

## Indigenous Peoples and Climate Change

  GEF and The GCF

# Challenges and barriers to effective stakeholder consultations

- NATIONAL POLICIES: Unequal national legislations and policy gaps on recognition of the need for consultation with indigenous peoples
- NDAs/Focal Points: Inconsistent/incoherent engagement with NDAs/FPs, Changing NDAs/FPs, lack of NDA experience on stakeholder engagements
- AWARENESS: State centered design of programs, communications problems and bias toward private sector, lack of awareness of communities to Climate change/funds
- ACCESS to FUNDS: Difficult access of indigenous peoples to climate funds (except for Kenya)



### Recommendations

- National Engagement mechanisms in readiness programs
- Include Specific component (with indicators)on Indigenous peoples and local communities engagement under Readiness programs
- Toolkit on best country practice coordination
- Capacity building programs
- Operationalization and implementation of Indigenous Peoples' Policy and ESP
- Review of the GCF Gender Policy and an action plan
  - Engagement of country stakeholders in the the Evaluation of climate finance at the country level
