Mandate

- At COP 24 the mandate of the Consultant Group of Experts on National Communications from Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention will be extended for eight years, 2019 to 2026.
- **Renamed** to the Consultative Group of Experts (CGE).
- In addition to assist developing country Parties fulfil their reporting requirements under the Convention, the CGE will also support the implementation of the enhanced transparency framework under Article 13 of the Paris Agreement, by:
 - a) Facilitating the provision of technical advice and support to developing country Parties to prepare and submit their biennial transparency reports and facilitate improved reporting over time;
 - b) Providing technical advice to the secretariat on the implementation of the **training of technical expert review teams**.



CGE 2019 Work Plan

- The CGE set its priority for the year to be to increase the number of submissions of national communications and biennial update reports, and helping developing countries prepare for reporting under the enhanced transparency framework
 - ✓ Particularly of first BURs
 - ✓ Includes improving the GHG inventory systems of developing countries
- The **2019 work plan** is developed into four main areas:
 - a) Cross-cutting issues
 - Enhanced understanding of gaps and needs of developing countries vis-à-vis the support available for developing countries, including through survey, enhanced collaboration and information exchange with other partners, etc.
 - b) Knowledge delivery
 - Conduct of regional hands-on training workshops on *institutionalization of data management for national GHG inventory*, complementing with pre- and post-workshop webinars

c) Knowledge products

- Continued offering of e-learning courses on the preparations of NCs;
- Development of step-by-step guide to implement the MPGs for the ETF;
- Development of toolbox for institutional arrangements to support MRV/transparency
