Introduction

- We are launching the third and last TD session of the GST1
- The depth and breadth of the inputs so far have been very encouraging: very rich basis upon which to build, including numerous written submissions by Parties and non-Party stakeholders
- We are grateful for the constructive and creative engagement by all
- "Learning by doing" has proven a successful approach that enabled the dialogue



Arc of discussions from TD1.1 to 1.3

- June 2022 TD1.1: Good interactive exchanges, many written submissions; laid information base, incl. on well-known gaps and discussions on what is being done. We know we are not on track on climate action
- November 2022 TD1.2: Detailed discussions on how to bridge gaps; how to shift focus to implementation
- March 2023: Summary report following TD1.2
- June 2023 TD1.3: Discussion on emerging messages and remaining issues: What is next? What messages are you taking home from the GST? Focus on steps to accelerate collective progress and more effective implementation of actions and support
- Early September 2023: TD synthesis report captures key findings based on TD1 and drawing on inputs; separate summary report containing TD1.3 proceedings



TD aim: Lay a strong technical basis

- We can only do that together, in this Party-driven process, with participation by non-Party stakeholders
- We have gone broad and deep. We have made a good way into laying the technical basis based on discussions at TD1.1-1.2 and very large volume of inputs.
- Our aim in this last meeting of TD is to strengthen technical basis further
- IPCC presented best available science in AR6 Synthesis Report.
- TD synthesis report (TD SYR) and summary reports to be published in early September
- These will be inputs to the third component of the GST: Consideration of Outputs, which will discuss implications of findings of the TD



Co-facilitators' reflections in Summary Report 2

- Summary report following TD1.2 published on 31 March 2023

 - 20 pages of reflections by co-facilitators (in section II)
 - In four clusters, total of 16 emerging messages, which draw on discussions at TD1.1 and 1.2 they are not final we are seeking feedback at this session.
- The GST is a process to enable more collective action; that is, we assess collective progress, in the light of equity and the best available science, to inform greater levels of ambition.
- The technical dialogue of the first GST is the first opportunity for Parties to take stock of collective progress
- There has been significant, yet inadequate collective progress towards achieving the purpose of the Paris Agreement and its long-term goals since it was adopted in 2015.
- Consider what more we can do together, and what each of us needs to do.



- Parties and NPS take thinking from brainstorming into the Round-Tables (more structured, comprehensive)

- > RT1: Mitigation, including response measures
- > RT2: Adaptation, including loss and damage
- ➤ RT3: Means of implementation and support: Finance, technology and capacity-building
- > RT4: Integrated and holistic approaches (*intersecting across the above*)



Roundtables

- Starting point: TD1.2 emerging messages
- CFs will invite participants to:
 - continue to share your views on issues,
 - note any missing issues and/or nuances in messages and supporting text,
 - provide feedback on how to strengthen findings
- Across the four RTs, aim is to cover all elements of paragraph 6(a) of decision 19/CMA.1
 - comprehensive and balanced

- Parties and invited non-party stakeholders will receive secondary badges.
- All roundtables will be in Chamber Hall. Badge holders should sit in inner ring.
- Pick up badges from secretariat after opening plenary.



Possible tools to enable Parties and NPS to find useful information in GST information portal

- Very large volume of information in GST information portal 170,000 pages (increased after last round of submissions, IPCC SYR, etc)
- Technical Annex and search interface are two possible tools to make the large volume of information more accessible and useful
 - a) Technical Annex proposed in submissions by NPS, several Parties and groups supporting, others less sure
 - b) Search interface opportunity to explore in during lunch-hour Thursday 8 June (Nairobi) and preview at http://gst1.org
- Entirely voluntary, not prescribing any policy or measure, no individual Party focus (i.e. respecting paragraph 14 of decision 19/CMA1.)

Closing plenary

- We will have remarks by the SB Chairs and our initial summaries of discussions at TD1.3
- Open the floor for comments by Groups, Parties and NPS succinct verbal inputs, with opportunity to submit written statements



Norms of Discussion

- The dialogue should advance knowledge that can inform Parties and NPS in enhancing their actions and support
- Discussions should be technical, focused on data and information, and based on the best available science
- Participants are encouraged to engage in a conversation and dialogue with one another, rather than provide prepared statements
- Throughout the technical dialogue, all knowledge and experiences should be respected as contributions to the discussion, in order to promote cooperation and build trust
- This list is to be discussed at the start of each roundtable discussion to see if any norms need to be amended or added
