# GST TD1.3 RT2 graphic recording

① Increased adaptation action and efforts to avert, minimise and address loss and damage are urgently needed, particularly for those who are least prepared for change and least able to recover after disasters. . . . ② Collectively there is increasing ambition in plans and commitments for adaptation, but there also remains an implementation gap, in that just as implemented inadequately, unevenly and incrementally.

### Adaptation including Loss & Damage

③ When adaptation is informed and driven by local contexts and priorities, both the adequacy and the effectiveness of adaptation action and support can be enhanced and can promote transformational adaptation.

- USA:** Urgency! need assessment, quality of finance, human rights aligned, 3 billion world's will be our everyday problem solvers.
- India:** Failed to deliver climate finance, grants, ENGO, developed countries have failed to deliver climate finance.
- China:** Need systematic assessment, responsibility of developed countries, clear pathways for our sector, farmers.
- UK:** Existing & future commitments needed, addressing funding gaps, enablers, international cooperation.
- Japan:** Align finance flows, international cooperation, share, less coal, more green.

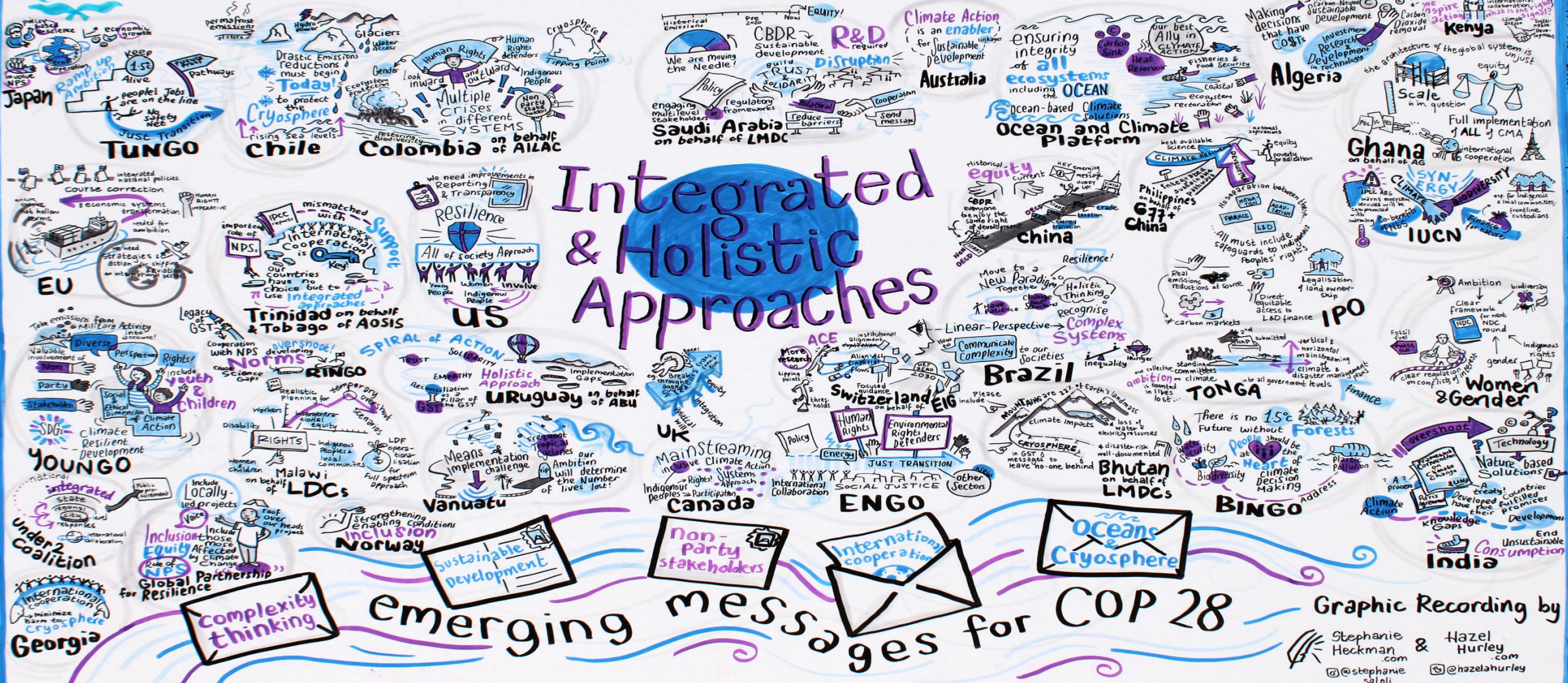

## Possible tools to enable Parties and NPS to find useful information in GST information portal

---

- Technical Annex and search interface are two possible tools to make the large volume of information more accessible and useful
- Poster session – included suggestions on a Technical Annex
- Search interface provided opportunity to explore <http://gst1.org>
  - a) The Global Stocktake Explorer (gst1.org) can facilitate Parties and NPS searching full-text of all inputs to the Global Stocktake - over 1,600 documents and 170,000 pages
  - b) Ca. 5000 searches since launch last week – seems many found search interface useful
- Use of either tool entirely voluntary, not prescribing any policy or measure, no individual Party focus (i.e. respecting paragraph 14 of decision 19/CMA1.)
- Informal activities during lunch hours facilitated Parties and NPS exploring these tools, to see what is useful. Please let us know what you consider useful – both, one, neither ?



## TD synthesis report and summary report on TD1.3

---

- ✓ Appreciate the repeated statements of confidence to fulfill the mandate in paragraph 31 of 19/CMA.1
    - ✓ “*Also decides* that the co-facilitators of the technical dialogue will summarize its outputs in summary reports, taking into account equity and the best available science, for each thematic area referred to in paragraph 6(b) above and an overarching factual synthesis of these reports in a cross-cutting manner;”
  - ✓ Any agreed structure of a CMA decision that emerges at SB58 will be taken into account as the CFs draft the TD Synthesis and Summary reports
  - TD Synthesis Report to include key findings, supporting findings, supporting information published in early September
    - ✓ Based on proceedings of all three meetings of TD1, and inputs – as submissions and during meetings
    - ✓ Balanced and concise
  - ✓ Separate summary report on TD 1.3: comprehensive, reflecting all the discussions during TD1.3 (this can be available earlier, mid-Aug)

## 1 BIENNIAL TRANSPARENCY REPORT- 2024

- First BTRs due in 2024 (18/CMA.1)



## 2 NATIONALLY DETERMINED CONTRIBUTIONS-2024/25


- In 2024 Parties start preparing next NDCs, taking into account outcomes of GST1 (1/CP.21 & 4/CMA.1)
- NDCs to be communicated in first quarter of 2025 (1/CP.21)

## 3 ADAPTATION COMMUNICATIONS

- Next adaptation communications, as part of NDCs, National Communications, BTRs, NAPs or stand-alone
- In 2025, revised guidance on AdComms (9/CMA.1)
