

- The Conference of Parties (COP), at its 21st session in Paris, created a Task Force to develop recommendations for integrated approaches to avert, minimize and address displacement related to the adverse impacts of climate change.
- The Executive Committee of the Warsaw International mechanism for Loss and Damage (WIM Excom) is entrusted by the COP to operationalize this Task Force on Displacement.

December

The Task Force delivers its recommendations and a comprehensive assessment of broader issues of displacement related to climate change, and its mission was extended.
