties and non-Party stakeholders to identify, develop and implement non-market approaches. The platform includes information on finance, technology and capacity-building support available or provided for these initiatives.

Non-market approaches under Article 6.8 support Parties' climate efforts by promoting mitigation and adaptation ambition. They aim to enhance participation from the public and private sectors, as well as civil society organizations, in implementing [nationally determined contributions](#). They also create opportunities for coordination across different climate instruments and institutional frameworks.

Each non-market approach is identified voluntarily by participating Parties, involves more than one participating Party and does not involve the transfer of mitigation outcomes. Initiatives must support the achievement of host Parties' nationally determined contributions, align with the [eleventh preambular paragraph](#) of the Paris Agreement and minimize any potential negative environmental, economic or social impacts.
