




Enhanced Direct Access as GCF "Signature Access Modality"


National Climate Fund (NCF)






Enhanced Direct Access as GCF "Signature Access Modality"

- In-country devolved access to the provincial and local level for engaging local stakeholders (communities, MSMEs)









The Role of the LDCF: 'Capacitator' Fund/Facility




LDC Expert Group Proposal

Establish a 'capacitator' Programme Priority at the LDCF to

- pilot concrete climate change activities particularly relevant for LDCs;
- enhance longer-term institutional capacity to design and execute such activities.

Why?

To enhance the LDCF's attractiveness for contributors, in particular for innovative finance contributions which may need some mitigation related activities in the project portfolio.

- 8. Requests the Global Environment Facility to carry out a technical review of the programme priorities of the Least Developed Countries Fund, taking into account the independent review referred to in paragraph 6 above, and to focus the technical review on, inter alia:
