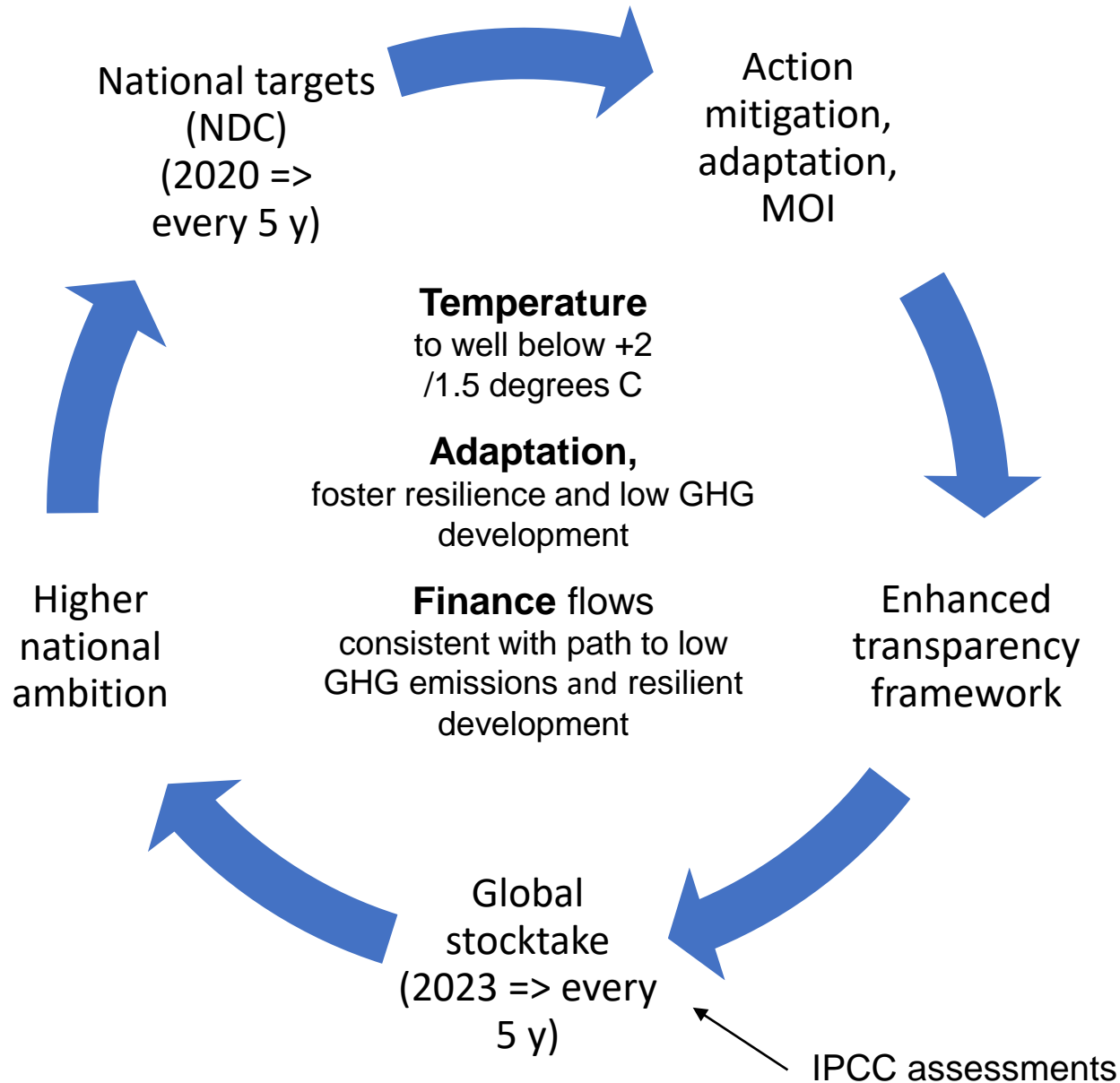

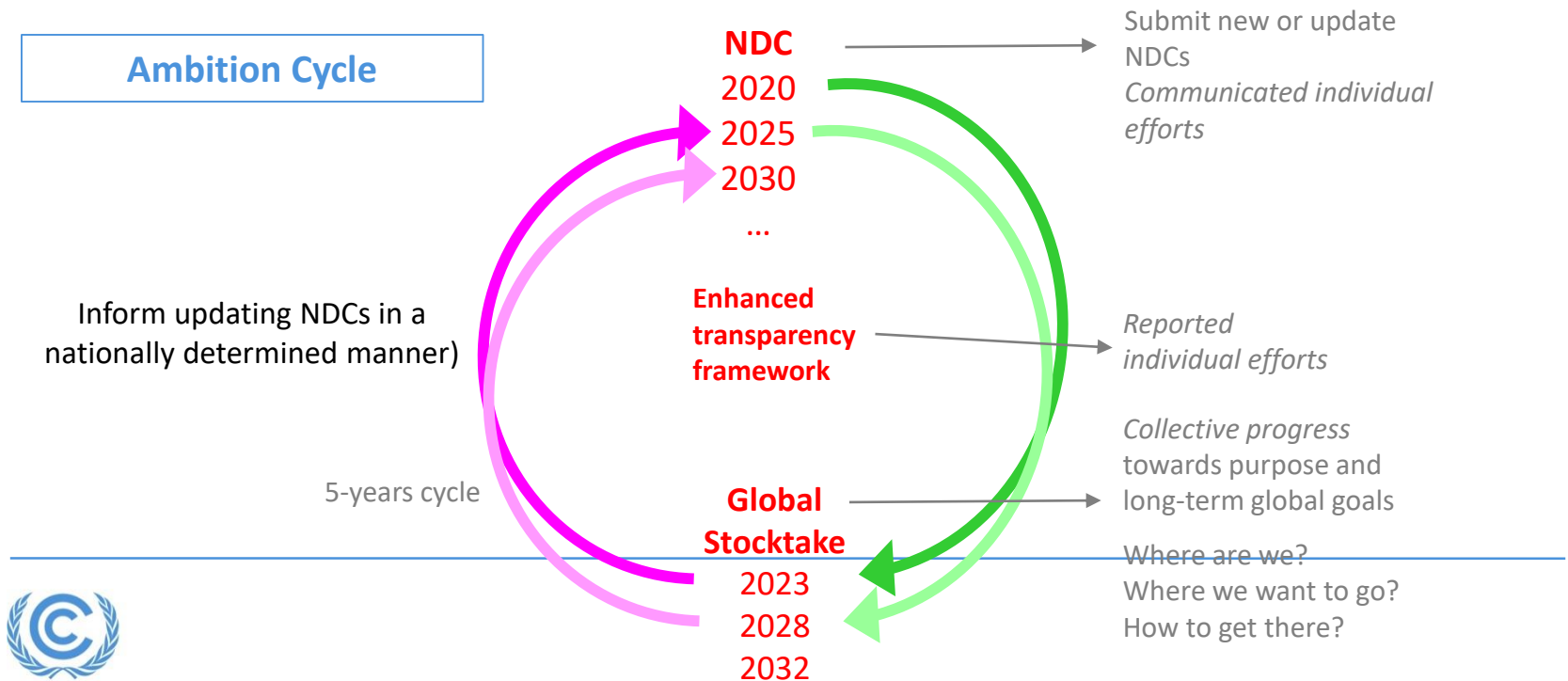
Paris Agreement



Global Stocktake - the What

Paris Agreement Article 14:

- Take stock of the implementation of the Paris Agreement – assess collective progress towards achieving its purpose and its long-term goals
- First GST in 2023 and then every 5 years
- Outcome shall inform Parties in updating and enhancing NDCs and enhancing international cooperation for climate action



Global Stocktake - the Themes

Mitigation

- Overall effect of NDCs
- State of GHG emissions and removals and mitigation efforts undertaken by Parties

Adaptation

- Observed and projected risks
- State of adaptation efforts, support, experiences and priorities

Finance flows and means of Implementation and support

- Finance flows and financial support
- Technology
- Capacity-Building

Cross cutting:

- Fairness consideration including equity as communicated by Parties in their NDCs

RM and L&D

- Address the social and economic consequences and impacts of response measures;
- Avert, minimize and address loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change



Global Stocktake - the How

Katowice climate package: Decision 19/CMA.1

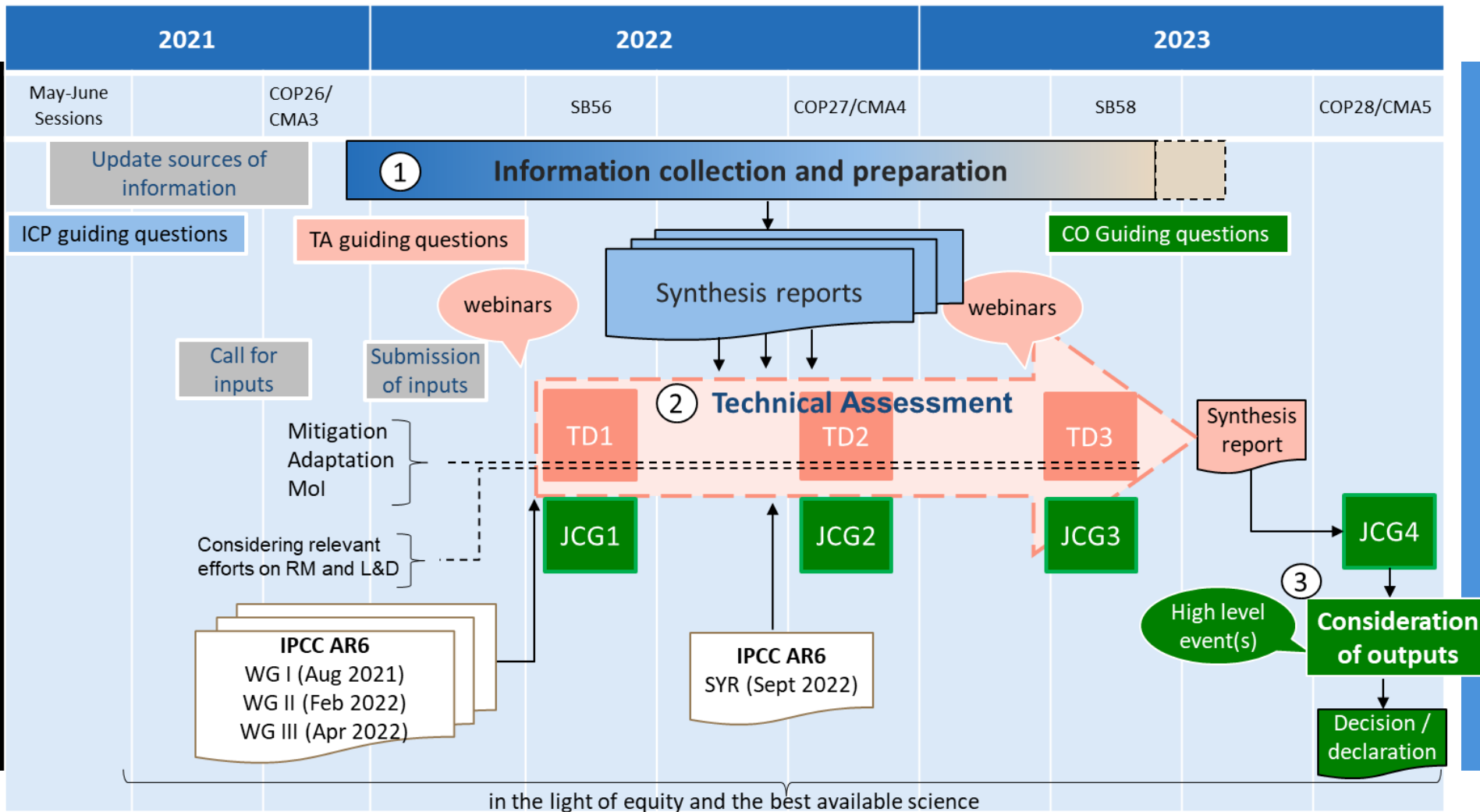
Components:

- 1. Information collection and preparation:** gathering, compiling and synthesizing information
- 2. Technical assessment:** assessing collective progress
- 3. Consideration of outputs:** discussing the implications of the findings

Guiding questions for each component



Timeline



The technical assessment component includes technical dialogues and Joint Contact Groups, held during the three SB sessions preceding the consideration of outputs.

The technical dialogues will allow Parties to engage and discuss with UNFCCC institutional arrangements and experts to consider inputs and assess collective efforts.

The dialogues will be facilitated by two co-facilitators, each from a developing and developed country, and will be guided by questions developed by the SBSTA and SBI Chairs on each thematic area and cross-cutting issues.



Global Stocktake - Approach and Guiding Questions

Information collection and preparation component: Revised non-paper by the SB Chairs - (September 2021) – *includes guiding questions*

Technical assessment component: guiding questions by the SB Chairs
(October 2021)



Global Stocktake - Call for inputs

- Decision 19/CMA.1 requests the SB Chairs to issue a call for the inputs on all thematic areas under the GST, taking into account that such inputs should be submitted at least three months before their consideration in the technical assessment.
 - For TD1, inputs should be submitted before 28 February 2022.
- The decision also identifies the sources of input, which include contributions from Parties, SBs, CBs, forums and other institutional arrangements under the PA and the Convention, the UNFCCC secretariat, other UN agencies and international organizations, regional groups and institutions as well as NPS and UNFCCC observer organizations.



Timeline for submissions

Written inputs should be submitted at least three months before their consideration in the technical assessment.


- TD1 (SB56): end of February 2022
- TD2 (CMA4): early August 2022
- TD3 (SB58) and end February 2023

Parties and Non-Party stakeholders can make new submissions or update previous submissions at any time before the last deadline.



Global Stocktake - How to submit an input

- Submissions are made through the [UNFCCC submission portal](#), under a specific GST category:

Global Stocktake - How to submit an input

- Once in the new submission site, fill in the required fields:
 - a) Name of Party/organization will appear automatically
 - b) attach the document(s) (preferably in text-searchable PDF format)
 - c) Select the thematic area(s) relevant to your submission. More than one thematic area can be selected.
 - d) Click on “submit”.

→To make a submission, organizations or individuals without UNFCCC observer status will need to create an account, which includes an approval process.



Global Stocktake Information Portal

This online resource has been developed pursuant to decision 19/CMA.1, paragraph 21, to facilitate online availability of all global stocktake inputs, by thematic area. It will also compile the most up-to date inputs from the sources identified in paragraph 37 as per paragraph 22 of the same decision.

This portal is a work-in-progress and is currently being updated to integrate other global stocktake inputs as they become available. "Equity" and "science" will be added to the topics drop-down menu and the relevant documents, including upcoming submissions, will be tagged and included as part of the next phase of the global stocktake inputs portal. Users will also be able to search the portal according to document types included in para. 37 of decision 19/CMA.1.
