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Arc of discussions from TD1.1 to 1.3



June 2022 TD1.1: good interactive exchanges; laid information base, including on well-known gaps and discussions on what is being done. We know we are not on track on climate action



November 2022 TD1.2: how to bridge gaps; how to shift focus to implementation



April 2023: Summary report on TD1.2 (with possible draft technical appendix containing menus of options for implementation and action, within specific contexts and systems)



June 2023 TD1.3: Discussion on broader messages: summarising findings on how to accelerate collective progress and more effective implementation of actions and support



August – October 2023: Factual synthesis captures key findings, based on TD1 and drawing on summary reports



Co-facilitators' reflections on TD1.1

- TD1.1 resulted in strong engagement and content – particularly focused on assessment of collective progress and aspects related to the ‘what’ is important and the needs for climate action
- This positions TD1.2 to bring focus to the how and the how to bridge gaps and enhance international cooperation and collective action
- Extensive input through submissions with rich material to draw upon
- At TD1.2, aim to address areas where we see knowledge gaps, where we need additional information, knowledge, presentations, and/or submissions, and attention gaps, where we need additional time for discussion to fully consider an issue

Inputs received since June

In response to the second call for inputs - status as of 4 October:

- 61 submissions received since SB56
 - 1 from groups of Parties
 - 2 from Parties
 - 58 from intergovernmental organizations, Observer Organizations, and non-Party stakeholders

Approach to TD1.2

- We have considered feedback from Parties on our approach to the TD. Have responded to calls to:
 - Move from “what” to “how”
 - Explore intersections across topics to frame integrated and holistic findings
 - Focus on implementable outcomes
- We encourage participants to bring forward any good practices to enhance climate action and experience and opportunities to enhance international cooperation on mitigation and adaptation, and to increase support, in order to overcome barriers and challenges faced



Norms of discussion

- The dialogue should advance knowledge that can inform Parties and NPS in enhancing their actions and support
- Discussions should be technical, focused on data and information, and based on the best available science
- Participants are encouraged to engage in a conversation and dialogue with one another, rather than provide prepared statements
- Throughout the technical dialogue, all knowledge and experiences should be respected as contributions to the discussion, in order to promote cooperation and build trust
- This list is to be discussed at the start of each roundtable discussion to see if any norms need to be amended or added



Multiple formats for discussions at TD1.2

- **Opening meeting (this one)**, to introduce the organization of work
- **World Café**, covering all topics of the GST and systems transitions
- **Three roundtables**, structured around the three thematic areas of the GST, as was the case at TD1.1
- **Focused exchanges** on intersections across themes and relevant integrated and holistic approaches
- **Closing plenary**, to summarize and react to discussions at TD1.2.

Other events:

- **Poster Session**, on submissions to the GST
- **Creative Space**, to showcase films, art and performances related to the GST.

Roundtables

- Same clusters as at TD1.1:
 - RT1: Mitigation, including response measures
 - RT2: Adaptation, including loss and damage
 - RT3: Means of implementation and support: Finance, technology and capacity-building
- **Four concurrent breakout discussions in each roundtable**, led by facilitators with inputs from experts.
- Participants will choose which breakout group to join.
- We will have signs/colors in each of the rooms to guide participants to the breakout groups.
- Additional participants can observe based on space availability. Priority will be given to Parties.



Roundtables

- Each roundtable will have **two 2-hour meetings** without overlap
 - First meeting will have all participants hearing expert prompts on all four breakout topics (30 minutes) before breakout discussions (90 minutes)
 - Second meeting will continue breakout discussions (90 minutes) and conclude by all participants hearing reports from each breakout discussion, by a rapporteur (volunteers from Parties) (30 minutes)
- Reports on each roundtable will be included in the closing plenary
- Details of the discussions will be captured in proceedings section of Summary Report on TD1.2
- **Prompts are intended as starting points** for discussions, facilitators will lead discussions based on inputs from participants in the breakout discussion



Roundtable prompts

- Response to request to make expert inputs available before TD1.2
- Prompts are written version of what each expert will present – to kick off discussions
- Prompts for the roundtable breakouts are posted online:

- Reports at the end of RT will address the main topic (not specific questions in a prompt)



Roundtable outputs

- We hope to have clear outputs from each discussion in response to prompts.
 - We invite Parties to be rapporteurs for each breakout group (please contact gst@unfccc.int to volunteer! There will be assistance, as below)
 - Dedicated secretariat/expert notetakers in each break-out discussion
- Facilitators will help to focus discussion, in following simple structure for each breakout discussion:
 - Key points on 'how to'
 - Key points on how specific topic relates to other issues within and beyond cluster
 - Other related issues that need more time for discussion



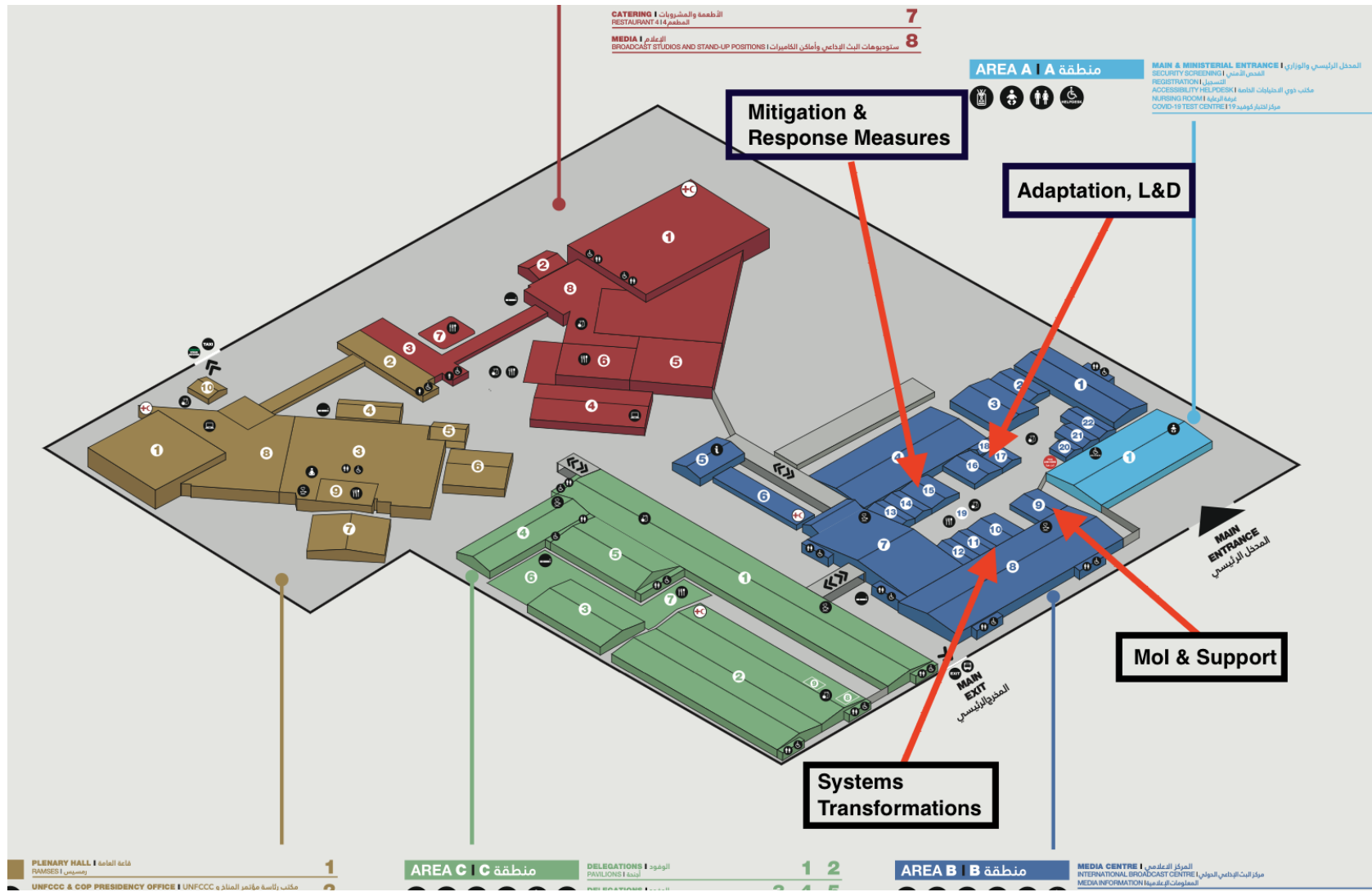
World café

- We will have several large rooms with stations organized across topics. Participants will be asked to circulate through tables at regular intervals
- Expert(s) will lead discussions designed to produce concrete outputs, dedicated notetakers at each station
- Session Tuesday afternoon will be four hours (3-7pm) and participants will be asked to rotate every 30 or 45 minutes - planning for 5 or 6 rotations with breaks

- Tables 1-12 – maps to clusters in roundtables
- Tables 13-20 on system transformations (energy, transport, industry, agriculture, health, land, water, and urban)

World café stations

- Given the quick turn-around of participants, experts will present a short summary of the topic at the start of the rotation and will ask participants to address several questions during the discussions
- Responses will be captured on flip-charts. Additional notetakers will also be at the table.
- As more participants come to the station in later rotations, they can react to previous responses and add additional ones.

Focused exchanges

- Two-hour focused exchanges each on:
 1. *Pathways towards low GHG emissions and climate-resilient development*
 2. *International cooperation on holistic and integrated approaches*
- Distinct from approach taken in RTs, these discussions will look at intersections across topics and discuss how we can make further progress collectively across all aspects of the Paris Agreement.
- Call by several Parties and NPS at TD1.1 and in SB Chairs' guiding questions (5,10, 15 and 22)
- Panel of experts outline various perspectives to kick off, followed by time for interactive exchanges among Parties, with participation of NPS



Poster session

- Invited all who made submissions to GST to prepare a poster
- Opportunity to highlight work and make accessible to all participants, in a summarized form
- Currently 26 poster submissions
- Poster launch event afternoon Wednesday, Nov. 8
- Submitters invited to explain their posters in an exhibition style setting
- Posters on display thereafter in hallway



Creative space

- A creative space to showcase films, art and performances related to the GST
- This space and the presentations will be informative to those in attendance. We will not be capturing them within the TD summary report.
- 8 creative space submissions
- Space will be made in the blue zone during lunch breaks, check CCTVs



Closing plenary

- We will have statements from the SB Chairs and initial summaries of discussions at TD1.2
- Open the floor for comments by Groups, Parties and NPS
- Plenary sessions will be streamed on UNFCCC COP27 virtual platform



Non-Party stakeholder participation in TD1.2 at COP 27

- Non-Party stakeholders participation will be similar as at TD1.1
- Requested nominations from the 9 NGO constituencies and, with the help of the secretariat, selected additional NPS participants aiming for diversity in expertise, regional coverage, and gender.
 - Same representatives will be invited to engage in the World Café
 - Additional seats may be available depending on the space available in the room though Party representatives will have priority to those seats.
 - Parties and NPS are welcome to attend the creative space and poster session events
